[Traffic Regulation – Closure of Jack Kerouac Alley to vehicular traffic.]

Resolution closing Jack Kerouac Alley (formerly known as Adler Street) between Grant Avenue and Columbus Avenue to vehicular traffic; adopting findings, including environmental and findings of consistency with the City's General Plan and priority policies of Planning Code Section 101.1; accepting offers of quitclaim deeds for abutters' rights vehicular access to Jack Kerouac Alley; and authorizing official acts in connection with the street closure.

WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works (DPW), working with the non-profit community advocacy group, Chinatown Community Development Center (CCDC) identified Jack Kerouac Alley as an alley that could be transformed into a pedestrian only amenity that would provide open space to the Chinatown community and serve as a tourist destination; and,

WHEREAS, Based on these findings, DPW prepared plans to transform Jack Kerouac Alley (formerly known as Adler Street) between Grant Avenue and Columbus Avenue into a pedestrian-only amenity; and,

WHEREAS, The design plan for Jack Kerouac Alley includes the demolition of the existing asphalt road surface; replacing the old sewer main and side sewers; paving the roadway with decorative cobblestone flush with existing sidewalks for improved accessibility; installing three ornamental light standards, decorative pre-cast paving blocks commemorating verses of famous writers; and a decorative trench drain. A copy of the design plan is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. **DEOGY** and is attached hereto by reference; and,

WHEREAS, By letter dated October 14, 2005, the Department of City Planning found that the vehicular street closure of and pedestrian improvements to Jack Kerouac Alley were, on balance, consistent with the City's General Plan and the priority policies of Planning Code Section 101.1. The Department also found that the pedestrian improvements were consistent with the 1998 "Chinatown Alleyway Master Plan," prepared by CCDC and DPW, which the Planning Commission considered and commended in Planning Commission Resolution No. 14852. A copy of the letter and the Planning Resolution are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 1606 42— and are attached hereto by reference; and,

WHEREAS, The abovementioned letter stated that on October 7, 2005, the Planning Department determined that the actions contemplated herein are categorically exempt from environmental review under Class 1(c)(9) – changes in traffic and parking regulations - in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.); and,

WHEREAS, On September 22, 2005, at a duly noticed public hearing, the Interdepartmental Staff Committee On Traffic and Transportation (ISCOTT) recommended the vehicular street closure of Jack Kerouac Alley; and,

WHEREAS, On October 14, 2005, at a duly noticed public hearing, the Department of Parking and Traffic approved the vehicular street closure of Jack Kerouac Alley; and

WHEREAS, All of the property owners adjacent to Jack Kerouac Alley support the closure of the alley and, in furtherance thereof, have offered to the City quitclaim deeds of abutters' rights for vehicular access to Jack Kerouac Alley. The quitclaim deeds are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. Obole 42— and are attached hereto by reference; and,

WHEREAS, On May 10, 2006, the Director of DPW in DPW Order No. 1/6,035 recommended that this Board take various actions in relation to the closure of Jack Kerouac Alley to vehicular traffic, including approving the vehicular street closure, authorizing the expenditure of funds to install the pedestrian improvements along Jack Kerouac Alley, and accepting the abovementioned quitclaim deeds. A copy of the DPW Order is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 060642— and is attached hereto by reference; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That, in accordance with the provisions of the California Vehicle Code and Streets and Highways Code, the San Francisco Traffic Code, and San Francisco Administrative Code Section 1.51, the Board of Supervisors hereby enacts the following regulation governing the movement of vehicles as designated below:

Establish Jack Kerouac Alley between Grant Avenue and Columbus Avenue as a street closed to vehicular traffic at all times; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors affirms the Planning Department's environmental determination and adopts as its own the Department's findings of consistency with the City's General Plan and the priority policies of Planning Code Section 101.1 that are set forth in the Department's October 14, 2005 letter; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board authorizes DPW to incur costs and take all necessary actions to construct the abovementioned pedestrian improvements on Jack Kerouac Alley; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board, on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco. accepts the offer from the adjacent property owners of the quitclaim deeds of abutters' rights of vehicular access to Jack Kerouac Alley in substantially the same form as those on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board approves and authorizes all necessary actions to effectuate the intent of the vehicular street closure and construction of pedestrian improvements, including but not limited to, authorizing the Director of Real Estate to execute and record the abovementioned quitclaim deeds of abutters' rights of vehicular access.
