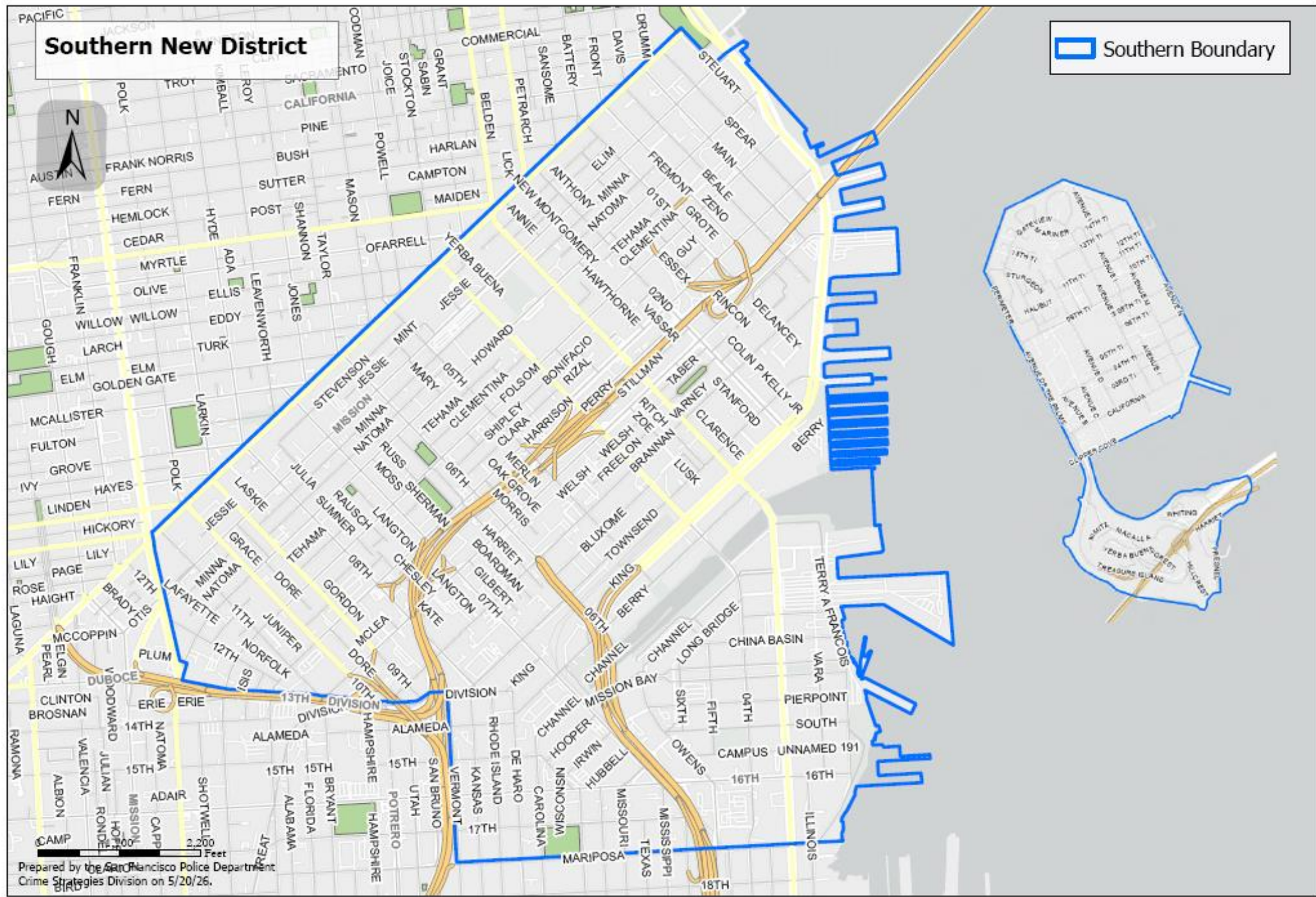

BOUNDARY CHANGE OVERVIEW

- Police Commission approved district boundary changes in November 2025
- Implementation date: October 1, 2026
- Southern Station will assume additional territory
- Planning includes staffing, sectors, CAD/dispatch, training, and outreach

STAFFING COMMENSURATE WITH BOUNDARIES

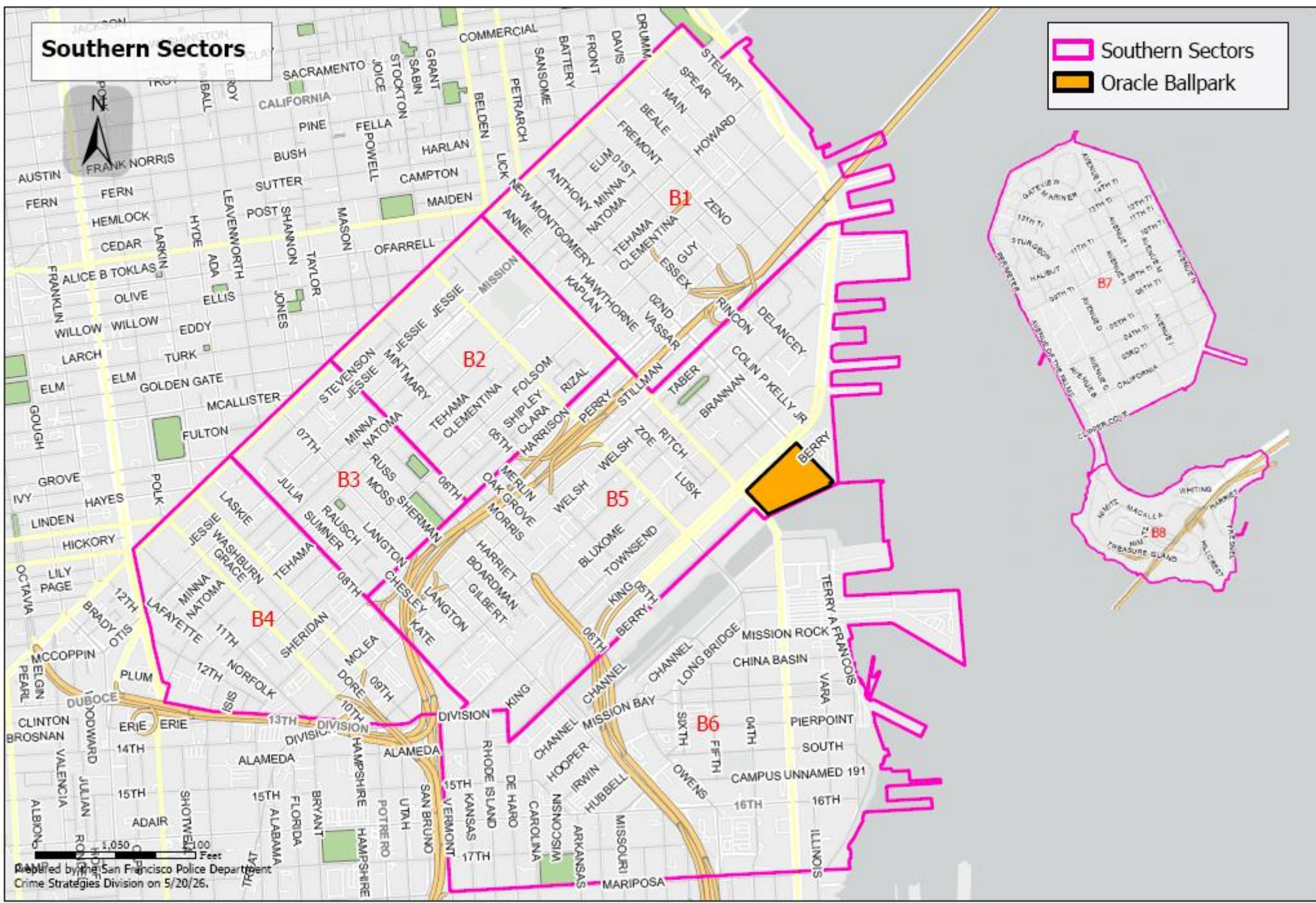
Staffing Analysis and Planning

- Southern staffing being evaluated against projected workload
- Southern has already received staffing increases
- Additional adjustments being evaluated through transfers, academy/FTO pipeline, and deployment planning

Staffing Levels

- Staffing analysis recommended level:
 - 105 patrol officers (old boundaries)
 - 121 patrol officers (new boundaries)
- Current staffing level: +approx. 20 patrol officers since December 2025



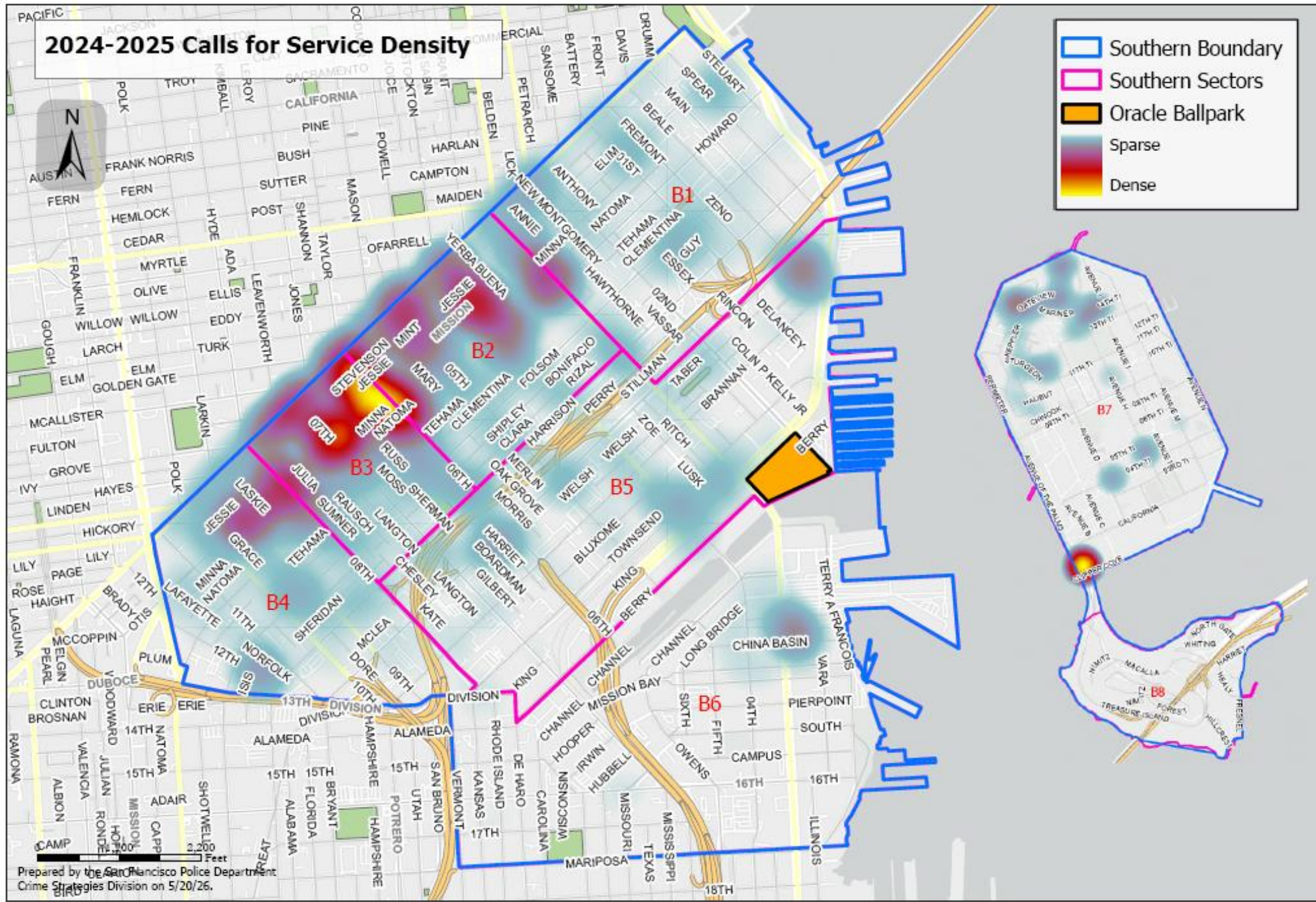
CURRENT SOUTHERN OPERATIONAL RESPONSE

- Increased focused deployment within the Southern District
- Additional attention in high-demand corridors
- Southern resources supplemented by specialized and citywide units
- Coordination with HSOC and DPW on street conditions response
- Deployment remains flexible based on operational needs
