Resolution urging the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission to include social justice components in its Project Labor Agreement for the Hetch Hetchy Water System Capital Improvement Program.

WHEREAS, Proposition A was approved by San Francisco voters in November 2002; and WHEREAS, Approval of Proposition A authorizes not only San Francisco to spend \$1.6 billion in revenue bonds, but also means that the Hetch Hetchy system's regional water users will authorize the spending of an additional \$2 billion for their share of the system repairs; and, WHEREAS, A public works project of the magnitude of the repair and upgrading of the Hetch Hetchy Water System will serve as a much needed economic stimulus to the local and regional economies; and,

WHEREAS, Based on the construction value of the Capital Improvement Program, hundreds of new jobs will be created for the construction trades; and,

WHEREAS, Rebuilding the system is a thirteen year program that will generate new business opportunities for local vendors and suppliers; and,

WHEREAS, Project Labor Agreements have been used successfully on public projects to help ensure that programs are completed on-time and on-budget; and WHEREAS, Project Labor Agreements can be designed to address a wide-range of local Supervisor Maxwell BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

WHEREAS, There are communities in San Francisco that have been historically economically
disadvantaged and continue to be so disadvantaged; and,
WHEREAS, Project Labor Agreements can be successfully crafted to benefit specific
communities, in particular enrolling minorities and women in job training programs, including
pre-apprenticeship programs; and,
WHEREAS, These job training programs are a first step in the creation of a lifetime career in
the construction industry that carries with it the opportunity for maintaining a family-wage
income; now, therefore, be it
RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the San Francisco Public
Utilities Commission to include social justice components in its Project Labor Agreement for
the Hetch Hetchy Water System Capital Improvement Program; and, be it
FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Project Labor Agreement should be crafted to benefit San
Francisco communities that have been and continue to be economically disadvantaged; and,
be it
FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Project Labor Agreement should include the ability for
those from disadvantaged populations to be enrolled in pre-apprenticeship programs to
contribute to their ability to maintain life-long employment in the construction industry and
accompanying access to family-wage jobs, and, be it
FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall forward a copy of
this resolution to the members of the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission and the
General Manager of the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission.
