

1 [Administrative Code - Emergency Contracts for Repairs]

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3 **Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to require Departments seeking Board of**  
4 **Supervisors approval to enter into a contract for emergency repairs to provide an**  
5 **estimated cost of the proposed emergency work, and upon completion of the repairs, a**  
6 **summary of the actual cost.**

12 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

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14 Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Section 6.60, to  
15 read as follows:

17 **SEC. 6.60. EMERGENCY REPAIRS, WORK AND CONTRACTS.**

18 (a) Declaration of Emergency. The Board of Supervisors may declare an emergency  
19 and may direct any Department Head to perform any repair or other emergency work in any  
20 manner the Board determines to be in the best interests of the City.

22 (d) Approvals Required for Determination of Emergency. If the estimated cost of the  
23 emergency work is less than or equal to \$250,000 the Department Head may proceed with  
24 the work without additional approvals. If the estimated cost of the emergency work exceeds  
25 \$250,000, the Department Head prior to authorizing the commencement of the work, must

1 first secure the approval in writing of the Mayor or the president of the board or commission  
2 concerned as appropriate to the department. For all cases where the cost of the emergency  
3 work exceeds \$250,000, the Department Head shall also obtain the approval of the Board of  
4 Supervisors by resolution. Such resolution shall set forth the estimated cost of the proposed  
5 emergency work. In the event that the actual cost of the emergency work exceeds the estimated cost,  
6 the Department Head shall prepare a closeout report describing the actual costs, and shall submit a  
7 copy of the closeout report to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors for inclusion in the Board File  
8 containing the resolution approving the declaration of emergency under this Section 6.60.

9 If the emergency does not permit the required approvals of the emergency  
10 determination to be obtained before work is commenced or the Contract(s) entered into, such  
11 approvals shall be obtained as soon thereafter as it is possible to do so. In such event, the  
12 Department Head concerned shall notify the Controller immediately of the work involved or  
13 the Contract(s) entered into and the estimated cost thereof. The proposed resolution  
14 approving the emergency determination shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors within  
15 60 days of the Department Head's emergency declaration.

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17 Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after  
18 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the  
19 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board  
20 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
