(Option to Lease Property)

GRANTING AN OPTION TO LEASE CERTAIN CITY PROPERTY UNDER THE PURVIEW OF THE FIRE COMMISSION TO A NONPROFIT AGENCY.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco property, commonly known and numbered as 2350 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Block 2347, Lot 4G, is City-owned property (the "Property") under the jurisdiction of the Fire Department and under the purview of the Fire Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Commission recommends the lease of the Property at a nominal rent so community services located therein will not be hindered by market value payments to the City and County of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Resource Center, a nonprofit corporation, has been established to provide community services on the Property, with a particular emphasis on providing information and referral services to monolingual Chinese residents of the Sunset District, and the change in use of the Property will require City Planning's approval of the General Plan Referral and an application for a Conditional Use Permit; and

WHEREAS, It is in the City's interest to grant a six-month option to lease the Property to the San Francisco Resource Center as set forth below; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City hereby grants a six-month option to lease the Property to the San Francisco Resource Center, a nonprofit corporation, for \$1 per year. The lease agreement shall be for a term of 1-year with subsequent extensions which must be exercised by both the tenant and City as landlord; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That upon (i) the adoption of City Planning's findings as to the General Plan Referral, (ii) approval of the application for Conditional Use Permit, (iii) completion of all appropriate environmental review, and (iv) the San Francisco Resource Center's exercise of its option, the Mayor's Office will present the final form of the lease to the Board of Supervisors for final approval; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, The City, including its Board of Supervisors and Commissions will retain the absolute discretion to (a) make such modifications in the project as are deemed necessary to mitigate significant environmental impacts, if any, (b) select other feasible alternatives to avoid such impacts, (c) balance the benefits against the unavoidable significant impacts prior to taking final action if such significant impacts cannot otherwise be avoided, or (d) determine not to proceed with the proposed project based upon the information generated by the environmental review process.
