BUSINESS AND PAYROLL TAX OBLIGATIONS AND INCENTIVES, TO DETERMINE THE SECTORS WHERE CURRENT AND PROJECTED BUSINESS GROWTH LIES AND TO ESTABLISH WHETHER EXISTING ATTRACTION AND RETENTION POLICIES ARE APPROPRIATE TO WHERE THE GROWTH IS.  
WHEREAS, Various San Francisco agencies and departments plan and

implement business attraction and retention policies; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco participates in a number of public-private partnerships

to this end; and,

WHEREAS, Business and payroll tax obligations and incentives affect

employment and benefits, revenue generation, and business viability; and,

WHEREAS, Perceptions of the tax code influence the business climate; now,

therefore, be it

MOVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors does hereby request the

and retention policies are appropriate to where the growth is.


