

1 [Accept and Expend Grant - Electric Vehicle Infrastructure - \$173,000]

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Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of the Environment to accept and expend a grant sub-award of \$173,000 from the Association of Bay Area Governments to contribute to the cost of installing publicly available electric vehicle chargers.

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WHEREAS, The Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG), through a grant from the California Energy Commission (CEC), has awarded a grant subaward of \$173,000 to the Department of the Environment of the City and County of San Francisco for costs associated with installing publicly available electric vehicle chargers in various locations throughout the City; and

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WHEREAS, Electric vehicles significantly reduce greenhouse gases compared to vehicles with internal combustion engines; and

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WHEREAS, Forty percent of greenhouse gases currently generated in San Francisco are attributable to transportation; and

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WHEREAS, In 2004, the Department of the Environment and the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission released a Climate Action Plan for San Francisco identifying transportation, energy efficiency, renewable energy, and solid waste measures that could achieve significant greenhouse gas reductions; and

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WHEREAS, Creating the infrastructure necessary to support the market for electric vehicles in San Francisco is an important element of San Francisco's strategy for reducing greenhouse gases; and

1 WHEREAS, In addition, companies manufacturing electric vehicles have targeted San
2 Francisco as a strong "early adopter" market, and critical actions need to be taken by the City
3 for that market to materialize; and

4 WHEREAS, Installation of publicly available electric vehicle chargers is an essential
5 step in ensuring automobile manufacturers continue to view San Francisco as a location
6 primed to accelerate the adoption of electric vehicles; and

7 WHEREAS, The electric vehicle charging stations will be publicly available and will
8 serve residents from all parts of San Francisco; and


9 WHEREAS, The term of this grant is from April 15, 2012 to April 30, 2013; and

10 WHEREAS, The grant provides for \$84,751 in indirect costs; and

11 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance (ASO)
12 amendment; now, therefore, be it

13 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of the Department
14 of the Environment to accept and expend a grant subaward in the amount of \$173,000 from
15 the Association of Bay Area Governments to contribute to the cost of installing electric vehicle
16 chargers.

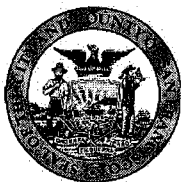
