Resolution commending the San Francisco Public Library for securing \$9.7 million from state Proposition 14 funds for the renovation of the historic Richmond branch library and construction of a new Ingleside branch library.

WHEREAS, San Francisco's Branch Library Improvement Program aims to provide the public with seismically safe, accessible, technologically updated, and code compliant Cityowned branch libraries in every neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco recognizes libraries as priorities in our communities and is in the process of renovating 19 branches and building 5 new branch libraries across the City; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Public Library submitted five applications to the State for Cycle 3 funding under the California Reading and Literacy Improvement and Public Library Construction and Renovation Bond Act of 2000, known as Proposition 14, to enhance the City's own library bond program; and

WHEREAS, San Franciscans love their libraries and supported Proposition 14 at the highest support level of any county in the state; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 14 funds were highly competitive, as there were 72 applications statewide totaling \$587 million in requests and only about \$80 million to award; and

WHEREAS, The Richmond and Ingleside projects had received Outstanding ratings for their applications thanks to the excellent applications submitted by Library staff and three other San Francisco applications were rated as Very Good; and

McMahan, Robyn Uyeno, Marcia Schneider, Gabrielle Jones and many others compiled the extensive applications; and

WHEREAS, Friends of the San Francisco Public Library sponsored a grassroots, community effort to help promote each of San Francisco's five applications that included over 300 children's essays, thousands of postcards, hundreds of letters of support, and countless emails to the Library Bond Board members to convince them of the great need for this funding in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, As part of this effort, the following people went to Sacramento to urge the Bond Board to support San Francisco's projects: Camille She, Bette Landis, Chet Roaman, Cheryl Olinger, Megan Agee, Ian McLean, Fran Martin, Roz Chang, Wen Chin Chen, Christine Leishman, Marian Chatfield-Taylor, Colman Conroy, Deborah Doyle, Rosie Levy, Paul Underwood, Marilyn Thompson and Mindy Linetzky; and

WHEREAS, Architects from the Department of Public Works' Bureau of Architecture and the joint venture of Group 4/Fougeron Architecture helped develop the winning plans for the Richmond and Ingleside libraries respectively, along with library consultants Drew Harrington and Dallas Shaffer; and

WHEREAS, The California Public Library Construction & Renovation Board members
State Librarian Susan Hildreth, Treasurer Phil Angelides, Senator Dede Alpert, Department of
Finance Counsel Robert Campbell, Barton Pachino, Esq. and Assemblywoman Lois Wolk are
to be thanked for supporting San Francisco's projects; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco commends the San Francisco Public Library, community members, and Friends of the San Francisco Public Library for successfully bringing \$9.7 million home to San Francisco for the renovation of the Richmond Branch Library (\$5.9 million) and the construction of a new Ingleside Branch Library (\$3.7 million).
