5	WHEREAS, the City of San Francisco houses a diverse population, including citizens	
6	of other nations whose contributions to the community are vital to its character and function;

8	WHEREAS, the United States Constitution guarantees all persons living in the United	
9	States fundamental rights including freedom of religion, speech, assembly and privacy;	
10	protection from unreasonable searches and seizures; due process and equal protection to

13	WHEREAS, the USA PATRIOT Act signed by President George W. Bush on Octobe

FURTHER RESOLVED, that, to the extent legally possible, no City employee or

department shall officially assist or voluntarily cooperate with investigations, interrogations, or

1	arrest procedures, public or clandestine, that are in violation of individuals' civil rights or civil
2	liberties as specified in the above Amendments of the United States Constitution; and be it
3	FURTHER RESOLVED that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors calls upon all
4	private citizens and organizations, including residents, employers, educators, and business
5	owners, to demonstrate similar respect for civil rights and civil liberties, especially but not
6	limited to conditions of employment and cooperation with investigations; and be it
7	FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of San Francisco call on our United
8	States Representatives and Senators to monitor the implementation of the Act and Orders
9	cited herein and actively work for the repeal of the Act and those Orders that violate
10	fundamental rights and liberties as stated in the United States Constitution and its
11	Amendments.
