3 **Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Public Health to accept and**
4 **expend a grant in the amount of \$316,800 from the San Francisco Health Plan for**
5 **participation in a program, entitled “CalAIM Incentive Payment Program (IPP),” for the**
6 **period of September 12, 2022, through February 28, 2023.**

8 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Health Plan (SFHP) has agreed to fund the
9 Department of Public Health (DPH) in the amount of \$316,800 for participation in a program,
10 entitled “CalAIM Incentive Payment Program (IPP),” for the period of September 12, 2022,
11 through February 28, 2023; and

12 WHEREAS, The funding will be used to hire DPH information technology (IT) staff to
13 support the approvals process, technical build, and implementation of CareLink, and increase
14 the number of organizations and individuals who are able to use CareLink; and

15 WHEREAS, Staff will be onboarded and trained to optimize use and understanding of
16 these CareLink functionalities; and

17 WHEREAS, Advisory services will be procured to perform a review of Medi-Cal IT
18 security requirements; and

19 WHEREAS, Tracking of new CareLink accounts, and numbers of new staff onboarded
20 to be trained in CareLink will be performed; and

21 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance Amendment; and

22 WHEREAS, A request for retroactive approval is being sought because DPH received
23 the agreement on September 14, 2022, for a project start date of September 12, 2022; and

24 WHEREAS, The Department proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on
25 program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it

Project #1: San Francisco Department of Health (SFDPH) Information Technology (IT) Staff to Support Approvals Process, Technical Infrastructure Build, and Implementation of CareLink:

- **This funding will support the hiring of a SFDPH IT staff member to support the approvals process, technical build, and implementation of CareLink and increase the number of organizations and individuals who are able to use CareLink.**
- **Health plans and community-based organization (CBO) partners, including San Francisco Health Plan lead entities and Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (HSH), will have access to SFDPH CareLink, but will have a wide range of support needs for implementation. SFDPH CareLink is an IT platform that will provide access to client background and overviews, CalAIM Community Supports (CS) service history, visit histories at SFDPH and other city healthcare sites, information on shelter stays and transition into permanent supportive housing, and more to support implementation of CalAIM CS services in San Francisco.**

2) CareLink Client Summary Trainings to Build Capacity:

- This funding will support the hiring of a trainer to build materials and lead CareLink client summary trainings to onboard and train staff and optimize use and understanding of the CareLink functionalities needed to implement CalAIM initiatives in San Francisco.
- The San Francisco Health Network (SFHN) provides CareLink access for numerous groups within the community. With the expansion of CalAIM Enhanced Care Management (ECM) and Community Supports (CS) we anticipate a significant increase in requests for CareLink access from San Francisco Health Plan (SFHP) ECM lead entities, SF Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (HSH), and more than 50 community-based organizations. SFPD IT is currently unable to support training and education requests to ensure users are able to implement the tools required to coordinate care.
