14 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

16 Section 1. Articles 1, 15, 15.1, and 15.2 of the Police Code are hereby amended by
 17 revising Sections 2.27, 1025, 1036.8, 1037.2, 1060.1.1, and 1070.1-1, to read as follows:

19 **SEC. 2.27. SCHEDULE OF LICENSE FEES FOR PERMITS ISSUED BY THE POLICE**
 20 **DEPARTMENT OR ENTERTAINMENT COMMISSION.**

21 The following license fees are payable to the Tax Collector for permits issued by the Police
 22 Department or Entertainment Commission and, when applicable, for their renewal, except as
 23 provided in Section 1060.1.1 of the Police Code, as may be amended from time to time:

24 Note: All license fees are at an annual rate unless otherwise indicated.

10 **SEC. 1025. LICENSE FEES.**

11 (a) Every person granted a dance hall permit by the Entertainment Commission shall
 12 pay to the Tax Collector an annual license fee on or before March 31, in accordance with the
 13 provisions of Section 76.1 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code.

14 (b) The amount of the license fee for the 2024-2025 fiscal year shall be as set forth in Section
 15 2.27 of this Code, and such amount shall be adjusted for inflation commencing with the 2025-2026
 16 fiscal year, and annually thereafter, in accordance with Section 2.31 of this Code.

17 (c) The provisions of ~~this~~ Section 1022-1026 shall not apply to any dance hall used
 18 exclusively for any of the following dances:

19 (1~~a~~) Dances of a bona fide social character, to which admission is limited strictly on
 20 invitation of the person acting as host, and for which no fee, either by way of admission or in
 21 any other manner, is charged.

22 (2~~b~~) Dances given by any public agency or by any educational, recreational, or
 23 social agency, or by any bona fide fraternal, charitable, or religious or benevolent or any other
 24 nonprofit organization having a regular membership association primarily for mutual social,
 25

1 mental, political, and civic welfare, to which admission is limited to members and guests, and
2 revenue accruing therefrom to be used exclusively for the benevolent purposes of said
3 organization.

4 (3e) Dances conducted by any dancing academy or dancing class in which instruction
5 in dancing is given for hire.

6
7 **SEC. 1036.8. LICENSE FEES.**

8 (a) Every holder of a mechanical amusement device permit shall pay the Tax Collector for
9 each Arcade or Ancillary Use that the permit authorizes, an annual license fee, on or before
10 March 31, in accordance with the provisions of Section 76.1 of the Business and Tax
11 Regulations Code.

12 (b) The amount of the license fee for the 2024-2025 fiscal year shall be as set forth in Section 2.27 of
13 this Code, and such amount shall be adjusted for inflation commencing with the 2025-2026 fiscal year,
14 and annually thereafter, in accordance with Section 2.31 of this Code.

15
16 **SEC. 1037.2. LICENSE FEE.**

17 (a) Every person, firm, or corporation owning, leasing, or maintaining any billiard table, pool
18 table, or combination table, for the use of patrons of any place of business, shall pay an
19 annual license fee to the Tax Collector for the first such table and additional license fee for
20 each additional such table in any such place of business on or before March 31, in
21 accordance with the provisions of Section 76.1 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code.
22 The permit shall be nontransferable.

23 (b) The amount of the license fee for the 2024-2025 fiscal year shall be as set forth in Section 2.27 of
24 this Code, and such amount shall be adjusted for inflation commencing with the 2025-2026 fiscal year,
25 and annually thereafter, in accordance with Section 2.31 of this Code.

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SEC. 1060.1.1. LICENSE FEES.

(a) Except as otherwise provided in this Section 1060.1.1, every person granted a Place of Entertainment Permit, Limited Live Performance Permit, or Fixed Place Outdoor Amplified Sound Permit by the Entertainment Commission shall pay to the Tax Collector an annual license fee on or before March 31, in accordance with the provisions of Section 76.1 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code.

(b) The amount of the license fee for the ~~2005-2006~~2024-2025 fiscal year shall be as set forth in Section 2.27 of this Code, and such amount shall be adjusted for inflation commencing with the ~~2006-2007~~2025-2026 fiscal year, and annually thereafter, in accordance with Section 2.31 of this Code.

* * * *

SEC. 1070.1-1. LICENSE FEES.

(a) Every person granted an Extended Hours Premises Permit by the Entertainment Commission under this Article 15.2 shall pay to the Tax Collector an annual license fee on or before March 31, in accordance with the provisions of Section 76.1 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code.

(b) The amount of the license fee for the ~~2005-2006~~2024-2025 fiscal year shall be as set forth in Section 2.27 of this Code, and such amount shall be adjusted for inflation commencing with the ~~2006-2007~~2025-2026 fiscal year, and annually thereafter, in accordance with Section 2.31 of this Code.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the

1 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
2 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

4 Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
5 intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
6 numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
7 Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
8 additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
9 the official title of the ordinance.

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Police Code - Entertainment License Fee Updates]

Ordinance amending the Police Code to adjust to current amounts the license fees for Billiard Parlor, Dance Hall Keeper, Extended Hours Premises, Fixed Place Outdoor Amplified Sound, Limited Live Performance, Mechanical Amusement Device, and Place of Entertainment permits.

Existing Law

The Police Code currently sets the following fees:

- Billiard Parlor license fee: \$159
- Dance Hall Keeper license fee: \$448
- Extended Hours Premises license fee: \$531
- Fixed Place Outdoor Amplified Sound license fee: \$274
- Limited Live Performance license fee: \$157
- Mechanical Amusement Device license fee: \$301
- Place of Entertainment license fee: \$511

Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance would amend the Police Code to increase the fees to the following amounts in FY24-25, based on updated cost recovery calculations:

- Billiard Parlor license fee: \$268
- Dance Hall Keeper license fee: \$756
- Extended Hours Premises license fee: \$896
- Fixed Place Outdoor Amplified Sound license fee: \$345
- Limited Live Performance license fee: \$265
- Mechanical Amusement Device license fee: \$508
- Place of Entertainment license fee: \$863

Background Information

The Police Code currently lists license fees for the above-listed permits at FY 2005-2006 levels. The amounts actually being charged in FY 2023-2024, based on annual inflation adjustments since FY 2005-2006, are as follows:

- Billiard Parlor license fee: \$225
- Dance Hall Keeper license fee: \$634

- Extended Hours Premises license fee: \$752
- Fixed Place Outdoor Amplified Sound license fee: \$289
- Limited Live Performance license fee: \$222
- Mechanical Amusement Device license fee: \$426
- Place of Entertainment license fee: \$724

This ordinance would increase the license fee amounts to align with current cost recovery calculations.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the Successor Agency Commission, commonly known as the Commission on Community Investment and Infrastructure ("Commission"), will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, July 16, 2024 at 1:00 p.m., in City Hall, Room 416, located at 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, San Francisco, CA to consider proposed amendments ("Plan Amendments") to Phase 2 of the Hunters Point Shipyard Redevelopment Plan ("HPS Plan") and Zone 1 of the Bayview Hunters Point Redevelopment Plan ("BVHP Plan") (collectively, the "Redevelopment Plans") and to consider all evidence and testimony for or against the approval of the Plan Amendments.

The Plan Amendments are consistent with proposed changes in the Candlestick Point-Hunters Point Shipyard Phase 2 project agreements ("Project Agreements"), which the Commission, Oversight Board of the City and County of San Francisco, and California Department of Finance will separately consider under the authority of Section 14 of Senate Bill 143 (2023) (codified at Section 34177.7 (j) of the California Health and Safety Code). The Plan Amendments would authorize, subject to approval of the Project Agreements, the following: 1) transfer of approximately 2,050,000 square feet of commercial uses from the Hunters Point Shipyard Project Area ("HPS Project Area") to commercially-zoned areas of the HPS Project Area; 2) clarify that certain commercial uses currently authorized within the HPS Project Area are also allowed within the BVHP Project Area; 3) extend the limitations relating to time for establishing loans, advances, and indebtedness, the effectiveness of the Redevelopment Plans, and the time to repay indebtedness and receive property taxes, in connection with the Candlestick Point-Hunters Point Shipyard Phase 2 project; 4) authorize property tax increment revenues from Phase 2 of the HPS Project Area and Zone 1 of the BVHP Project Area to be combined to fund costs under the Project Agreements; and 5) adjust the limit on the amount of bonded indebtedness that can be outstanding at one time by establishing a single limit on the amount of bonded indebtedness applicable to Zone 1 of the BVHP Plan and Phase 2 of the HPS Plan.

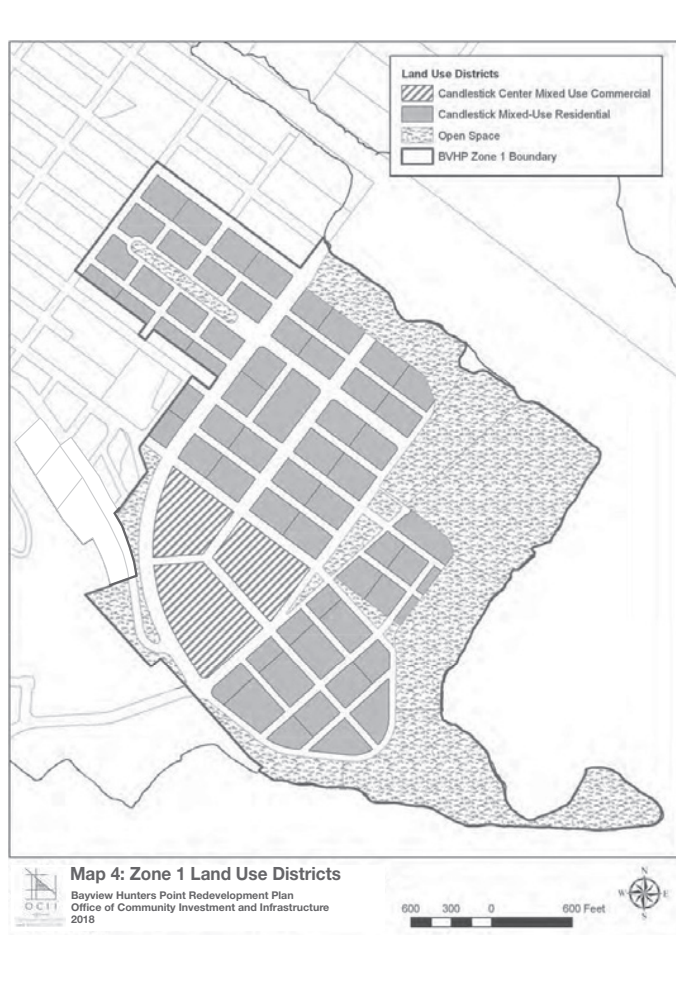
The legal descriptions of the boundaries for the project areas in the Redevelopment Plans were recorded as follows. Phase 2 of the HPS Plan (Map 2 and Attachment A) was recorded with the San Francisco Office of the Assessor-Recorder on October 23, 2016 as Document No. 2016-1885940-00. Zone 1 of the BVHP Plan (Project Area B as described in Attachment B and Map 4) was recorded with the San Francisco Office of the Assessor-Recorder on October 23, 2018 as Document No. 2018-1868939-00.

Following the close of the public hearing, the Commission will consider approval of the Plan Amendments. If the Commission approves the Plan Amendments, the Planning Commission will consider the General Plan referral and the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco will consider adoption of the proposed amendments to the Redevelopment Plans together with OCII's Report to the Board of Supervisors on the Redevelopment Plan amendments.
