COMMENDING AND PAYING TRIBUTE TO THE LIFE OF DR. DUBOIS PHILLIP MCGEE AND HIS CONTRIBUTIONS TO EDUCATION, ESPECIALLY IN THE FIELD OF ETHNIC STUDIES

WHEREAS, Dr. McGee passed away on July 29, 1999, one month after receiving the Presidential Medal for Service at San Francisco State University; and

WHEREAS, Dr. McGee began his career at San Francisco State University in 1976 as lecturer in the Black Studies Department, and was promoted acting chair two years later; and

WHEREAS, Dr. McGee became the Dean of the College of Ethnic Studies at San Francisco State University in 1980 and held that position ever since; and

WHEREAS, The College of Ethnic Studies that he headed is the only college of Ethnic Studies in the world; and

WHEREAS, During Dr. McGee's tenure, the College of Ethnic Studies grew from 200 students to 10,000, has over 80 faculty members, and offers degrees in Asian American, black and La Raza studies; and

WHEREAS, Dr. McGee was a board member of the institute for the Advanced Study of Black Family Life and Culture, An Ark of Love/AIDS Hospice and Preventive Education, and the Edwin Hawkins Music and Arts Seminar, as well as an advisory board member of the Center for Applied Cultural Studies and Educational Achievement and the Caesar Chavez Public Policy Institute at San Francisco State University; and

WHEREAS, Dr. McGee authored numerous articles, journals, and publications, such as Academic Achievement, Participation and Black Alienation in High School Youth, Genetic Research and Black Intelligence, Seminar in African Psychology, and Voodoo or IQ: An Introduction to African Psychology; and

WHEREAS, The entire San Francisco community mourns the loss of Dr. McGee and his invaluable contributions to the field of ethnic studies; now therefore, be it
