7	WHEREAS, Reliable, high-speed internet is no longer a luxury, rather it is a necessity		
8	for full participation in work, school, healthcare, and daily life; and

10	WHEREAS, The COVID-19 pandemic underscored the critical importance of equitable		
11	digital access, especially for low-income communities, students, elders, and working families		
12	living in multi-unit housing; and		
13	WHEREAS, Current Federal Communications Commission (FCC) rules prohibit		
14	landlords from entering exclusive agreements with a single internet service provider (ISP), but		
	those federal protections are not fully enshrined in California state law like with the example of		
15	bulk deals which eliminate tenant right to choose in practice; and		
16	WHEREAS, Assembly Bill No. 1414 (AB 1414), authored by Assemblymember		
17	Rhodesia Ransom, codifies this essential protection at the state level by ensuring that tenants		
18	are not forced to subscribe to a landlord-mandated ISP, which closes a legal gap and		
19	reinforcing tenants' rights to choose the provider that best meets their needs and budget; and		
20	WHEREAS, AB 1414 further empowers renters by allowing them to deduct the cost of		
21	any forced ISP subscription from their rent, should a landlord violate this provision; and		
22	WHEREAS, AB 1414 promotes fairness, consumer choice, and digital equity while		
23	aligning with existing FCC guidance and earning broad support from tenant advocates,		
24	including the Consumer Federation of California; and

1	WHEREAS, On April 21, 2025, AB 1414 passed in the State Assembly on the third
2	reading with bi-partisan support and is currently in the State Senate; now, therefore, be it
3	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby supports California
4	Assembly Bill No. 1414, which protects renters' right to choose their own internet service
5	provider, prevents landlords from forcing tenants into costly or substandard internet plans, and

ASSEMBLY BILL

No. 1414

Introduced by Assembly Member Ransom

February 21, 2025

An act to amend Section 51226 of the Education Code, relating to pupil instruction. An act to add Section 1942.8 to the Civil Code, relating to tenancy.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1414, as amended, Ransom. Career technical education. Landlord-tenant: internet service provider subscriptions.

Existing law governs the obligations of tenants and landlords. Existing law authorizes a tenant to deduct the payment made to a public utility or publicly owned utility or a district from the rent, as specified.

This bill would prohibit a landlord from requiring a tenant to subscribe to a specific internet service provider. If the landlord violates that provision, the bill would authorize the tenant to deduct the cost of the subscription from the rent.

Existing law requires the Superintendent of Public Instruction to coordinate the development, on a cyclical basis, of model curriculum standards for, among other courses of study, a career technical education course of study. Existing law requires the Superintendent, to the extent applicable, to incorporate the integration of career technical and academic education into the development of those curriculum standards, as provided.

This bill would make various nonsubstantive changes to this provision. Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: no. State-mandated local program: no.

AB 1414 — 2 —

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The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1942.8 is added to the Civil Code, to read: 2 1942.8. (a) A landlord of a dwelling shall not require a tenant 3 to subscribe to a specific internet service provider.

- (b) If the landlord violates subdivision (a), the tenant may deduct the cost of the subscription to the internet service provider from the rent.
- (c) For the purposes of this section, "internet service provider" has the same meaning as defined in Section 3100.

SECTION 1. Section 51226 of the Education Code is amended to read:

51226. (a) The Superintendent shall coordinate the development, on a cyclical basis, of model curriculum standards for the course of study required by Section 51225.3 and for a career technical education course of study necessary to assist school districts with complying with subdivision (b) of Section 51228. The Superintendent shall set forth these standards in terms of a wide range of specific competencies, including higher level skills, in each academic subject area. The Superintendent shall review currently available textbooks in conjunction with the curriculum standards. The Superintendent shall seek the advice of classroom teachers, school administrators, parents, postsecondary educators, and representatives of business and industry in developing these eurriculum standards. The Superintendent shall recommend policies to the state board for its consideration and adoption. However, neither the Superintendent nor the state board shall adopt rules or regulations for course content or methods of instruction.

(b) The Superintendent shall, to the extent applicable, incorporate the integration of career technical and academic education into the development of curriculum standards for career technical education courses.
