

1 [Apply for, Accept, and Expend Grant - United States Department of Housing and Urban
2 Development - Community Development Block Grant Program - \$23,974,217 - FY2019-2020]

3 **Resolution approving the FY2019-2020 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)**
4 **Program; and authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the City and County of San**
5 **Francisco, to apply for, accept, and expend the City's FY2019-2020 CDBG Program**
6 **entitlement from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development in**
7 **the amount of \$18,139,217 and to expend program income and reprogrammed funds**
8 **in the amount of \$5,835,000 for a combined total of approximately \$23,974,217 for a**
9 **period beginning July 1, 2019, through the date when all funds are expended.**

11 WHEREAS, Under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974,
12 as amended, and related Federal Regulations, the City and County of San Francisco is
13 eligible to apply for and receive a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG); and

14 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco anticipates receiving
15 approximately \$18,139,217 in FY2019-2020 CDBG Program funds from the U.S.
16 Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and has approximately \$5,650,000
17 in anticipated Program Income and \$185,000 from previous CDBG grants and program
18 income from prior years, for a combined total of approximately \$23,974,217; and

19 WHEREAS, The Citizen's Committee on Community Development (CCCD) has
20 prepared recommendations for FY2019-2020 CDBG funding as set forth in a proposed
21 Expenditure Schedule, a copy of which is located in Clerk of the Board of Supervisors File
22 No. 190440; and

23 WHEREAS, The proposed grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance
24 amendment; and

1 WHEREAS, The funding agency (HUD) does not allow use of grant on indirect costs;
2 now, therefore, be it

3 RESOLVED, That the Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco is hereby
4 authorized to apply for, accept, and expend the City's 2019 CDBG Program funds from HUD
5 and expend an estimated \$5,835,000 in Program Income and Reprogrammed funds, all in
6 accordance with the purposes and goals for the funding as generally set forth in 2015-2019
7 Five Year Consolidated Plan and the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it

8 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the
9 purposes and goals for FY2019-2020 CDBG Program funding as set forth in the Expenditure
10 Schedule for recipient agencies and departments; and, be it

11 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of
12 indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

13 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into and
14 execute agreements between the City and County of San Francisco and various agencies
15 consistent with FY2019-2020 CDBG Program and the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it

16 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to submit
17 documentation and certifications as may be requested or required by HUD, and to take such
18 additional actions as may be required to apply for, accept and expend the FY2019-2020
19 CDBG funds consistent with this Resolution and the goals of the FY2019-2020 CDBG
20 Program and all applicable legal requirements, and any such actions are solely intended to
21 further the purposes of this Resolution, and are subject in all respect to the terms of this
22 Resolution, and any such action cannot increase the risk to the City, or require the City to
23 expend any resources, and that the Mayor shall consult with the City Attorney prior to
24 execution and provided that within 30 days of the agreements approved by this Resolution
25 being executed by all parties, such final documents (showing marked changes, if any) shall


1 be provided to the Clerk of the Board, for inclusion in the official file, together with a brief

6 are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified.


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


