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7 WHEREAS, California has long recognized that access to preventive and
8 comprehensive health care is a fundamental human right and critical to public health,
9 regardless of immigration status; and

10 WHEREAS, The Governor's May Revision of the 2025-2026 State Budget proposes to:
11 1) Freeze new Medi-Cal enrollment for undocumented adults beginning in 2026; 2) Impose a
12 \$100 monthly premium on undocumented adults who retain coverage; and 3) Eliminate
13 essential benefits such as long-term care and full dental coverage; and

14 WHEREAS, These proposed rollbacks target some of the most vulnerable Californians
15 and undermine hard-won progress toward equity and universal coverage in our state; and

16 WHEREAS, The projected \$12 billion state deficit will not be meaningfully addressed
17 by these cuts, which instead shift costs to counties, emergency rooms, and local safety-net
18 systems, placing additional burdens on public health infrastructure; and

19 WHEREAS, San Francisco has led the way in expanding access to care for all
20 residents, including through programs like Healthy San Francisco, and has a longstanding
21 commitment to immigrant health equity; and

22 WHEREAS, Denying preventive and comprehensive care to undocumented
23 Californians is both unjust and fiscally irresponsible, and risks reversing the public health
24 gains San Francisco and the state have worked hard to achieve; now, therefore, be it
