

1 [Planning, Building Codes - Fee Waiver Program - Small Business Month May 2013]

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3 **Ordinance recognizing Small Business Month in May 2013; amending the Planning**
4 **Code, Sections 302, 355(a), and 355(e); and amending Building Code, Tables 1A-A, and**
5 **1A-E, to waive fees for the month of May for certain façade improvements; and making**
6 **findings, including environmental findings and findings of consistency with the**
7 **General Plan and priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1.**

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12 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

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13 (a) May is Small Business Month and this Board desires to recognize the importance
14 of small businesses in San Francisco. As part of this recognition, the Board elects to waive
15 various permit fees for the month of May for awning replacement and installation of pedestrian
16 level lighting as these fees have acted as a bar from many small businesses to improve their
17 building facades and store fronts.

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18 (b) On _____, 2013, the Planning Commission adopted Resolution No.

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_____ recommending adoption of this Ordinance, and adopted findings that the
20 legislation is consistent, on balance, with the City's General Plan and eight priority policies of
21 Planning Code Section 101.1(b). The Board adopts these findings as it own. A copy of this
22 Commission Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No. _____, and is
23 incorporated by reference herein.

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1 (c) Pursuant to Planning Code Section 302, this Board finds that this Ordinance will
2 promote the public necessity, convenience, safety and welfare for the reasons set forth in
3 Commission Resolution No. _____, which is incorporated herein by reference.

4 (d) The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this
5 ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources
6 Code Section 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
7 Supervisors in File No. _____ and is incorporated herein by reference.

8 (e) On _____, 2013, the Building Inspection Commission conducted a public
9 hearing on this legislation and recommended approval of this legislation. On _____,
10 2013, the Building Inspection Commission Secretary submitted a letter to the Board
11 describing the Commission's action. Said letter is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
12 Supervisors in File No. _____ and is incorporated herein by reference.

13 Section 2. This Section is uncodified.

14 (a) Notwithstanding any provision of the Planning Code, including the fee schedule
15 associated with Sections 355(a) and 355(e), the permit fee for awning replacement and for
16 signs, respectively, are hereby waived for any permit issued for such activities during the
17 month of May 2013.

18 (b) Notwithstanding any provision of the Building Code, including the fee schedules of
19 Tables 1A-A and 1A-E, the permit fees related to reviewing the structural integrity of awning
20 replacements for those permits submitted "over the counter" at the Central Permit Bureau and
21 installation of pedestrian level lighting, respectively, are hereby waived for any permit issued
22 for such activities during the month of May 2012.

23 Section 3. The fee waivers set forth in this Ordinance shall apply only to small
24 business enterprises. For purposes of this Ordinance a small business enterprise shall be
25 one that has 500 or fewer employees. The Board of Supervisors hereby delegates to the

1 Department of Building Inspection and the Planning Department the establishment of a
2 process by which the respective departments will certify that an applicant is a small business
3 enterprise.

4 Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the
5 date of passage; provided, however, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall be retroactive
6 to May 1, 2013 should the effective date of the Ordinance occur after said date.
