9	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
10	Section 1. The San Francisco Municipal Elections Code is hereby amended by adding		
11	Article X, Sections 1000-1030, to read as follows:		
12	ARTICLE X. ELECTION DAY VOTER REGISTRATION AND LATE VOTER

14	SEC. 1000. DEFINITIONS.		
15	(a) "Affidavit of Registration" shall mean the state voter registration form described in		
16	California Elections Code section 2150.		
17	(b) "Exclusively Municipal Election" shall mean any election conducted according to the		
18	election procedures set forth in the City Charter and Municipal Elections Code. It shall not include a		
19	municipal election that is consolidated with a federal, state or district election, or a municipal election		
20	that is consolidated with any other election conducted under the provisions of law governing statewide		
21	elections.		
22	SEC. 1010. REGISTRATION, VOTING AND CANVASS PROCEDURES.		
23	(a) Beginning 14 days before an Exclusively Municipal Election, any San Francisco resident		
24	who is eligible to vote in that election may register and vote by submitting an affidavit of registration

(b) During the 14 day period before an exclusively municipal election, the Department of Elections shall make available at its office affidavits of registration and provisional ballots for late registrants. On Election Day, the Department of Elections shall make available at every polling place affidavits of registration and provisional ballots for election day registrants. The Department of Elections shall accept affidavits of registration and provisional ballots at its office during regular business hours and during any extended hours when the office is open for early voting. On Election Day, the Department shall also accept affidavits of registration and provisional ballots at polling places during the hours the polls are open for voting.

(c) After the Department of Elections has processed all affidavits of registration received under subsection (a), the Department shall examine all provisional ballots received under subsection (a).

These provisional ballots shall be handled, examined, and included in the official canvass according to the procedures set forth in California Elections Code section 14310.

#### SEC. 1020. EXCLUSIONS.

Nothing in this Article shall alter the manner in which the Department of Elections processes affidavits of registration received before the voter registration deadlines established by California Elections Code sections 2100 et seq and 3500 et seq. Any San Francisco resident who is eligible to vote in an Exclusively Municipal Election may register to vote in that election by following the voter registration procedures set forth in California Elections Code sections 2100 et seq and 3500 et seq.

## SEC. 1030. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Article shall take effect only if the voters adopt at the November 2, 2010 election a proposed Charter Amendment to establish Election Day Voter Registration. If the voters adopt the proposed Charter Amendment, this Article shall take effect on the same day the Charter Amendment takes effect. If the voters reject the proposed Charter Amendment, this Article shall be deemed

inoperative as a matter of law and the City Attorney shall cause this Article to be removed from the Municipal Elections Code.

Section 2. Preemption.

In adopting this Article, the Board of Supervisors does not intend to regulate or affect the rights of any person to register or vote in any election conducted under the provisions of law governing statewide elections. Nothing in this Article shall alter the voter registration deadlines for any election conducted under the provisions of law governing statewide elections.

#### LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Election Day Voter Registration procedures.]

Ordinance amending the San Francisco Municipal Elections Code by adding Article X, Sections 1000-1030 to establish procedures for Election Day Voter Registration and Late Voter Registration.

### **Existing Law**

Voter registration in the City and County of San Francisco is conducted according to state law. There are no local registration procedures that differ from state law.

State law requires most individuals to register to vote at least 15 days before an election. Those who become U.S. citizens after the 15-day deadline may register to vote at least seven days before an election.

### Amendments to Current Law

The proposal would establish procedures for Election Day Voter Registration and Late Voter Registration for exclusively municipal elections. These procedures would take effect only if the voters at the November 2, 2010 election adopt a proposed Charter Amendment to establish Election Day Voter Registration.

The proposed procedures would permit qualified San Francisco residents to register and vote during the 14 day period before an exclusively municipal election, up to and including Election Day. To register and vote during this period, a qualified resident would be required to submit a state voter registration form together with a provisional ballot. The Department of Elections would be required to process voter registration forms submitted by late registrants before examining the provisional ballots cast by these registrants.

#### **Background Information**

A proposed Charter Amendment for the November 2, 2010 election would establish Election Day Voter Registration for exclusively municipal elections in San Francisco. The proposed Charter Amendment directs the Board of Supervisors to establish by ordinance procedures for election day voting registration, in consultation with the Director of Elections.
