Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. The original version of this ordinance added new Administrative Code
Chapter 119, requiring the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing to: 1)
establish a Safe Overnight Parking Pilot Program to provide eligible vehicularly homeless
persons a place to park and sleep in their vehicles overnight, case management, and other
services, and 2) collaborate with the Municipal Transportation Agency to develop an OnStreet Parking Citation and Tow- and-Storage-Fee Abatement Program to provide eligible
vehicularly homeless persons with waivers of parking fines and fees. The Board added
Chapter 119 in Ordinance No. 082-19, and duplicated the file. Because Chapter 119 has
already been enacted, it has been removed from this duplicate ordinance, except for
subsection (d) of Section 119.5, which is amended herein.

Section 2. Chapter 119 of the Administrative Code is amended by revising Section 119.5 to read as follows:

SEC 119.5. ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLEMENTATION.

* * *

(d) The Controller HSH shall track and evaluate the Overnight Safe Overnight Parking Pilot Program's outcomes. Not more than six months after the effective date of Chapter 119, and every six months thereafter, HSH shall report key information to the Board of Supervisors, including but not limited to the number of Program Participants served by the Vehicle

Navigation Triage Center and Safe Parking Lot(s); Program Participants' lengths of stay; and Program Participants' destinations upon exit (e.g., permanent housing, transitional housing).

The Controller shall summarize these outcomes in a report to be submitted to the Board of Supervisors no later than six months after the effective date of this Chapter 119, and every six months thereafter, until such time as the Pilot Program is no longer in operation. Within one

year of the effective date of this Chapter 119, HSH and the Controller shall jointly, in consultation with the Director of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, shall-submit to the Board of Supervisors a report that summarizes these statistics and describes any lessons learned from the operation of the Overnight Safe Overnight Parking Pilot Program, and makes recommendations as to how and whether the Program should be continued, along with a proposed resolution to accept the report.

Section 3. Article 1.1 of the Police Code shall be amended by revising Section 97.1 to read as follows:

SEC. 97.1. EXCEPTIONS.

(a) The General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department may by written permit allow the use or occupancy of any house car, camper or trailer coach on or in any property under the jurisdiction of the Recreation and Park Commission when he finds that such use is necessary for the operation and protection of City property and livestock.

The permission granted by the General Manager may be revoked upon five days written notice to the permittee.

(b) Persons who have been given a license by the City to park and sleep in their vehicle at a Safe Overnight Parking Lot or a Vehicle Navigation Triage Center in accordance with Administrative Code Chapter 119 shall not be subject to the penalties set forth in Section 98 of this Article 1.1 while using or occupying their vehicle for human habitation, provided that such use or occupancy occurs on the premises of the Safe Overnight Parking Lot or Vehicle Navigation Triage Center to which they have been given a license.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

REVISED LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

(Amended in Committee, 5/20/2019)

[Administrative, Police Codes - Programs for the Vehicular Homeless and Use of Vehicles for Human Habitation]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to revise the requirement for the Controller to submit records concerning the Safe Overnight Parking Pilot Program, and amending the Police Code to create an exception for participants in the Safe Overnight Parking Pilot Program to the prohibition on using a vehicle for human habitation.

Existing Law

Section 119.5 of the Administrative Code, which was established through enactment of Ordinance No. 082-19, requires the Controller to track and evaluate key outcomes of the Safe Overnight Parking Pilot Program, and summarize such outcomes in a report to be submitted to the Board of Supervisors no later than six months after the effective date of Chapter 119, and every six months thereafter.

Currently, Article 1.1 of the Police Code prohibits any person from using a motor vehicle for human habitation on any street, park, beach, square, avenue, alley or public way, within a residential neighborhood of the City and County of San Francisco ("City") between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. Article 1.1 also prohibits any person from using a house car, camper or trailer coach for human habitation on any street, park, beach, square, avenue, alley or public way, in any neighborhood within the City between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. Violation of Article 1.1 is punishable as a misdemeanor.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would require the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, instead of the Controller, to track and evaluate the outcomes of the Safe Overnight Parking Pilot Program, and to report on such outcomes to the Board of Supervisors every six months. The proposed ordinance would also require HSH, within one year of the effective date of Chapter 119, to jointly submit with the Controller a report to the Board of Supervisors that summarizes key statistics and makes recommendations as to how and whether the Program should be continued.

The proposed ordinance would create an exception to the prohibition on using a motor vehicle, house car, camper, or trailer for human habitation for persons who have been given a license by the City to park and sleep in their vehicle at a Safe Overnight Parking Lot or a Vehicle Navigation Triage Center in accordance with Administrative Code Chapter 119.

Background Information

The original version of this ordinance (No. 082-19) added new Administrative Code Chapter 119, requiring the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing to: 1) establish a Safe Overnight Parking Pilot Program to provide eligible vehicularly homeless persons a place to park and sleep in their vehicles overnight, case management, and other services, and 2) collaborate with the Municipal Transportation Agency to develop an On-Street Parking Citation and Tow- and-Storage-Fee Abatement Program to provide eligible vehicularly homeless persons with waivers of parking fines and fees. The Board added Chapter 119 in Ordinance No. 082-19, and duplicated the file.
