3 WINS Company closure in San Francisco.]

4 **Resolution urging our Federal Congressional representatives to take all appropriate**
5 **steps to urge the Internal Revenue Service to cease attempts to put a lien on money set**
6 **aside for displaced workers from WINS Garment Company.**

7 WHEREAS, The owner of the WINS Garment Company was forced to close its San
8 Francisco facility in August 2001; and

9 WHEREAS, The 200 former employees of WINS Garment Company were given no
10 advance notice of the closure; and

11 WHEREAS, These former employees are owed five months in back wages, and

12 WHEREAS, The money for these wages have been set aside in a lock box, and

13 WHEREAS, These former employees are mostly low wage, immigrant workers with few
14 employment opportunities; now, therefore, be it

15 RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors requests the San
16 Francisco Congressional Representatives to urge the Internal Revenue Service to cease
17 attempts to put a lien on lock box money belonging to former WINS Garment Company


