1	[Urging Pacific Gas and Electric Company to Grant the Police Department to Install Gunshot Tracking Technology on Their Telephone and Power Poles Throughout San Francisco]
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3	Resolution urging Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) to grant the Police
4	Department the ability to install gunshot tracking technology on PG&E telephone and
5	power poles throughout San Francisco without charge for the purpose of furthering
6	community policing and curbing gun violence.
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8	WHEREAS, Gun violence is a major national and local concern and statistics show that
9	there were more than 51,000 separate incidents of gunfire in 2013, many of them occurring in
10	metropolitan cities, like San Francisco; and
11	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco and the San Francisco Police
12	Department are spearheading innovative efforts to curb gun violence, which include the use of
13	technology to track gunfire by location; and
14	WHEREAS, This gunfire tracking technology allows the San Francisco Police
15	Department to locate shootings within 40 feet of where the shooting occurred and respond
16	immediately; and
17	WHEREAS, The ability to track and respond to gunfire in a timely fashion is critical to
18	public safety; and
19	WHEREAS, If the San Francisco Police Department were to rely exclusively on 911
20	call reports by residents, only 10 to 20 percent of the actual gunfire incidents would be
21	tracked, but by increasing this gun tracking technology, the remaining 80 to 90 percent of
22	gunfire not reported by residents would be captured; and
23	WHEREAS, The gunfire tracking technology also creates a mechanism of
24	accountability within the San Francisco Police Department, as it is expected to respond to all
25	reported incidents of gunfire in a timely fashion; and

1	WHEREAS, In 2008, the San Francisco Police Department began implementing this
2	technology in areas of the city with the highest levels of gun violence, including parts of
3	Bayview-Hunters Point, Western Addition and the Mission, and an expansion of the project
4	was approved by the San Francisco Police Department in 2013 to cover a larger portion of
5	San Francisco; and
6	WHEREAS, As part of this expansion, the San Francisco Police Department has
7	partnered with the San Francisco Unified School District and the San Francisco Public Utilities
8	Commission to install the tracking technology upon rooftops and on PUC light poles; and
9	WHEREAS, The final portion of this expansion requires the use of PG&E poles, and
10	this expansion has been stalled, largely due to unexpectedly high fees by PG&E related to the
11	installation of the technology on their poles; and
12	WHEREAS, Other municipalities and their respective police departments around the
13	country are using the same gunfire tracking technology, and are receiving support from the
14	local utilities agency to install the tracking technology on light and telephone poles without
15	cost; and
16	WHEREAS, The gunfire tracking technology is most effective when installed in high
17	places, such as light poles; and
18	WHEREAS, The PUC made their light poles available in identified expansion
19	neighborhoods with no installation cost; and
20	WHEREAS, PG&E gains significant profits from the residents of the City and County of
21	San Francisco, and the company has the opportunity to help curb gun violence; and
22	WHEREAS, Public safety and the safety of our communities is of the utmost
23	importance to a healthy and vibrant city; now, therefore, be it
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1	RESOLVED, That San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges Pacific Gas and Electric
2	Company to allow the San Francisco Police Department to install gunfire tracking technology
3	on PG&E telephone and power poles at no cost; and, be it
4	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby directs
5	the Clerk of the Board to send a copy of this Resolution to Pacific Gas and Electric Company
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
