WHEREAS, Governor Gavin Newsom delivered his statewide budget to the legislature on January 10, 2024, seeking to balance the budget with significant cuts proposed for affordable housing programs, totaling more than \$1,200,000,000; and greatest impediment to developing affordable housing is lack of funding; and

WHEREAS, The impacts of Governor Newsom's proposed cuts include eliminating approximately 6,400 affordable homes for Californians, resulting in tens of thousands without homes, lost jobs and economic opportunities; and

WHEREAS, This cut would jeopardize \$1,600,000,000 in leveraged federal housing resources; and

WHEREAS, These proposed cuts have brought together a broad multi-sector coalition of over 70 affordable housing, homelessness, and housing justice advocates to urge state leaders to restore this funding; and

WHEREAS, These proposed cuts are at odds with the state's legal responsibility under AB686 to Affirmatively Further Fair Housing, due to the disparate impacts on protected classes and historically marginalized communities, including American Indian, Black, and other Communities of color, immigrant, LGBTQ+, low-income and no-income folks, seniors, and people with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, These groups already face the worst impacts of the ongoing housing affordability and homelessness crisis in San Francisco and across the state; and

WHEREAS, Housing security is foundational to the health of individuals and communities so that critical investments for working-class and vulnerable groups will prevent much costlier interventions in the future; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco produces more affordable housing per capita than any other jurisdiction in California, but still fell short by more than 9,000 affordable units in the last RHNA cycle; and

WHEREAS, The housing production mandate in San Francisco tripled to 46,598 units of affordable housing in the current eight-year cycle from 2023-2031 under Senate Bill 828; and

WHEREAS, A May 19, 2022 hearing at the Government Audit and Oversight Committee on funding shortfalls or San Francisco to reach its affordable housing goals revealed that the city would need to find \$19 billion over the eight-year period; and

WHEREAS, The California Department of Housing and Community Development has warned the city that its non-compliance with its Housing Element may result in punitive action; and

WHEREAS, The increased production necessary to reach the mandated goals in this RHNA cycle would be severely hampered by the decrease in funding as proposed by Governor Newsom; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors calls on the state legislature to reject these deep cuts during the budget process and to restore the investments to critical affordable housing programs; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges Governor Gavin Newsom to work with the State Legislature to restore those funding commitments to affordable housing

in the State Budget, preventing harms that would be inflicted on protected classes and historically marginalized communities across the State and particularly in San Francisco, and abide by its legal responsibilities to affirmatively further fair housing.
