My name is Angeles Roy and I'm a Chilean immigrant who has lived and worked in San Francisco since 2007. Over the past ten years, I've gone from undocumented and homeless to becoming the first person in my family to attain higher education and not hold a blue-collar job. While putting myself through UC Berkeley, I worked as an in-home caregiver for adults with disabilities, which solidified my commitment to working for, and being an ally to this community. After graduating college with a Political Science Degree, I worked as a political campaign operative and strategist for a number of issue and candidate based local campaigns all throughout the city. I'm proud to say that every one of the campaigns I've been involved with represented issues and candidates that aligned with my core values of diversity, social and economic equity, women's and LGBTQ rights to just name a few. Currently, I work as Head of Operations for the Chile-California Council, a diplomatic organization fostering mutually beneficial relationships in the areas of academia, government, technology, environment and entrepreneurship, between both regions. I'm also the President of the San Francisco Young Democrats, which is the largest democratic club in the city and one of the most influential. In this capacity, I'm focusing my efforts in: leadership development, diversifying the membership, and community organizing.

Currently, I'm working to pass a change to the bylaws that reign over all young democrat organizations in the state so that we can open our membership to non-citizens—undocumented immigrants, refugees, green card holders, and others—so they can feel more empowered, involved, and welcomed in their communities. I'm also serving my first term as an elected delegate to the California Democratic Party, representing Assembly District 17. My platform was supportive of: sanctuary cities, access to healthcare and quality education for all, right of workers to organize, criminal justice reform and affordable housing. I'm incredibly excited to attend convention this year and be part of the change that hopefully will revitalize the Democratic Party.

In addition, I've held the following titles over the past few years: Advocacy Chair at the American Civil Liberties Union in San Francisco (2015), centering my efforts in criminal justice reform and immigrant rights; as Chapter Leader at California Latinas for Reproductive Justice (2015-2016), where I organized women of color around reproductive rights in some of the most challenged areas in the South East side of San Francisco and Oakland; and Vice-President at California Women's List (2016), which is a Political Action Committee focused on electing women to statewide office. I'm also a leadership development speaker and coach and a proud alumnus of Emerge CA and the New American Leaders Project.



Board Qualifications:

The Immigrant Rights Commission consists of fifteen (15) voting members. Eleven (11) voting members are appointed by the Board of Supervisors and the other four (4) voting members are appointed by the Mayor.

At least eight (8) members shall be immigrants to the United States who are appointed in accordance with Charter, Section 4.101. It has been past practice that six (6) of the immigrant members are appointed by the Board of Supervisors and two (2) immigrant members are appointed by the Mayor. All members must have a demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the health, human service, educational, or employment issues that affect immigrants residing in San Francisco and shall reflect the geographic, ethnic, and sexual orientation population of San Francisco.

The term of each member of the Commission shall be two years; provided, however, that the members first appointed shall, by lot, classify their terms so that eight (8) members shall serve a term of three years and seven (7) members shall serve a term of two years. In the event a vacancy occurs during the term of office of any member, a successor shall be appointed to complete the unexpired term of the office vacated in a manner similar to that for the initial member.

The Immigrant Rights Commission shall advise and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor about issues affecting immigrants residing in San Francisco.
