[Accept and Expend Grant - Retroactive - California Department of Social Services - Complex Care Capacity Building Allocation - Not to Exceed \$360,570]

Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Juvenile Probation to accept and expend a grant allocation from the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) in the amount of \$360,570 for the period of October 1, 2021, through September 30, 2026, for Intensive Foster Care and Family Preservation Services.

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 153 required the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) to allocate funds to support the urgent and exceptional needs in the least restrictive setting for foster youth and nonminor dependents (NMDs) under the supervision of county child welfare agencies and probation departments; and

WHEREAS, To achieve those outcomes, CDSS allocated \$43.2 million in one-time funding, available for expenditure from October 1, 2021, through September 30, 2026, to build county capacity and establish high-quality continuum of care; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Human Services Agency (HSA) and Juvenile Probation Department (JPD) jointly completed a Complex Care Capacity Building assessment, including intensive foster care and family preservation services to address the needs of justice involved youth; and

WHEREAS, Some youth ordered to out of home placement by the San Francisco Juvenile Court need intensive treatment and behavioral support, counseling, and life skills support; and

WHEREAS, The Juvenile Probation Department has a partnership with the Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) and Alternative Family Services (AFS) to provide Intensive Services Foster Care (ISFC) and Intensive Family

1	Preservation Services (IFPS); and		
2	WHEREAS, CDSS approved the Juvenile Probation Department's proposal to		
3	use its Complex Care Capacity Building allocation to fund these services through this		
4	existing partnership; and		
5	WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance		
6	Amendment; and		
7	WHEREAS, CDSS allows the application of an indirect cost rate to determine the		
8	fair allocation of administrative costs that grant, or subvention-funded programs should		
9	bear; now, therefore, be it		
10	RESOLVED, That the Chief Juvenile Probation Officer or designee is authorized		
11	to retroactively accept and expend \$360,570 for the period of October 1, 2021, through		
12	September 30, 2026, to support the capacity of the county to deliver intensive foster		
13	care and family preservation services to justice involved youth; and, be it		
14	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the grant funds received hereunder shall not be		
15	used to supplant any expenditures that the Juvenile Probation Department already is		
16	obligated to pay.
