COMMENDING NEIL THOMSEN FOR HIS WORK AT THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES AND RECORDS ADMINISTRATION (NARA).

WHEREAS, Neil L. Thomsen is a dedicated Research Specialist who retired in July of this year from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA), Sierra Pacific Region, located in San Bruno; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Thomsen has given 12 years of devoted service to the public, with particular expertise in the area of Asian American historical/genealogical research; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Thomsen has been an incredible resource and unrelenting protector of our past individual and family histories, as well of our collective heritage as native born as well as immigrant Americans; and,

WHEREAS. He has been instrumental in promoting public education and awareness of the unique historical circumstances of our ancestors, whereby they prevailed under some of the most discriminatory immigration laws and policies ever passed in U.S. history, for example the Chinese Exclusion Act, and the establishment of an "Asiatic Barred Zone" which excluded Japanese, Filipinos and others; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Thomsen's intimate knowledge and experience with Asian immigrant files is unmatched by any other public official in the entire regional network of offices across the nation operated by the National Archives and Records Administration; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Thomsen has been an undeniable "key" to "unlocking" our past -which is often complicated with Chinese "paper son" identities and stories of Japanese
"picture brides"; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Thomsen was the one to be ever ready to hand us a tissue as we read the many stories and stumbled upon long lost family pictures in the hundreds upon hundreds of case files resting in dusty boxes that rise to the ceilings of the concrete, bunker walls housing the regional National Archives in San Bruno; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Thomsen did this not just for us in the Asian American community but for all others, from all other communities and all walks of life as well; and,

WHEREAS, His departure will leave a huge chasm in the National Archives, not only in expertise and experience in regards to the files he managed, but also in the way he has helped to educate others about the value, integrity, and treasures that reside in the files; and,

WHEREAS, As busy as he was, he never thought any inquiry was too tough or trivial to handle or any 'story' mundane or less than fascinating in its own right; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Thomsen has been a great protector of our interests to maintain public access and preservation of these historic treasures, these heirlooms of our national family, sometimes at great risk to his own personal welfare and interests; and,

WHEREAS, He continues to be a passionate advocate of maintaining public access to and preservation of the many historic treasures housed at the National Archives and Records Administration, particularly at the Pacific Regional Center in San Bruno; and,

WHEREAS, Our community of San Francisco, including all ethnic groups of the City and County of San Francisco are indebted to him for preserving our historical materials and protecting our public access to our collective past; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco on behalf of the citizens of and the visitors to this City do hereby express our deep appreciation and bestow this commendation with these words: Thank you for a job well done.
