WHEREAS, The Year 2000 problem results from a shortcut used in computer programming language and embedded chips that causes computers to read the year 2000 as "00" and not know whether to calculate back 100 years to the year 1900 or forward one day to the year 2000; and,

WHEREAS, The Year 2000 problem may cause computers and any devices that have embedded computer chips to shut down, operate incorrectly or produce inaccurate data come January 1, 2000; and,

WHEREAS, Business devices that may be affected by Y2K include medical devices, desktop computers, fax machines, security systems, sprinkler systems, air conditions systems, and thermostats; and,

WHEREAS, Many businesses do not have the time, technical know-how or resources to prepare for Y2K; and

WHEREAS, Minority and women-owned small businesses in particular may have difficulty stopping their activities to make changes to their computer and other systems before January 1, 2000; and

WHEREAS, The City of San Francisco has been working to help small businesses prepare for Y2K by providing information on a web

page and by collaborating with private consultants to survey small businesses about their Y2K preparedness and needs; and,

WHEREAS, While the City of San Francisco has been reaching out to small businesses, the City does not have the resources to work one-on-one with individual businesses to assess their Y2K needs or to ensure their readiness; and,

WHEREAS, Team Y2K is a group of technical experts and consultants who have come together to provide technical assistance and readiness advice to select minority and women-owned small businesses; and,

WHEREAS, Team Y2K will visit businesses, assess their Y2K problems, leave the business owners with clear guidance as to what steps they need to take to become Y2K ready and, where possible, ensure that the business is Y2K compliant; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco endorses the readiness and technical assistance activities of Team Y2k; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges Team Y2K to seek financial support from private foundations and corporations to enable them to give readiness advice and technical assistance to select minority and women-owned businesses.
