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[Accept and Expend Grant - Zellerbach Family Foundation - \$37,000]

Resolution authorizing the Adult Probation Department to retroactively accept and expend a grant of consulting services from the Zellerbach Family Foundation through an award to Community Works West in the amount of \$37,000 for developing a gender-responsive approach to serving women involved in San Francisco's criminal justice system.

WHEREAS, The Zellerbach Family Foundation awarded a grant of consulting services to the Adult Probation Department on December 7, 2011 on the development of a gender-responsive approach to serving women involved in San Francisco's criminal justice system based on a grant proposal submitted by Adult Probation Department; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a grant agreement entered into by Zellerbach Family Foundation, Adult Probation Department, and Community Works West; Zellerbach Family Foundation transmitted \$37,000 in grant funding to Community Works West to contract with consultants to provide the consulting services as the fiscal sponsor for this project; and

WHEREAS, Community Works West has contracted with consultants Barbara Bloom, Ph.D. and Barbara Owen, Ph.D., to develop a system of case management and other services which are appropriate to the needs of women involved in San Francisco's criminal justice system, and will also perform report writing functions that are a condition of the grant funding; and

WHEREAS, Addressing women's pathways to offending and structuring a safe and appropriate rehabilitative environment are critical to reducing recidivism and improving post-release outcomes for women offenders; and

WHEREAS, To make a significant impact on San Francisco's female offenders, the Adult Probation Department should develop innovative and focused interventions that

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address the differences between men and women and target the specific risks and needs of criminal justice-involved women; and

WHEREAS, The City would benefit from the development of gender-responsive services in order to improve local outcomes for criminal justice-involved women; and

WHEREAS, The grant does not require an ASO amendment; and

WHEREAS, The grant does not include any funding for indirect costs of the City in the grant budget, and no funding will be received by City in acceptance of this grant of services and; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Adult Probation Department is hereby authorized to retroactively accept a grant of services, through Community Works West as a fiscal sponsor for grant funds, in the amount of \$37,000 from the Zellerbach Family Foundation for the purpose of developing a gender-responsive approach to serving women involved in San Francisco's criminal justice system; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of an indirect cost allocation for the City and County of San Francisco in the grant budget.

Purpose of grant (i.e., succinctly what are you trying to accomplish) IV.

Consultants Barbara Bloom, PhD and Barbara Owen, PhD will develop a Blueprint for Women's Services in San Francisco in partnership with the Gender Responsive/Women's Services Working Group, under the direction of Chief Adult Probation Officer Wendy Still and in collaboration with the San Francisco Sheriff's Department and other partners. The consultants will provide expertise to the Working Group and develop a set of departmental policy recommendations based on gender-responsive practice for women under traditional probation supervision, those to be released from the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) for post-release supervision and those who will be sentenced directly to San Francisco community supervision and jail. With an emphasis on appropriate alternatives to incarceration and on gender-responsive case management strategies for women (including transgender women and transgender people in general), this Plan will outline recommendations for a continuum of care for criminal justice-involved women that will intervene in women's pathways to offending. This continuum—delivered through case management services provided by the Probation Department—will address the common pathways to offending, e.g., substance abuse, trauma treatment, domestic violence, parental reunification, education and vocational training and other material supports (including housing, transportation and other identified needs) through womencentered case management. The Plan will suggest how outcome and other tracking measures can be collected as part of documenting the process and measuring success. Additionally, the plan and other knowledge developed through this project will be shared with the Reentry Council of San Francisco (http://sfreentry.com) and the Community Corrections Partnership (http://www.sfgov3.org/index.aspx? page=2912), which will allow for even broader dissemination and adoption.

V. Activities (i.e., what are you going to do to accomplish your goal(s))

This work will use a collaborative system planning process as developed by the National Institute of Corrections (NIC). This process has eight steps:

focused settings face fewer obstacles to visitation and maintaining family connections. Community-based settings can emphasize treatment, service provision, and community reentry. Addressing the risk and needs of the female offender requires an appropriate assessment. There are multiple instruments that provide assessments, but San Francisco should consider using gender-responsive risk and needs assessment instruments that incorporate women's pathways and recommend gender-appropriate case management, placements, treatment and supervision. In addition, several research studies have found that gender-responsive approaches are more effective in reducing recidivism and improving outcomes for female offenders when implemented according to these principles.

Therefore, to make a significant impact on San Francisco's female offenders, the Adult Probation Department must develop innovative and focused interventions that address these differences and target the specific risks and needs of criminal justice-involved women.

VII. Leadership (i.e., brief info. about qualifications of project leadership and key players)

Barbara E. Bloom, Ph.D., M.S.W.: Barbara E. Bloom, Ph.D. is a Professor and Chair of the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice Studies at Sonoma State University. She is the Co-Director (with Dr. Stephanie Covington) of the Center for Gender and Justice. Her research and policy interests include women and girls under criminal justice supervision and gender-responsive interventions and services. Dr. Bloom has directed various research projects focused on gender-responsive services for women and girls in criminal justice settings. Dr. Bloom has served on a number of commissions including the California Blue Ribbon Commission on Inmate Population Management, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Expert Panel on Adult Offender and Recidivism Reduction Programming, and the Gender Responsive Strategies Commission. Dr. Bloom is a past President of the Western Society of Criminology (WSC) and a recipient of the 2003 WSC Fellow Award for important contributions to the field of criminology. She is a recipient (along with Dr. Barbara Owen and Dr. Stephanie Covington) of the American Probation and Parole Association 2003 University of Cincinnati Award for the publication, Gender Responsive Strategies: Research Rractice and Guiding Principles for Women Offenders. She was also honored (along with Barbara Owen) by the American Society of Criminology Division on Women and Crime with the 2006 Saltzman Award for Contributions to Practice which recognizes a criminologist whose professional accomplishments have increased the quality of justice and the level of safety for women. The National Council on Crime & Delinquency chose Dr. Bloom to receive the Donald Cressey Award for 2007. This award recognizes individuals who have made outstanding academic contributions to criminology, promoting programs that are fair, humane, effective, and economically sound.

Barbara Owen, Ph.D.: Barbara Owen is a nationally-known expert in the areas of girls, women and crime, gender issues in the criminal justice system, women's prison culture, with extensive experience in conducting, ethnographies, large-scale surveys, policy studies and program evaluation. A Professor of Criminology at California State University, Fresno, she received her Ph.D. in Sociology from UC Berkeley in 1984. Prior to returning to academia, Dr. Owen was a Senior Researcher with the Federal Bureau of Prisons. In 2002, she received the Provost Award for Excellence in Research from her University and in 2003 was named University Scholar and a Fellow of the Western Society of Criminology. In 2005, she was nominated as CSU Fresno's Outstanding Undergraduate Professor in the US Professor of the Year national competition. She has provided training for the National Institute of Corrections in such areas as operational practices for women offenders, agency planning for female offenders, staff sexual

1. Grant Purpose and Expected Outcomes

Community Works will contract with consultants Barbara Bloom, PhD and Barbara Owen, PhD to develop a Blueprint for Women's Services in San Francisco, under the direction of Chief Adult Probation Officer Wendy Still, and in partnership with the Gender Responsive/Women's Services Working Group, the San Francisco Sheriff's Department and other community partners. Specifically, they will complete the following tasks:

- Review existing data, services and programs related to women offenders in San Francisco County (including jail, community corrections and community service).
- Identify gaps in services that interfere with rehabilitation and successful completion of community supervision.

9. Modification and Termination

This is the only agreement among the parties relating to the subject matter hereto, and the terms of this Agreement may be revised or modified only in writing signed by all parties. If the Grantee fails to meet any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the Foundation may withdraw its award and terminate this Agreement and shall thereupon have no further obligation to disburse to Grantee any remaining unpaid grant funds, and may further require repayment of any grant funds which were not used in accordance with the terms of the Agreement, including the grant purpose set forth in this Agreement. In addition, the Foundation shall have all other rights available at law or in equity against the Grantee arising out of breach of this Agreement.
