- SFUSD is a single district SELPA with a County Office of Education
- Therefore, SFUSD Superintendent is also Superintende our County Office of Education
- SFUSD Assistant Superintendent of Special Education is SELPA Director
- Per California Education Code, every SELPA must:
 - Submit an BOE Approved Local Plan
 - Have a Community Advisory Committee for Special Education



SELPA Community Advisory Committee

 Every Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) is required to establish a CAC. Across California, many CACs are vibrant, creative bodies that assist in advising local governing boards about the Local Plan, annual priorities, parent education, and other specified Special Education related activities."

What is the Annual Service Plan?

- Description of every service code currently provided in SFUSD
- Service minutes from Individual Education Plans (IEPs) are input by case managers into the Special Education Information System (SEIS)
- Services are provided to fit the individual needs of the child.
- Some school sites might have additional services for special programming, for example:
 - Autism programs o
 - Deaf and Hard of Hearing programs

Local Plan Section E: Annual Service Plan

California Education Code (EC) sections 56205(b)(2) and (d); 56001; and 56195.9

The Local Plan Section E: Annual Service Plan must be adopted at a public hearing held by the SELPA. Notice of this hearing shall be posted in each school in the SELPA at least 15 days before the hearing. Local Plan Section E: Annual Service Plan may be revised during any fiscal year according to the SELPA's process as established and specified in Section B: Governance and Administration portion of the Local Plan consistent with *EC* sections 56001(f) and 56195.9. Local Plan Section E: Annual Service Plan must include a description of services to be provided by each local educational agency (LEA), including the nature of the services and the physical location where the services are provided (Attachment VI), regardless of whether the LEA is participating in the Local Plan.

Services Included in the Local Plan Section E: Annual Service Plan

All entities and individuals providing related services shall meet the qualifications found in Title 34 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (34 *CFR*) Section 300.156(b), Title 5 of the *California Code of Regulations* (5 *CCR*) 3001(r) and the applicable portions 3051 et. seg.:; and shall be either employees of an LEA or county office of education (COE), employed under contract pursuant to *EC* sections 56365-56366, or employees, vendors or contractors of the State Departments of Health Care Services or State Hospitals, or any designated local public health or mental health agency. Services provided by individual LEAs and school sites are to be included in **Attachment VI**.



SFUSD Students on the Autism Spectrum 2000-2024 Autism in SFUSD

In SFUSD, ~22% of students with IEPs are eligible under Autism.

Only a small percentage of those students require a more restrictive, specialized setting (SDC) to access Educational Benefit



Note: During the same 24 year period, the percentage of students classified Speech or Language Impairment decreased from 18.0% to 17.5%
