2 AUTHORIZING PROPONENT'S BALLOT ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF PROPOSITION D, A  
3 CHARTER AMENDMENT REGARDING CATASTROPHIC SICK LEAVE PROGRAM.

5 IT IS HEREBY MOVED, That pursuant to Section 540 of the Municipal Elections  
6 Code, the Board of Supervisors does hereby authorize a ballot argument in favor of  
7 Proposition D, a Charter amendment (Second Draft) amending Sections A8.364 and  
8 A8.441, to give the Board of Supervisors the authority to allow City employees to transfer  
9 unused sick leave to groups of catastrophically-ill City employees and to transfer vacation  
10 credits to other City employees for use as family leave to care for spouses, domestic  
11 partners, and other dependents; and be it

12 FURTHER MOVED, That the full text of said argument hereby authorized be shown  
13 in the copy attached to this motion and is hereby declared to be a part hereof; and, be it

14 FURTHER MOVED, That the Director of Elections be and is hereby authorized and  
15 directed to include said argument in the pamphlet accompanying the sample ballots to be  
16 mailed to the voters of the City and County of San Francisco for the election to be held on  
17 Tuesday, November 2, 1999.

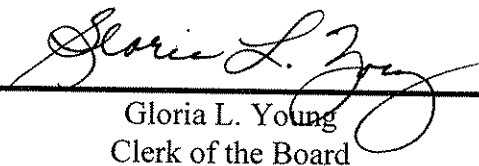
