Linda Richardson is appointed to succeed Helen Nigg (Seat 5), term ending April 28, 2014.


Jean-Paul Samaha is reappointed to his same seat (Seat 4), term ending February 26, 2014.

Linda Fadeke Richardson

Linda Fadeke Richardson is a Land Use, and economic development expert with over twenty years in the public and private sector. She was appointed by Mayor Gavin Newsom in 2006 to serve on the SF Human Rights Commission. As the Co-Chair of the Local Business Enterprise, she has worked with the Mayor, SF Board of Supervisors, Minority Owned, and Women business entities, and City Departments to address contracting disparities. As a result, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors has enacted policies to improve the business climate in San Francisco.

In 1998, Miss Richardson was appointed by Mayor Brown to the twelve member task force whose recommendation was adopted by the SF Public Utilities Commission, and later by San Francisco voters in the historic decision to overhaul the aging SF Water infrastructure. She also led the negotiation with a SF Utility concern to close the aging Hunters Point Power Plant which has resulted in a new state of the art transmission utility network for the city and the region.

Linda is a former member of the SF Planning Commission, where she worked on the approvals of major signature city projects, most notably, Mission Bay, SF Giants Stadium, several affordable Housing and Public Works projects. She served on the Commission on the Environment to implement the SF Sustainability Plan. During her tenure the first series of guidelines for Environmental Justice were developed for the city, most of which has become a national model. Miss Richardson's extensive work on sustainability and smart growth development, Environmental Justice is nationally known. She has received numerous awards, and recognition by the United States Congress. Working with the SF Diverse communities has been the highlight of her career, and she will forever value the team work, exposure, and opportunities to make the city a better place for all residents.

In 2002, the former Governor of California, Gray Davis appointed her to serve on the Bay Conservation and Development Commission (BCDC). The State agency provides regulatory oversight over the Bay Area coastal development.

While serving on the Civil Service Commission, and later as its President, Linda collaborated with the SF Labor organizations and city employees to develop policies for the Department of Human Resources on hiring, promotion, and workforce development.

Since 1994, Linda Richardson has been a member of the Bayview Hunters Point Project Area Committee, and as the Chair of its Land Use, Planning and Transportation Committee, she has been working with the SF Redevelopment Agency, Mayor's Office of Economic Development, SF Planning Dept to develop the Southeast Revitalization plan, including: the Bayview Development Plan, the Shipyard/Candlestick Project, Muni 3rd Street Light Rail, the Southern Waterfront, the India Basin Shoreline Plan, and numerous education and workforce development initiatives. She has spearheaded many transportation improvement feasibility studies for the SF Southeast sector. When fully implemented, these projects will alter the economic landscape of the City and County of San Francisco while providing massive employment, and businesses opportunities for our residents.

Currently, Linda Richardson is a board member of the Bayview Multi-Purpose Senior Center, and she sits on the board of several SF Women's political, and business organizations. She has lectured extensively on the emerging Green economy.

Colleagues,

I would like to take this opportunity to echo the concerns of many of my constituents on Treasure Island. Simply put, the appointees for the Authority, items 5-13 on your agenda today, have no TI resident representation and, on the whole, are unacceptable.

As you know the TIDA Board of Directors make policy decisions critical to the future and ongoing operations of Treasure Island. They approve large contracts and TIDA's annual budget and acts as both the redevelopment agency and the trustee of the Tideland Trust for Treasure Island. I believe that it is critical to have one or more TI residents on this Board to ensure that Island resident concerns are adequately heard and addressed.

In 2006 the Board of Supervisors deliberated this issue at the Rules Committee, rejected an appointee, and asked the Mayor to appoint an island resident. The Mayor appointed Owen Stephens, who was unanimously approved by the Board. Commissioner Stephens has been widely praised for his work on TIDA and now serves as its Chair.

The Board of Supervisors received notification from the Office of the Mayor dated October 12, 2010 in regards to TIDA appointments in front of you today. For some reason, Mr. Stephens was not recommended for reappointment. After significant push-back from TI residents, the Office of the Mayor emailed a press release inviting Treasure Island residents to apply for TIDA Board. Given the Office of the Mayor selected its current appointments prior to inviting Treasure Island residents to apply and that this notice has only been out for 2 weeks, I respectfully request that the Rules Committee strongly consider the lack of resident representation with the current applicants before you and reject all of the applicants until the Mayor bothers to forward an appointment of an island resident to TIDA.

While I have other issues with several of the appointments in front of you, I am unable to address them until this defining issue is dealt with.

Board Qualifications:

The Treasure Island Development Authority Board of Directors consists of a total of ten members: seven members appointed by the Mayor and such appointments are subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors (the appointments of Directors who are officers of the City and County of San Francisco or officers of the SF Redevelopment agency shall be effective immediately and remain so unless rejected by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Supervisors within thirty days following transmittal of written notice to the Board of Supervisors of such appointments) and three non-voting ex-officio members: the then-sitting President of the Board of Supervisors, the Chair of the Committee with jurisdiction over Housing, and the Chair of the Committee with jurisdiction over Land Use, or their designees. (The authorized number of Directors shall not be less than five nor more than seven until changed by a Bylaw. The exact number of Directors shall be fixed by a resolution adopted by the Board.) No more than 49% of the persons serving on the Board may be interested persons as defined in Section 5 of the Bylaws. Directors shall be selected based on their expertise in the areas of real estate development, urban planning, environmental protection and resource conservation, homeless assistance, financing and other disciplines relevant to the reuse of the Base.

Furthermore, in the event one or more of the ex-officio Directors is unable to attend a meeting or meetings of the Authority, the President of the Board of Supervisors may appoint other members of the Board of Supervisors to fill any such vacancies and sit as the Ex-Officio Directors for such meeting or meetings by submitting written notice of such appointment to the

Clerk of the Board, provided such ex-officio Directors do not, together, otherwise constitute a quorum of any then constituted Committee of the Board.

The Authority is a nonprofit public benefit corporation to promote the planning, redevelopment, reconstruction, rehabilitation, reuse and conversion of the Base for the public interest, convenience, welfare and common benefit of the inhabitants of San Francisco. The Authority closely monitors the negotiations with the United States Navy regarding conveyance of the former Naval Station Treasure Island (the "Base"). The Authority is designated as a redevelopment agency with powers over Treasure Island.

Reports: The Authority shall submit quarterly progress reports to the Economic Development, Transportation & Technology Committee of the Board of Supervisors. The Board shall cause an annual report to be prepared within 120 days after the end of the Authority's fiscal year as specified in Article VIII of the Authority's Bylaws.

Term of Office: The Mayor shall designate one Director who is first appointed to serve a term of two years, two Directors who are first appointed to serve a term of three years, and four directors who are first appointed to serve for a term of four years. Thereafter, each Director shall hold office for four years and until a successor has been designated and qualified. There are no limits on the number of consecutive terms a Director may hold office.

Compensation: No Director shall be entitled to receive any compensation for serving as a Director or as an officer of the Authority, except that any Director or officer may be reimbursed for expenses duly incurred in the performance of duties as Director or officer of the Authority, upon approval of the Board.
