1	[Supporting House of Representatives Bill - Michelle Alyssa Go Act]
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3	Resolution supporting the United States House of Representative Bill, the
4	"Michelle Alyssa Go Act," introduced by Congressman Dan Goldman,
5	Congresswoman Nicole Malliotakis, Congressman Tony Cárdenas, and
6	Congressman Gus M. Bilirakis, which increases the cap of Medicaid-eligible
7	inpatient psychiatric beds a care facility can have from 16 to 36.
8	
9	WHEREAS, The mental health crisis in America has become increasingly dire,
10	exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic, and there is a critical need for comprehensive
11	and equitable mental health care; and
12	WHEREAS, The current federal prohibition on Medicaid coverage for long-term
13	stays in institutions with more than 16 beds (Institutions for Mental Diseases, or IMD)
14	severely limits access to necessary inpatient psychiatric care for individuals aged 21 to
15	64; and
16	WHEREAS, The tragic death of Michelle Alyssa Go highlights the significant
17	gaps in mental health infrastructure, as her attacker, Martial Simon, who was
18	experiencing homelessness and diagnosed with schizophrenia, did not receive the long
19	term psychiatric care he needed; and
20	WHEREAS, This act proposes to increase the cap of Medicaid-eligible inpatient
21	psychiatric beds a care facility can have from 16 to 36; and
22	WHEREAS, In doing so, this measure more than doubles the Medicaid-eligible
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1	psychiatric bed capacity of a patient care facility, thereby enabling increased availability
2	of beds for individuals seeking treatment for mental health and substance use disorders
3	across the nation; and
4	WHEREAS, The bill is named in honor of Michelle Go, a 40-year-old woman who
5	was tragically pushed in front of an oncoming R train in Times Square by a
6	schizophrenic homeless man with a long history of psychiatric issues that were never
7	appropriately addressed; and
8	WHEREAS, This bipartisan legislation mandates that mental health facilities
9	receiving federal Medicaid funding adhere to nationally recognized, evidence-based
10	standards for mental health and substance use disorder programs, ensuring high-quality
11	care; and
12	WHEREAS, The bill has garnered widespread support from various
13	organizations, including the Treatment Advocacy Center, National Alliance on Mental
14	Illness, National Association of State Mental Health Program Directors, National
15	Association of Counties, National Association for Behavioral Healthcare, Stand with
16	Asian Americans, Asian Americans Rise, National Association of County Behavioral
17	Health and Developmental Disability Directors, New York Junior League, and
18	Schizophrenia Policy Action Network; and
19	WHEREAS, The bill honors the memory of Michelle Alyssa Go and aims to
20	prevent future tragedies by addressing systemic flaws in the mental health care system,
21	providing necessary resources for life-saving crisis care, and improving public safety;
22	and
23	WHEREAS, While those suffering from mental illness are far more likely to be
24	victims of violence than perpetrators, this tragedy proved a stark reminder of the glaring

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1	gaps in our mental health infrastructure and underscores the need to help them get the
2	necessary and life-saving care they need; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, This legislation aligns with ongoing efforts to support individuals with
5	serious mental illnesses (SMI) and improve mental health services across the country,
6	including the 'Strengthening Medicaid for Serious Mental Illness Act' and the 'Helping
7	Kids Cope Act' introduced and supported by Congressman Dan Goldman; now,
8	therefore, be it
9	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
10	Francisco hereby endorses the Michelle Alyssa Go Act, recognizing its significance in
11	expanding access to mental health care by increasing the number of Medicaid-eligible
12	inpatient psychiatric beds, addressing systemic flaws in the mental health care system,
13	and ensuring high-quality, evidence-based treatment for individuals in need; and, be it
14	FURTHER RESOLVED, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby directs
15	the Clerk of the Board to transmit copies of this Resolution to the offices of Speaker
16	Emerita Pelosi, Congressman Kevin Mullin, Senator Alex Padilla, Senator Laphonza
17	Butler, and Congressman Dan Goldman, as a demonstration of the Board's support for
18	the "Michelle Alyssa Go Act" and its commitment to improving mental health care
19	access and ensuring high-quality treatment for all individuals in need.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Michelle Alyssa Go

1	SEC. 2. REVISING THE DEFINITION OF INSTITUTION FOR
2	MENTAL DISEASES UNDER THE MEDICAID
3	PROGRAM TO EXCLUDE FROM SUCH DEFINI-

7	Section 1905(i) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
8	1396d(i)) is amended to read as follows:
9	"(i) Institution for Mental Diseases.—The
10	term 'institution for mental diseases' means a hospital,
11	nursing facility, or other institution that is primarily en-
12	gaged in providing diagnosis, treatment, or care of persons
13	with mental diseases, including medical attention, nursing
14	care, and related services, unless such hospital, facility,
15	or other institution—
16	"(1) has 36 beds or less; and
17	"(2) meets nationally recognized, evidence-
18	based standards for mental health programs (and, in
