

1 [Urging Passage of SB 1856]
2 Resolution urging the California State Legislature to pass SB 1856,
3 the California High-Speed Passenger Train Bond Act of 2002.

5 WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1856, introduced by State Senator Jim
6 Costa, would authorize a \$6 billion bond measure on the November 2002
7 ballot to fund the construction of high-speed train service between
8 San Francisco and Los Angeles; and,

9 WHEREAS, Such a link would ease congestion on freeways and
10 airports and offer a low-cost alternative to air travel; and,

11 WHEREAS, Once the system is fully built in 2020, it would serve
12 an estimated 10 million commuters and 32 million inter-city travelers
13 and generate over \$900 million in revenues with an annual surplus of
14 more than \$300 million; and,

15 WHEREAS, Bond money would cover approximately half the costs of
16 constructing the rail line, with the rest coming from federal and
17 private sources; and,

18 WHEREAS, Over 80 percent of the costs required for the project
19 will be spent on actual construction of the track and stations and
20 would create approximately 300,00 construction jobs across the state,
21 beginning in early 2005 with some routes in operation by 2008; now,
22 therefore be it

23 RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco Board of
24 Supervisors hereby urges the California State Legislature to pass SB
25 1856, the California High-Speed Passenger Train Bond Act of 2002.




