7 health and educational development of our Nation’s children by making nutritious morning
8 meals available in schools; and,

9 WHEREAS, Recent studies indicate that students who eat breakfast have improved
10 math grades and reading scores, increased attention, reduced absence and tardiness rates
11 and improved psycho-social behaviors; and

12 WHEREAS, A school breakfast is often the only morning meal available to many
13 children and therefore represents a vital part of the initiative to improve the education skills of
14 young children and prepare them for life; and,

15 WHEREAS, The number of schools and children participating in the School Breakfast
16 Program have doubled over the past decade due to the efforts of the School Nutrition
17 Association; and,

18 WHEREAS, March 7 – 11 is recognized as National School Breakfast Week; now,
19 therefore, be it

20 **RESOLVED**, That the Board of Supervisors declares March 7 – 11, 2005 to be “School
21 Breakfast Week” in the City and County of San Francisco.
