3 Resolution recognizing Officer Waldemar L. Jentzsch of the San Francisco Police

6 WHEREAS, Officer Waldemar L. Jentzsch joined the San Francisco Police Department
7 on January 11, 1932; and

8 WHEREAS, Soon after the joining the Department, Officer Jentzsch was assigned to
9 the prestigious motorcycle unit; and

10 WHEREAS, On Christmas Eve 1937, while pursuing a fleeing suspect on Bayshore
11 Boulevard, near Cortland Avenue, he was involved in a traffic collision with another vehicle;
12 and

13 WHEREAS, As a result of the collision, Officer Jentzsch suffered fatal injuries,
14 succumbing to them on Christmas Day 1937; and

15 WHEREAS, Officer Jentzsch gave 6 years of dedicated and outstanding service to the
16 people of the City and County San Francisco; and

17 WHEREAS, Officer Jentzsch exemplified outstanding bravery above and beyond the
18 expected call of duty; and

19 WHEREAS, Officer Jentzsch risked his life with full unquestionable knowledge of the
20 danger involved; and

21 WHEREAS, Officer Jentzsch served to exemplify the strength of courage, compassion,
22 and commitment to community that is embodied in all of the men and women of the San
23 Francisco Police Department; now, therefore, be it
