

1 [Accept and Expend Grant –Light Brown Apple Moth Program.]

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3 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (DPH) to accept**
4 **and expend retroactively a grant from the California Department of Food and**
5 **Agriculture (CDFA) in the amount of \$42,448.60 to fund the Little Brown Apple Moth**
6 **Program; for the period of July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2010.**

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8 WHEREAS, DPH was awarded a grant from the CDFA in the amount of \$42,448.60 for
9 a project entitled “Light Brown Apple Moth Program;” for the period of July 1, 2009 through
10 June 30, 2010; and,

11 WHEREAS, The purpose of this grant is to perform Little Brown Apple Moth inspection
12 activities at nursery holding facilities in order to limit Light Brown Apple Moth populations and
13 prevent the pest from spreading to other areas of the state; and,

14 WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the grant funds, CDFA requires the City to
15 enter into an agreement (the “Agreement”), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the
16 Board of Supervisors in File No. 100096; which is hereby declared to be a part of this
17 resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,

18 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an ASO amendment and reimburses DPH for
19 four existing positions: two Agricultural Inspectors (Job Class #3450) at 0.20 FTE, one
20 Manager I (Job Class #0922) at 0.05 FTE, and one Junior Administrative Analyst (Job Class
21 #1820) at 0.02 FTE, for the period of July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010; and,

22 Whereas, DPH is seeking retroactive approval because DPH did not receive the
23 contract for the project until December 14, 2009 with a project start date of July 1, 2009; and,

24 WHEREAS, The grant budget includes a provision for indirect costs in the amount of
25 \$8,269.72; now, therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and expend a grant
2 in the amount of \$42,448.60 from the CDFA; and, be it

3 FURTHER RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and
4 expend the grant funds pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 10.170-1; and,
5 be it

6 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate the positions
7 funded under this agreement as a "G" or grant-funded position which would terminate when
8 the agreement expires; and, be it

9 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the
10 agreement on behalf of the City.
