9 addressing Commission governance, goals and objectives related to energy, powers of the
10 Commission related to energy, siting of energy facilities and rates for energy services. , (File

12 FURTHER MOVED, That the full text of said argument hereby authorized be shown
13 in the copy attached to this motion and is hereby declared to be a part hereof; and, be it

14 FURTHER MOVED, That the Director of Elections be and is hereby authorized and
15 directed to include said argument in the pamphlet accompanying the sample ballots to be
16 mailed to the voters of the City and County of San Francisco for the election to be held on
17 Tuesday, November 5, 2002.

	Proposition D reforms the Public Utilities Commission by creating a new body	12
	with members appointed by the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, and the	11

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	Controller. Included in these appointments must be commissioners with	9
	backgrounds in utility management, consumer advocacy, and environmental	8

	Through Proposition D, the City can develop generation projects to shut down	12
	polluting power plants and enter into contracts for energy services that serve the	13
	public interest. The City will also have the ability to acquire local transmission	13
	facilities, but only after completing a cost-benefit analysis and Controller	11


