On October 21, 2025, the Board of Supervisors finally passed sixteen resolutions initiating landmark designations, sponsored by President Rafael Mandelman (File Nos. 250835, 250836, 250837, 250838, 250839, 250840, 250841, 250842, 250843, 250844, 250845, 250846, 250847, 250848, 250849, and 250850), which were enacted on October 24, 2025.

Resolution initiating a landmark designation under Article 10 of the Planning Code for the Full Moon Coffeehouse, located at 4416-18th Street, Assessor's Parcel Block No. 2650, Lot No. 017.

WHEREAS, Under Planning Code, Section 1004.1, the Board of Supervisors may by Resolution initiate landmark designation; and

WHEREAS, Planning Code, Section 1004.2(b), requires the Historic Preservation Commission to respond to historic district or individual landmark designations initiated by the Board of Supervisors within 90 days, and authorizes the Board, by Resolution, to extend the time within which the Historic Preservation Commission is to render its decision; and

WHEREAS, Full Moon Coffeehouse, located at 4416-18th Street, Assessor's Parcel Block No. 2650, Lot No. 017, is significant for its early association with the Castro as an LGBTQ enclave as the neighborhood established itself as queer San Francisco's cultural, economic and political hub, drawing international attention to issues surrounding LGBTQ equality; and

WHEREAS, Full Moon Coffeehouse opened in 1974 and was unique as an early lesbian establishment, during a time when the Castro was largely dominated by gay men; and

WHEREAS, Full Moon Coffeehouse was collectively owned by a group of lesbians, and is credited as the first women-only establishment in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Full Moon Coffeehouse was run by a collective who installed new floors and plumbing, and ran the business using vocational skills learned from the Women's Skills Center at 51 Waller Street; and

WHEREAS, Full Moon Coffeehouse also sold books, hosted poetry readings and musical performances, serving as an important social center for San Francisco's lesbian community; and

WHEREAS, In 2016 the San Francsico Historic Preservation Commission adopted the Citywide Historic Context Statement for LGBTQ History in San Francisco which provided frameworks for identifying and evaluating sites for historical significance and integrity associated with San Francisco's diverse and robust LGBTQ histories; and

WHEREAS, The Citywide Historic Context Statement for LGBTQ History was prepared by qualified historians in accordance with the Secretary of the Interior's Standards; and

WHEREAS, Through applying the evaluative framework as outlined in the Citywide Historic Context Statement for LGBTQ History, the property can be considered an individually eligible historic resource based on its strong association with LGBTQ History; and

WHEREAS, The Citywide Historic Context Statement for LGBTQ History identifies the Full Moon Coffeehouse as a property which may be eligible for City Landmark status; and

WHEREAS, The Castro LGBTQ Cultural District's 2024 Cultural History, Housing and Economic Sustainability Strategies (CHHESS) report includes the strategy, "Ensure the Historic Preservation Commission and/or the Board of Supervisors prioritize further municipal landmarking and state and national nominations of Castro LGBTQIA+ historical sites..."; and

WHEREAS, The building exterior remains identifiable as the location of the Full Moon Coffeehouse, as it did in the 1970s; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors hereby initiates a landmark designation of the Full Moon Coffeehouse under Planning Code, Section 1004.1; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board requests that the Planning Department prepare a landmark designation report to submit to the Historic Preservation Commission for its

consideration of the full historical, architectural, aesthetic, and cultural interest and value of the Full Moon Coffeehouse; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors requests that the Historic Preservation Commission consider whether the Full Moon Coffeehouse warrants landmark designation and submit its recommendation to the Board according to Article 10 of the Planning Code.
