[STATE FUNDING FOR SERVICES TO IMMIGRANT COMMUNITIES]

URGING THE CALIFORNIA STATE LEGISLATURE TO INCLUDE FUNDING FOR PROGRAMS WHICH PROVIDE ONGOING SERVICES TO IMMIGRANT COMMUNIITES IN THE 2000-2001 STATE BUDGET.

WHEREAS, On January 10th, Governor Davis officially released his proposed 2000-2001 state budget; and

WHEREAS, Although the proposed budget continues to fund most programs for immigrants, it does not continue to provide benefits for recent immigrants beyond a limited time- reflecting a lack of ongoing commitment to immigrant needs; and

WHEREAS, The \$4.9 million proposed budget for the Healthy Families Program would allow recent legal immigrant children (post 8/22/96 entrance) who enroll in Healthy Families by June 30, 2000, to continue receiving Healthy Families through June 30, 2001, the budget does not provide any funding for legal immigrant children who seek to enroll after June 30, 2000; and

WHEREAS, The \$21.6 million proposed budget for the Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI) does not provide CAPI benefits for recent legal immigrants (post-8/22/96 entrants) beyond the sunset date, September 30, 2000; and

WHEREAS, The \$51.6 million proposed budget for the California Food Assistance Program (CFAP) reflects a \$5.8 million reduction and does not allow CFAP to continue to provide benefits to recent legal immigrants (post 8/22/96 entrants) beyond the sunset date, September 30, 2000; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the California State Legislature to include funding for programs which provide ongoing services to immigrant communities in the 2000-2001 state budget.
