6 **Department of Public Works, Department of Public Health, Police Department, and the**  
7 **Entertainment Commission that may be appealed to the Board of Appeals; and**  
8 **affirming the Planning Department’s determination under the California Environmental**  
9 **Quality Act.**

17 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

18

19 Section 1. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in  
20 this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public  
21 Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the  
22 Board of Supervisors in File No. 220494 and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board  
23 affirms this determination.

24

25 Section 2. Chapter 10G of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising  
Section 10G.1, to read as follows:

1           **SEC. 10G.1. SURCHARGE IMPOSED; CATEGORIES OF PERMITS AND FEES.**

2           In order to recover the cost to the City and County for the Board of Appeals permit  
3 review functions, at the time a fee for permit application, issuance, or review is collected, and  
4 at the time an annual fee for renewal of the permit or license associated with the permit is  
5 collected, a surcharge in the amount specified shall be charged and collected for the following  
6 categories of permits and fees.

7           (a)     Surcharges on fees imposed by the Department of City Planning pursuant to  
8 Planning Code Section 350 for review of actions and permits that may be appealed to the  
9 Board of Appeals are identified in Section 4 of Ordinance No. 149-16, referenced in Planning  
10 Code Section 350(d). Notwithstanding the dollar amount stated in Ordinance No. 149-16 for  
11 these surcharges, all Board of Appeals surcharges identified in Ordinance No. 149-16 shall be  
12 ~~\$3718.50~~;

13           (b)     For permits issued pursuant to San Francisco Building Code Section 110A:  
14 Tables 1A-A; 1A-F, Item 3; 1A-H; 1A-K, Item 8; or 1A-Q, Item 5; that may be appealed to the  
15 Board of Appeals pursuant to Charter Section 4.106, a surcharge of ~~\$3718.50~~;

16           (c)     For permits issued pursuant to the Public Works Code that may be appealed to  
17 the Board of Appeals pursuant to Charter Section 4.106, a surcharge of ~~\$96.50~~;

18           (d)     For permits specified in Police Code Section 2.26 that may be appealed to the  
19 Board of Appeals pursuant to Charter Section 4.106, a surcharge of ~~\$36~~ for such permits  
20 issued by the Police Department, and a surcharge of ~~\$24~~ for such permits issued by the  
21 Entertainment Commission;

22           (e)     For annual license fees specified in Police Code Section 2.27 for permits that  
23 may be appealed to the Board of Appeals pursuant to Charter Section 4.106, a surcharge of  
24 ~~\$36~~ for such permits issued by the Police Department and a surcharge of ~~\$24.00~~ for such  
25 permits issued by the Entertainment Commission;

1 (f) For permits issued pursuant to Health Code Section 19H.4 that may be  
2 appealed to the Board of Appeals pursuant to Charter Section 4.106, and annual permit fees  
3 pursuant to Health Code Section 19H.7 and Business and Tax Regulations Code Section  
4 249.16, a surcharge of \$4~~5~~3.

5  
6 Section 3. The Planning Department Fee Schedule, referenced in Section 4 of  
7 Ordinance No. 149-16, shall be modified to reflect the Board of Appeals surcharge of \$37  
8 established in Administrative Code Section 10G.1(a).

9  
10 Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after  
11 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the  
12 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board  
13 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

14  
15 Section 5. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors  
16 intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,  
17 numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal  
18 Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment  
19 additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under  
20 the official title of the ordinance.

## LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Board of Appeals Surcharges on Permit Fees]

**Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to adjust existing surcharges on permit fees, license fees, permit review fees, and permit and license renewal fees for permits and licenses issued by the Planning Department, Department of Building Inspection, Department of Public Works, Department of Public Health, Police Department, and the Entertainment Commission that may be appealed to the Board of Appeals; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.**

### Existing Law

Existing law imposes a surcharge on permit, license, and permit review fees and permit and license renewal fees for permits and licenses issued or approved by various City authorities based on each department's allocable share of Board of Appeals costs. The surcharges currently reflected in the Administrative Code have been adjusted annually to reflect changes in the consumer price index pursuant to Section 10G.2 of the Administrative Code. The current surcharges as adjusted for changes in the consumer price index since the last ordinance that updated the surcharges are as follows: Planning Department, \$22.50; Department of Building Inspection, \$22.50; Department of Public Works, \$9.00; Police Department, \$6.00; Entertainment Commission, \$4.00; Department of Public Health, \$50.50.

### Amendments to Current Law

These amendments would adjust the surcharge on permit, license, permit review and renewal fees imposed in connection with permits and licenses issued, approved or renewed by the designated City departments, based on each department's history of appeals filed with the Board of Appeals and consistent with the fiscal year 2022-2023 budget for the Board of Appeals. These amendments also update references for surcharges applicable to the Planning Department, Department of Building Inspection, Department of Public Works, Police Department, Entertainment Commission, and the Department of Public Health. The proposed ordinance will adjust the surcharges as follows: Planning Department, \$37.00; Department of Building Inspection, \$37.00; Department of Public Works, \$9.00; Police Department, \$3.00, Entertainment Commission, \$2.00; Department of Public Health, \$45.00.

Background Information

This legislation is designed to reduce the dependency of the Board of Appeals on funding from the City's General Fund by adjusting surcharges in an equitable manner to generate sufficient revenue, together with Board of Appeals filing fees, to meet the operating expenses, including employee wage rates and fringe benefits, attributable to administering the administrative appeals process at the Board of Appeals.

This memorandum outlines items included in the SFMTA FY 2022-23 & FY 2023-24 Mayor's Proposed Budget over which the Board of Supervisors has line-item approval authority.

Pursuant to Charter Article 8A.106, the Board of Supervisors (Board) may only approve or reject the entire MTA budget and has no discretion to modify or reject specific expenditures contained therein. The Board may allow the MTA's budget to take effect without any action on its part, or it may reject the MTA's budget by a seven-elevenths' vote. However, additional General Fund support to the MTA over the base amount stipulated in the Charter is subject to normal budgetary review and amendment under the general financial provisions of the Charter.

The FY 2022-23 & FY 2023-24 Mayor's Proposed Budget for the MTA appropriates the following General Fund and other revenue sources as below. Approval of expenditures related to these sources follows the general provisions of the Charter, under which the Board may modify proposed expenses at the level of appropriation.

1. Mission Bay Transportation Improvement Fund transfers from the General Fund of \$4,792,000 in FY 2022-23 and \$4,968,000 in FY 2023-24.
2. Development impact fees for various capital projects as proposed by the Interagency Plan Implementation Committee (IPIC) of \$1,284,200 in FY 2022-23 and \$2,662,504 in FY 2023-24.
3. Transit Sustainability Fees for various transit related capital projects of \$16,837,861 in FY 2022-23 and \$16,699,000 in FY 2023-24.

Dear Madam Clerk,

I herein present exceptions to the May 1 Departments' Annual Salary Ordinance (ASO) and Annual Appropriations Ordinance (AAO) for consideration by the Budget and Finance Committee of the Board of Supervisors. The City's standard practice is to budget new positions beginning in pay period 7, at 0.79 FTE and to hold funding for new initiatives until the budget is signed on August 1. Where there is justification for expedited hiring and spending, however, the Board may authorize exceptions to the Interim ASO and AAO, which allow new positions to be filled and expenditures related to new initiatives to begin in the first quarter of the fiscal year, prior to final adoption of the budget.

Exceptions are being requested for the following positions and non-personnel expenditures:

***Non-General Fund Positions (30.0 FTE)***

- **San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA)**  
9102 Transit Car Cleaners (30.0 FTE). These positions were added as temporary positions midyear in order to boost pandemic response efforts. The SFMTA anticipates that 30 of the additional Transit Car Cleaners will continue on a long-term basis. An interim exception for these positions will ensure that these car cleaners can continue their work uninterrupted and public health can be prioritized.

Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any questions regarding the requested interim exceptions to the Annual Salary Ordinance and Annual Appropriations Ordinance.
