

1 [Ensure minimum quality standards for most petroleum and automotive products sold in
2 California and ensure weighing devices function properly and accurately.]

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4 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH) to**
5 **accept and expend a new grant in the amount of \$7,350 from the California Department**
6 **of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) combining two programs, the Petroleum Products**
7 **Compliance program and the Weighmaster Enforcement Program; for the period of**
8 **July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007.**

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10 WHEREAS, SFDPH has applied for and been awarded a grant totaling \$7,350 from the
11 CDFA combining awards to support two programs, the Petroleum Products Compliance
12 program (\$6,225) which ensures minimum quality standards for most petroleum and
13 automotive products (gasoline, oxygenated blends, diesel fuel, motor oil, brake fluid,
14 automatic transmission fluid, antifreeze/coolants and alternative engine fuels) sold in
15 California and the program regulates the advertising and labeling of these products, and the
16 Weighmaster Enforcement Program (\$1,125) which ensures weighing devices function
17 properly and accurately, safeguarding consumer purchases; and,

18 WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the grant funds, the CDFA requires the City to
19 comply with the terms of an agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the
20 Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. _____, which is hereby declared to
21 be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,

22 WHEREAS, The grant terms prohibit including indirect costs in the grant budget; now,
23 therefore, be it

24 RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to accept and expend a grant in the
25 amount of \$7,350 from the CDFA; and, be it

1 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of
2 indirect costs in the budget of the Agreement; and, be it

3 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the
4 agreement on behalf of the City.
