7 **1060.22, and by adding new Sections 1060.4 and 1060.20, relating to the application,**
8 **approval, amendment, suspension, revocation, and transfer of Place of Entertainment**
9 **Permits and One Night Event Permits (now called "One Time Event Permits"), including**
10 **changes in penalties, and amending the San Francisco Business and Tax Regulations**
11 **Code by amending Sections 8 and 26 to provide the time for appealing to the Board of**
12 **Appeals, to provide an additional category of permit suspension and revocation**
13 **actions that are not suspended pending a decision by the Board of Appeals, and to**
14 **clarify the standards governing the review of permits.**

18 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

19 Section 1. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by amending Section
20 2.26, to read as follows:

21 **SEC. 2.26. SCHEDULE OF PERMITS AND FILING FEES.**

22 The following filing fees, payable in advance to the City and County of San Francisco,
23 are required when submitting applications for permits to the Police Department or
24 Entertainment Commission:

5 Section 2. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by amending Sections
6 1060, 1060.1, 1060.2 and 1060.3, to read as follows:

7 **SEC. 1060. DEFINITIONS.**

8 For the purposes of this Article, unless otherwise provided in this Article, the following
9 words and phrases shall mean and include:

10 (a) "Any Sidewalk Abutting the Premises." The sidewalk not more than 50 feet from the
11 premises of the Business that is located between the premises and a public street. For purposes of this
12 definition, "premises" includes any immediately adjacent area that is owned, leased, or rented by the
13 permit applicant or Permittee.

14 (b) "Bona Fide Nonprofit Club or Organization." Any fraternal, charitable, religious,
15 benevolent, or other nonprofit organization for mutual social, mental, political, or civic welfare, to
16 which admission is limited to members and guests if the revenue accruing therefrom is used exclusively
17 for the benevolent purposes of said organization or agency, and if the organization or agency is exempt
18 from taxation under the Internal Revenue laws of the United States as a bona fide fraternal, charitable,
19 religious, benevolent or nonprofit organization.

20 (c) "Business." The enterprise for which a permit is sought or has been issued under this
21 Article, whether operated on a for-profit or not-for-profit basis.

22 (d) "Conduct that Constitutes a Nuisance." Any conduct that would constitute a violation of
23 the following laws: assault and battery (Cal. Penal Code §240, 242, 245); sexual battery (Cal. Penal
24 Code §243.4); discharging firearm (Cal. Penal Code §246, 246.3); unlawful weapons (Cal. Penal
25 Code §12020; S.F. Police Code §1291); disturbing the peace (Cal. Penal Code § 415, 416, 417);

1 unlawful threats (Cal. Penal Code §422); obstruction of pedestrian or vehicle right of way (Cal. Penal
2 Code § 370); gambling (Cal. Penal Code §§ 330, 337a); prostitution (Cal. Penal Code §§ 266h, 266i,
3 315, 316, 647(b)); sex crimes for which registration is required under the Sex Offender Registration
4 Act (Cal. Penal Code §290); loitering for lewd or lascivious purposes (Cal. Penal Code §647(d));
5 loitering on private property without lawful business (Cal. Penal Code §647(h); identify theft (Cal.
6 Penal Code §530.5); a violent felony warranting enhancement of a prison term (Cal. Penal Code
7 §667.5); drug offenses (Cal. Health & Safety Code §§ 11351, 11352, 11359, 11360, 11378, 11379,
8 11378.5, 11379.5); violation of Alcohol Beverage Control laws (Cal. Business & Professions Code §§
9 23300, 25602, 25631, 25657, 25658); public urination or defecation (San Francisco Police Code
10 §153); accumulation of filth (Cal. Health & Safety Code § 17920.3(j)); or excessive noise emissions
11 (San Francisco Police Code Section 49 or Article 29).

12 (e) "Corrective Action." Action which includes, but is not limited to, the following:

13 (1) Requesting assistance from the local law enforcement agency in a timely manner
14 regarding the conduct.

15 (2) Requesting those individuals engaging in Conduct that Constitutes a Nuisance to cease
16 the conduct, or ejecting those Persons from the premises.

17 (3) Revising the Security Plan, subject to approval by the Entertainment Commission or the
18 Director as provided under this Article.

19 (f) "Director." The Executive Director of the Entertainment Commission or individual
20 designated by the Director to act on his or her behalf.

21 (g) "Entertainment." Any of the following, except when conducted in a private residence:

22 (1) Any act, play, review, pantomime, scene, song, dance act, song and dance act, or poetry
23 recitation, conducted in or upon any premises to which patrons or members are admitted.

24

1 (2) The playing or use of any instrument capable of producing or used to produce musical
2 or percussion sounds, including but not limited to, reed, brass, percussion, or string-like instruments,
3 or karaoke, or recorded music presented by a live disc jockey on the premises.

4 (3) A fashion or style show.

5 (4) The act of any female entertainer, while visible to any customer, who exposes the breast
6 or employs any device or covering which is intended to simulate the breast, or wears any type of
7 clothing so that the breast may be observed.

8 (h) "Manager." The individual authorized by the Permittee to exercise discretionary power
9 to organize, direct, carry out or control the operations of the Business.

10 (i) "Permittee." The Person to whom a permit has been issued under this Article.

11 (j) "Person." Any person, individual, firm, partnership, joint venture, association, social
12 club, fraternal organization, joint stock company, corporation, estate, trust, business trust, receiver,
13 trustee, syndicate, or any other group or combination acting as a unit excepting the United States of
14 America, the State of California, and any political subdivision of either.

15 (k) "Place of Entertainment." Every premises to which patrons or members are admitted
16 which serves food, beverages, or food and beverages, including but not limited to alcoholic beverages,
17 for consumption on the premises and wherein Entertainment as defined in Subsection (g) is furnished
18 or occurs upon the premises.

19 (l) "Sale of the Business" or "Sell the Business." The sale or other transfer of the
20 ownership interest in a Business that results in a Person (who did not already have such a percentage
21 interest) owning 50% or more of the Business, regardless of the form of ownership.

22 (m) "Security Guard." A person who has a valid Proprietary Private Security Officer
23 registration document issued by the California Department of Consumer Affairs or is a Patrol Special
24 Police Officer appointed by the Police Commission or an assistant to a Patrol Special Police Officer.

1 (n) "Security Plan." A plan that adequately addresses the safety of persons and property by
2 (i) providing at least one Security Guard for every 100 individuals anticipated to be present at any one
3 time during Entertainment events on the premises of the Business, (ii) securing the sidewalk for a 100-
4 foot radius in all directions around the premises of the Business to prevent injury to persons and/or
5 damage to property, and (iii) providing for the orderly dispersal of individuals and traffic from the
6 premises of the Business and within 100 feet of any door that patrons use to enter or exit the premises.
7 The phrase "100 feet" in (iii) of this Subsection (n) means 100 feet from the door in both directions on
8 the same side of the street as the premises of the Business. The plan shall include sufficient staff with
9 the requisite experience to implement the plan.

10 (o) "Tax Collector." Tax Collector of the City and County of San Francisco.

11 (p) "Professional Entertainer." A person who is compensated for his or her
12 performance. This definition does not restrict the definition of "Entertainment" in Subsection
13 (g) and is relevant only to the extent the term "professional entertainer" is used in this Article.

14 ~~—— (a) "Place of Entertainment." Every premises to which patrons or members are~~
15 ~~admitted which serves food, beverages, or food and beverages, including but not limited to alcoholic~~
16 ~~beverages, for consumption on the premises and wherein entertainment as defined in Subsections (b),~~
17 ~~(c), or (e) is furnished or occurs upon the premises.~~

18 ~~—— (b) "Entertainment." Any act, play, review, pantomime, scene, song, dance act, song~~
19 ~~and dance act, or poetry recitation, conducted or participated in by any professional entertainer in or~~
20 ~~upon any premises to which patrons or members are admitted.~~

21 ~~"Entertainment," in addition, is defined to mean and include the playing upon or use by any~~
22 ~~professional entertainer of any instrument that is capable of or can be used to produce musical sounds~~
23 ~~or percussion sounds, including but not limited to, reed, brass, percussion or string-like instruments, or~~
24 ~~recorded music presented by a live disc jockey on the premises.~~

2 ~~in which the models are professional entertainers, except when conducted by a bona fide nonprofit club~~
3 ~~or organization as a part of the social activities of such club or organization, and when conducted~~

5 ~~———— (d) "Professional Entertainer." A person who is compensated for his or her~~

8 ~~includes the act of any female professional entertainer, while visible to any customer, who exposes the~~
9 ~~breast or employs any device or covering which is intended to simulate the breast, or wears any type of~~
10 ~~clothing so that the breast may be observed.~~

11 ~~———— (f) "Person." Any person, individual, firm, partnership, joint venture, association,~~

14 ~~States of America, the State of California, and any political subdivision of either thereof.~~

15 ~~———— (g) "Operator." Any person operating a place of entertainment in the City and County~~
16 ~~of San Francisco, including, but not limited to, the owner or proprietor of such premises, lessee,~~
17 ~~sublessee, mortgagee in possession, permittee or any other person operating such place of~~
18 ~~entertainment or amusement.~~

19 ~~———— (h) "Bona Fide Nonprofit Club or Organization." Any fraternal, charitable, religious~~
20 ~~or benevolent, or any other nonprofit organization having a regular membership association primarily~~
21 ~~for mutual social, mental, political and civic welfare, to which admission is limited to members and~~
22 ~~guests and revenue accruing therefrom shall be used exclusively for the benevolent purposes of said~~
23 ~~organization and which organization or agency is exempt from taxation under the Internal Revenue~~
24 ~~laws of the United States as a bona fide fraternal, charitable, religious, benevolent or nonprofit~~
25 ~~organization.~~

1 ~~(i) "Admission Charge." Any charge for the right or privilege to enter any place of~~
2 ~~entertainment including a minimum service charge, a cover charge or a charge made for the use of~~
3 ~~seats and tables, reserved or otherwise.~~

4 ~~(j) "Tax Collector." Tax Collector of the City and County of San Francisco.~~

5 ~~(k) "Security Plan." A plan that (i) provides at least 1 security guard for every 100~~
6 ~~persons authorized by the Occupancy Permit, (ii) secures a 50-foot perimeter in all directions around~~
7 ~~the location of the Place of Entertainment to prevent injury to persons and/or damage to property, and~~
8 ~~(iii) provides for the orderly disbursement of persons and traffic from the Place of Entertainment. The~~
9 ~~Entertainment Commission, in consultation with the San Francisco Police Department, shall develop~~
10 ~~rules and regulations implementing this section.~~

11 **SEC. 1060.1. PERMIT REQUIRED.**

12 (a) It shall be unlawful for any Person ~~person~~ to own, conduct, operate, or maintain ~~or~~
13 ~~to participate therein~~, or to cause or permit to be conducted, operated, or maintained, any Place
14 ~~of Entertainment~~ place of entertainment or One Time Event in the City and County of San
15 Francisco without first having obtained the required ~~a~~ permit from the Director or Entertainment
16 Commission.

17 (b) It shall be unlawful for any Person to conduct, operate or maintain, or cause or permit
18 to be conducted, operated, or maintained, a Place of Entertainment or One Time Event for which a
19 permit has been granted (1) after the permit has been revoked or is otherwise invalid or (2) for any
20 period of time during which the permit has been suspended.

21 (c) It shall be unlawful for any Person who is required to surrender a permit upon the sale
22 of a Business as required under Section 1060.24(b) to fail to do so.

23 ~~Any place or premises where a permit to operate is sought must conform to all existing health,~~
24 ~~safety, zoning and fire ordinances of the City and County of San Francisco, and must have a valid~~

1 ~~public eating place permit from the Department of Public Health. The Entertainment Commission may~~
2 ~~issue a permit under this Section conditional upon the applicant receiving the other required permits.~~

3 ~~Any permit granted by the Entertainment Commission conditional upon the applicant receiving~~
4 ~~other required permits may be appealed to the Board of Permit Appeals. Such appeal must be filed~~
5 ~~within ten (10) days of the final decision of the Entertainment Commission issuing the conditional~~
6 ~~permit.~~

7 ~~Any conditional permit granted by the Entertainment Commission will expire nine (9) months~~
8 ~~from the date of the final decision of the Entertainment Commission, if all other required permits have~~
9 ~~not been received.~~

10 **SEC. 1060.2. FILING APPLICATION, NOTICE TO OTHER CITY DEPARTMENTS,**
11 **AND DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS.**

12 (a) Every Person ~~person~~ seeking ~~desiring~~ a Place of Entertainment permit or an
13 amendment to a permit pursuant to this Article shall file an application with the Entertainment
14 Commission upon a form provided by the Entertainment Commission and shall pay a filing fee
15 as provided in Section 2.26 of this Code.

16 (b) The Director shall send the application to the San Francisco Police Department, Fire
17 Department, Department of Building Inspection, Department of Public Health, and Planning
18 Department. Those departments shall complete all necessary inspections and report their
19 determinations to the Entertainment Commission within 20 City business days of receiving the
20 application.

21 **SEC. 1060.3. APPLICATION FORM.**

22 ~~Operators under any permit issued pursuant to this Article shall be limited to the terms of the~~
23 ~~application.~~ Except as otherwise provided herein, an application for a permit pursuant to the
24 provisions of this Article shall specify the following and be signed under penalty of perjury:

25 (a) The name and street address of the Business for which the permit is sought.

1 **(b) The name and address of the applicant as follows:**

2 **(1) If the applicant is a corporation, the name of the corporation exactly as shown in its**
3 **articles of incorporation; the date and place of incorporation; and the name and address of each**
4 **officer and director.**

5 **(2) If the applicant is a Person other than a publicly traded company, the name and**
6 **address of every Person that directly or indirectly owns or controls 10% or more of the assets,**
7 **ownership interests or voting interests in that Person.**

8 **(c) The name of and contact information for the Manager who shall directly, or through**
9 **designees, be on the premises during all hours of operation.**

10 **(d) The name and address of each Person who appears on the business registration**
11 **certificate for the Business for which a permit is sought.**

12 **(e) The name and address of each Person to whom the Department of Alcoholic Beverage**
13 **Control has issued a license for the Business for which a permit is sought.**

14 **(f) The names and addresses of the Persons who have or will have authority or control over**
15 **the Business and a brief statement of the nature and extent of such authority and control, if the**
16 **applicant has not otherwise provided this information in the application.**

17 **(g) The name and address of the Person authorized to accept service of process.**

18 **(h) A plan for the Business specifying the days and hours of operation, the number of**
19 **employees and their duties, the number of patrons, a statement certifying that the Business shall comply**
20 **with the maximum occupancy load for the space as established under the San Francisco Building and**
21 **Fire Codes, and the amount of parking, both on and off-site, to be provided. If sound amplification is to**
22 **be used, the plan shall also include a specific description of the amplification system.**

23 **(i) A proposed Security Plan as defined in Section 1060(n).**

24 **(j) For the Persons(s) whose disclosure is required under Subsections (b), (c), (e) and (f),**
25 **all criminal charges, complaints or indictments in the preceding five years which resulted in a**

1 conviction or a plea of guilty or no contest for the following laws: assault and battery (Cal. Penal Code
2 §240, 242, 245); sexual battery (Cal. Penal Code §243.4); discharging firearm (Cal. Penal Code §246,
3 246.3); unlawful weapons (Cal. Penal Code §12020; S.F. Police Code §1291); disturbing the peace
4 (Cal. Penal Code § 415, 416, 417); unlawful threats (Cal. Penal Code §422); obstruction of pedestrian
5 or vehicle right of way (Cal. Penal Code § 370); gambling (Cal. Penal Code §§ 330, 337a);
6 prostitution (Cal. Penal Code §§ 266h, 266i, 315, 316, 647(b)); sex crimes for which registration is

14 (k) All criminal charges, complaints or indictments in the preceding five years which
15 resulted in a conviction for the Person(s) whose disclosure is required under Subsections (b), (c), (e)
16 and (f), for any other offense which is a felony or misdemeanor under the laws of this state, or for
17 conduct in another jurisdiction which if carried out in California would constitute a felony or
18 misdemeanor under the laws of this state, provided that this Subsection (k) applies only to offenses
19 arising out of the operation of a nightclub, dance hall, cabaret, Place of Entertainment or an
20 establishment that serves food or beverages.

21 (l) For the information required by Subsections (j) and (k), a statement setting forth for
22 each Person all charges under which convictions or pleas of guilty or no contest were obtained, any
23 sentence imposed, and for each matter the date, name and location of the court.

24 (m) Such further information as the Entertainment Commission requires regarding financial
25 and lease arrangements and management, authority, and operational control of the Business or its

1 premises when the information will assist the Commission in its determination whether to grant or deny
2 the permit.

3 ~~(a) The address of the location for which the permit is required, together with the business~~
4 ~~name of such location.~~

5 ~~(b) The name and proposed business address of the applicant. If the applicant is a corporation,~~
6 ~~the name of the corporation shall be set forth exactly as shown in its articles of incorporation; and the~~
7 ~~applicant shall also set forth the date and place of incorporation; the names and residence addresses of~~
8 ~~each of the officers, directors, and each stockholder owning more than 10 percent of the stock of the~~
9 ~~corporation. If the applicant is a partnership, the application shall set forth the name and residence~~
10 ~~address of each of the partners, including limited partners. If one or more of the partners is a~~
11 ~~corporation, the provisions of this Section pertaining to a corporate applicant apply.~~

12 ~~(c) Whether or not the applicant or any officer or director or member of applicant, as the case~~
13 ~~may be, has ever been convicted of any crime except misdemeanor traffic violations. In addition to the~~
14 ~~foregoing, any corporate applicant shall state whether or not any stockholder owning more than 10~~
15 ~~percent of the stock of such corporation has ever been convicted of any crime except misdemeanor~~
16 ~~traffic violations. If any person mentioned in this subsection has been so convicted, a statement must be~~
17 ~~made giving the name of the person so convicted, the place and court in which the conviction was had,~~
18 ~~the specific charge under which the conviction was obtained, and the sentence imposed as the result of~~
19 ~~said conviction.~~

20 ~~(d) The names and addresses of the persons who have authority or control over the place for~~
21 ~~which the permit is requested and a brief statement of the nature and extent of such authority and~~
22 ~~control.~~

23 ~~(e) Such information pertinent to the operation of the proposed activity, including information~~
24 ~~as to management, authority control, financial agreements, and lease arrangements, that is reasonably~~
25 ~~related to the factual determinations this ordinance empowers the Entertainment Commission to make~~

1 *in reviewing and acting upon permit applications as the Entertainment Commission may require of an*
2 *applicant in addition to the other requirements of this Section. The foregoing examples are in*
3 *explanation of and not in limitation of the information which the Entertainment Commission may*
4 *require.*

5 ~~*(f) A business plan for the proposed place of entertainment, specifying the days and hours of*~~
6 ~~*operation, the number of patrons, the numbers of employees and their duties, the identity of the*~~
7 ~~*manager or managers who shall be on premises during all hours of operation, the types or classes of*~~
8 ~~*entertainment (in terms of the types of instruments, numbers of performers and sound levels) to be*~~
9 ~~*provided, and the amount of parking, both on site and off site, to be provided. If sound amplification is*~~

13 to distribute leaflets at each residence located within 150 feet of the Business, unless the Entertainment
14 Commission finds that a Business located in a district is not likely to significantly generate nighttime
15 noise and traffic to the detriment of residences located in that immediate area. Applicants subject to
16 the requirement of distributing leaflets shall do so at least 30 days before the scheduled hearing date
17 and the distribution shall be done in compliance with the provisions of Article 57 (beginning with

19 hearing at least 30 days before the hearing to any Person who has filed a written request for such
20 notice, which notice may be given electronically if the Person has provided electronic contact

23 hearing to be conspicuously and continuously posted on the premises of the Business for at least 10

3 (3) The failure of the Director to provide the notice of the hearing to any Person who filed a

9 adequate evaluation of the application and if grounds for denial, as set forth in Subsection (f), are not
10 present. Any permit conditionally granted by the Entertainment Commission under this
11 Subsection(e)(1) may be appealed to the Board of Appeals. Any such appeal shall be filed within 10
12 days of the decision of the Entertainment Commission's conditionally granting the permit. No Person

9 business days of receiving the request, the Director has not brought the suspension
10 proceeding, the Chief may bring the suspension proceeding before the Entertainment
11 Commission. In such a case, the Chief or the Chief's representative shall present the case for
12 suspension, except that the Director may join in presenting the case for suspension if the
13 Director agrees to do so.

14 (c) PERIOD OF SUSPENSION. The Entertainment Commission may suspend a permit for
15 the periods of time set forth in this Subsection (c).

16 (i) For the first violation under Subsection (a)(1) through (6) of this Section, for up to 30
17 days.

18 (ii) For the second violation of the same or any other provision of Subsection (a)(1) through
19 (6) within six months of the order of suspension for the first violation, for up to 60 days.

20 (iii) For the third and subsequent violation of the same or any other provision of Subsection
21 (a)(1) through (6) within six months of the order of suspension for the second or any subsequent
22 violation, for up to 90 days.

23 (iv) For the purpose of Subsections (c)(ii) and (iii) of this Section, calculation of the six
24 months shall not include any period of time during which the permit was suspended.

1 (v) In determining the length of the suspension, the Entertainment Commission shall
2 consider the seriousness and the frequency of the violation(s) in light of the effort taken to correct them
3 and the impact of the violation(s) on the surrounding neighborhood.

4 **SEC. 1060.20.2. LIMITED SUSPENSION BY THE DIRECTOR; APPEAL TO**
5 **ENTERTAINMENT COMMISSION.**

6 (a) GROUNDS FOR SUSPENSION. The Director may suspend any permit issued under
7 this Article for a period of up to seven days if the Director determines, after providing the Permittee
8 and the Manager at least five days written notice and an opportunity to respond, that any of the
9 circumstances set forth in either Subsection (a)(1) or (2) of this Section has occurred. Each order of
10 limited suspension may include multiple violations under Subsections (a)(1) and (2) of this Section.
11 The Director shall provide the written notice required under this Subsection either by mail and
12 electronically or by personal delivery.

13 (1) The Business has exceeded the allowable noise emissions under Section 49 or Article 29
14 of the San Francisco Police Code, or as required under any condition imposed on the permit, on three
15 separate days within a three month time period. The Director may suspend a permit under this
16 Subsection (a)(1) only if:

17 (i) The San Francisco Police Department, the Director, or an authorized agent of either
18 has issued a noise emission report for each violation showing noise levels that exceed those allowed
19 under Section 49 or Article 29 of the San Francisco Police Code, or as required under any condition
20 imposed on the permit, and

21 (ii) The Director has provided notice of the issuance of each noise emission report to the
22 Permittee or the Manager electronically or by mail within three City business days of its issuance.

23 (2) The Permittee or any employee or agent of the Permittee has engaged in Conduct that
24 Constitutes a Nuisance or the Permittee has failed to take reasonable steps within the Permittee's
25 control to halt another Person from engaging in Conduct that Constitutes a Nuisance. "Conduct that

1 Constitutes a Nuisance" means any conduct that would constitute a violation of the following laws:
2 assault and battery (Cal. Penal Code §240, 242, 245); sexual battery (Cal. Penal Code §243.4);
3 discharging firearm (Cal. Penal Code §246, 246.3); unlawful weapons (Cal. Penal Code §12020; S.F.
4 Police Code §1291); disturbing the peace (Cal. Penal Code § 415, 416, 417); unlawful threats (Cal.
5 Penal Code §422); obstruction of pedestrian or vehicle right of way (Cal. Penal Code § 370); gambling
6 (Cal. Penal Code §§ 330, 337a); prostitution (Cal. Penal Code §§ 266h, 266i, 315, 316, 647(b)); sex
7 crimes for which registration is required under the Sex Offender Registration Act (Cal. Penal Code
8 §290); loitering for lewd or lascivious purposes (Cal. Penal Code §647(d)); loitering on private
9 property without lawful business (Cal. Penal Code §647(h)); identify theft (Cal. Penal Code §530.5); a
10 violent felony warranting enhancement of a prison term (Cal. Penal Code §667.5); drug offenses (Cal.
11 Health & Safety Code §§ 11351, 11352, 11359, 11360, 11378, 11379, 11378.5, 11379.5); violation of
12 Alcohol Beverage Control laws (Cal. Business & Professions Code §§ 23300, 25602, 25631, 25657,
13 25658); public urination or defecation (San Francisco Police Code §153); accumulation of filth (Cal.
14 Health & Safety Code § 17920.3(j)); or excessive noise emissions (San Francisco Police Code Section
15 49 or Article 29).

16 This Subsection (a)(2) applies only when both of the following apply:

17 (i) The conduct occurred on the premises of, or on Any Sidewalk Abutting the Premises of,
18 the Business, and

19 (ii) The conduct continued after the Director had notified the Permittee of the problem and
20 informed the Permittee of Corrective Action, as defined in Section 1060, to address the problem, but the
21 Permittee failed to take the Corrective Action.

22 (b)(1) ISSUANCE OF ORDER; RIGHT TO APPEAL TO COMMISSION. On the day that the
23 Director issues an order of limited suspension, the Director shall send the order to the Permittee and
24 Manager by mail or electronically. The order shall state the date that the order issued and the date
25 that it takes effect. To provide the Permittee with an opportunity to file an appeal to the Entertainment

1 Commission, an order of limited suspension shall not take effect for at least five City business days
2 from the date that the Director issues the order.

3 (2) A Permittee may appeal an order of limited suspension to the Entertainment
4 Commission by filing with the Commission Secretary a written request for review within five City
5 business days of the date that the Director has issued the order. The filing of an appeal stays the order
6 pending the Commission's decision. If a Permittee withdraws the appeal, the Director's order shall no
7 longer be stayed and shall take effect on the date of the withdrawal or the date that the order was to
8 take effect, whichever is later.

9 (3) The Commission may affirm, overturn, or modify the Director's order. When the
10 Commission affirms or modifies the Director's order, the order takes effect the day following the day of
11 the hearing at which the Commission made its determination.

12 (4) If the Permittee does not file a timely appeal of the Director's order, the order shall take
13 effect the day after the time to appeal has expired or the effective date set forth in the order, whichever
14 is later; provided, however, that the Director and the Permittee may agree in writing to an earlier
15 effective date.

16 (5) The Entertainment Commission may adopt a regulation establishing a procedure which
17 would allow the Director or the Commission, or both, to stay and vacate an order of limited suspension
18 if the Permittee submits and complies with a plan to address the problems that gave rise to the
19 suspension.

20 (c) The Director may initiate orders of limited suspension under this Section against a
21 Permittee for a Business at a single location no more than three times in any twelve-month period.

22 (d) POLICE DEPARTMENT RECOMMENDATION OF LIMITED SUSPENSION BY
23 THE DIRECTOR. The Chief of Police, or the Chief's designee, may recommend to the
24 Director, orally or in writing, that the Director suspend a permit in accordance with the grounds
25 for suspension stated in subsection (a) above. If the recommendation is oral, it shall later be

1 reduced to writing and filed with the Director when time permits. If the Director fails to follow
2 the oral or written recommendation, the Director shall report to the Entertainment Commission
3 both the recommendation and the reason or reasons for not following the recommendation.
4 This report shall occur at the next regular Commission meeting subsequent to the
5 recommendation, consistent with the provisions of the Brown Act and Sunshine Ordinance.
6 For purposes of this subsection (d), the Captain for the district where the Place of
7 Entertainment is located, or the Captain's designee, is deemed the Chief's designee unless
8 the Chief of Police directs otherwise.

9 This subsection (d) shall not preclude any police officer from recommending to the
10 Director that the Director suspend a permit in accordance with the grounds for suspension
11 stated in subsection (a) above.

12 **SEC. 1060.20.3. SUSPENSION FOR PUBLIC SAFETY BY THE DIRECTOR.**

13 (a) GROUND FOR SUSPENSION. The Director may suspend any permit issued under
14 this Article for up to 72 hours if the Director determines, after providing the Permittee at least 8 hours
15 written notice and an opportunity to respond, that any of the circumstances set forth in Subsection
16 (a)(1)(i) or (ii) of this Section has occurred on the Premises of, or on Any Sidewalk Abutting the
17 Premises of, the Business, that such conduct has resulted or could have resulted in serious bodily
18 injury or death, and that continued operation of the Business poses a serious threat to public safety.

19 (1)(i) The Permittee or any employee or agent of the Permittee has engaged in conduct that
20 would constitute a violation of any of the following laws: assault and battery (Cal. Penal Code §§240,
21 242, 245); sexual battery (Cal. Penal Code §243.4); discharging firearm (Cal. Penal Code §§246,
22 246.3); unlawful weapon (Cal. Penal Code §12020; S.F. Police Code §1291); disturbing the peace
23 (Cal. Penal Code §§ 415, 416, 417); unlawful threats (Cal. Penal Code §422); a violent felony
24 warranting enhancement of a prison term (Cal. Penal Code §667.5); or
25

1 (ii) The Permittee has failed to take reasonable steps within the Permittee's control to halt
2 the conduct of another Person that would constitute a violation of any law described in Subsection
3 (a)(1)(i) of this Section.

4 (b) NOTICE OF PROPOSED ORDER. The Director shall provide the written notice
5 required under Subsection (a) of this Section to the Permittee and the Manager by personal delivery
6 and electronically.

7 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE AND TIME OF ORDER. The order of suspension for public safety
8 issued under this Section shall take effect at the date and time stated in the order.

9 (d) DIRECTOR MAY VACATE ORDER. The Director may vacate an order of suspension
10 for public safety if the Director determines that operation of the Business before expiration of the
11 suspension order will not pose a danger to the public because additional information demonstrates that
12 the conduct was not related to the operation of the Business, the Permittee has taken adequate steps to
13 correct the problem giving rise to the suspension, or other circumstances warrant such action.

14 (e) POLICE DEPARTMENT RECOMMENDATION OF SUSPENSION FOR PUBLIC
15 SAFETY. The Chief of Police, or the Chief's designee, may recommend to the Director, orally
16 or in writing, that the Director suspend a permit for public safety in accordance with the
17 grounds for suspension stated in subsection (a) above. If the recommendation is oral, it shall
18 later be reduced to writing and filed with the Director when time permits. If the Director fails to
19 follow the oral or written recommendation, the Director shall report to the Entertainment
20 Commission both the recommendation and the reason or reasons for not following the
21 recommendation. This report shall occur at the next regular Commission meeting subsequent
22 to the recommendation, consistent with the provisions of the Brown Act and Sunshine
23 Ordinance. For purposes of this subsection (e), the Captain for the district where the Place of
24 Entertainment is located, or the Captain's designee, is deemed the Chief's designee unless
25 the Chief of Police directs otherwise.

1 This subsection (e) shall not preclude any police officer from recommending to the
2 Director that the Director suspend a permit for public safety in accordance with the grounds
3 for suspension stated in subsection (a) above.

4 **SEC. 1060.20.4. REVOCATION OF A PERMIT.**

5 (a) GROUND FOR REVOCATION. The Entertainment Commission may revoke any
6 Place of Entertainment or One Time Event Permit issued under this Article if it determines after a
7 public hearing that any of the following conditions exist:

8 (1) The Permittee has knowingly made any false, misleading, or fraudulent statement of
9 material fact or has knowingly omitted a material fact in the application for a permit; or

10 (2) The Permittee has failed to pay any fee or charge required under this Article; or

11 (3) The Permittee has failed to surrender the permit as required by Section
12 1060.24(b).

13 (b) HEARING BY COMMISSION. The Entertainment Commission shall give the Permittee
14 and the Manager written notice of a hearing to determine whether to revoke a permit. The notice shall
15 set forth the grounds for the proposed revocation and the date, time and location of the hearing.

16 (c) APPLICATION FOR PERMIT AFTER REVOCATION. The revocation of a permit
17 under this Article shall not preclude the Permittee from applying for a new permit under this Article.

18 (d) When considering whether to grant a permit application or to suspend or revoke a
19 permit under this Article, the Commission and the Director may consider any previous denial of a
20 permit application or previous suspension or revocation of a permit, under this Article or Article 15.2,
21 for the same permit applicant or Permittee when the circumstances warranting the previous action are
22 relevant to the current determination.

24 Section 8. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by repealing Section

12 **PERMIT MUST BE SURRENDERED UPON SALE OF BUSINESS; PERMIT AMENDMENT**

14 (a) No Person may transfer a Place of Entertainment Permit issued under this Article to any
15 other Person.

16 (b) If a Place of Entertainment Permittee Sells the Business, the Permittee shall promptly
17 surrender the permit to the Director. If the Permittee fails to surrender the permit to the Director, the
18 Director may, after giving the Permittee notice by mail and electronically of the proposed action and
19 an opportunity to respond, revoke the permit.

20 (c) Notwithstanding Subsections (a) and (b) of this Section, a Permittee may change
21 partners, shareholders, or other owners of a Business provided that (1) the sale or other transfer of
22 ownership results in a Person owning no more than 50% of the Business, regardless of the form of
23 ownership, and (2) the Permittee obtains an amendment to the Permit as provided in this Section. If
24 the transfer of ownership does not result in any Person (who did not already have such a percentage
25

1 interest) having an ownership interest of ten percent or more, the Permittee is not required to obtain a
2 permit amendment.

3 (d) A Permittee seeking to amend a permit as required under this Section shall pay the filing
4 fee for Permit Amendment/Additional Partner set forth in Section 2.26 of this Code. The applicant
5 shall provide that portion of the information sought under Section 1060.3 for an application that the
6 Director requires.

7 (e) The Director shall determine within 30 days of the filing of a complete application to
8 amend a permit whether to approve it. The Director shall approve the application unless he or she
9 determines that denial is warranted under any of the grounds set forth in Section 1060.5(f) and shall
10 notify the Permittee and Manager of the approval electronically and either by mail or personal
11 delivery.

12 (f) If the Director determines that disapproval of the application may be warranted under
13 Section 1060.5(f), the Director shall schedule a hearing on the matter for the next regularly scheduled
14 meeting of the Entertainment Commission. The Director shall promptly provide written notice of the
15 hearing to the Permittee and the Manager by mail and electronically.

16 (g) The Entertainment Commission shall determine whether to approve the application
17 according to the standards governing the initial application set forth in Section 1060.5(f).

18 ~~No permit shall be transferable except with the written consent of the Entertainment~~
19 ~~Commission. An application for such a transfer shall be in writing and shall be accompanied by the~~
20 ~~same filing fee as for an initial application. The written application for such transfer shall contain the~~
21 ~~same information as requested herein for an initial application for such a permit.~~

22 Section 10. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by adding Sections
23 1060.24.1 and 1060.24.2, to read as follows:

24 **SEC. 1060.24.1. COMPLIANCE WITH CONDITIONS; AMENDMENT OF PERMIT TO**
25 **CHANGE CONDITIONS.**

1 No Permittee shall operate a Business in any manner inconsistent with any condition imposed
2 on the permit. A Permittee may request an amendment to a permit to remove or change a condition by
3 filing a request with the Secretary of the Commission and paying the fee for an Amendment to a Permit
4 required under Police Code Section 2.26. The Entertainment Commission shall conduct a hearing and
5 determine whether to approve the application to amend the permit according to the procedures

8 **SEC. 1060.24.2. APPEALS TO THE BOARD OF APPEALS.**

9 (a) The following actions taken under this Article may be appealed to the Board of Appeals:
10 The granting or denial of a permit, including a conditionally granted permit, or an amendment to a
11 permit, and the suspension or revocation of a permit. Any such appeal shall be filed within ten days
12 from the date of the decision, as provided in Section 8 of the San Francisco Business and Tax

15 applicant may seek immediate judicial review of the actions described in Subsection (a) of this Section

8 (b) ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY.

9 (1) The Director may issue administrative citations for the violation of any condition
10 imposed on a permit granted under this Article and any violation of Section 1060.31 or 1060.32
11 (governing Security Plans). San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 100, "Procedures Governing
12 the Imposition of Administrative Fines," is hereby incorporated in its entirety and shall govern the
13 amount of fees and the procedure for imposition, enforcement, collection, and administrative review of
14 administrative citations issued under this Subsection (b). The Director shall impose fines for violations
15 of any permit condition and any violation of Section 1060.31 or 1060.32 as set forth in Section 100.5(a)
16 of the San Francisco Administrative Code.

17 (2) Notwithstanding Subsection (b)(1) of this Section, the procedure governing the appeal
18 of a citation set forth in San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 100 is revised as provided in this
19 Subsection (b)(2). The Controller may designate the Director of the Department of Public Works as a
20 hearing officer under San Francisco Administrative Code Section 100.7, but shall designate such
21 officer for no more than one appeal a month and for no more than 12 times in a 12-month period.

22 ~~Additionally, any violation of the provisions of this Article Section 3305 of Article 33 by a~~
23 ~~permittee hereunder shall be deemed cause to or to revoke or suspend a permit pursuant to Secs.~~

25 **SEC. 1060.29. ONE TIME NIGHT EVENT PERMIT.**

1 (a) This Section provides a procedure for permitting a Person to conduct, maintain,
2 promote or sponsor Entertainment on the premises specified in the One Time Event Permit for a limited
3 number of one-day occurrences in a 12-month period, including operation between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00
4 a.m. No Person shall conduct, maintain, promote or sponsor Entertainment between 2:00 a.m. and
5 6:00 a.m. without a One Time Event Permit or an Extended-Hours Premises Permit. One Time Event
6 Permits may be issued for a premises for which a Place of Entertainment Permit has been issued, but
7 for which no Extended-Hours Premises Permit has been issued, when the applicant proposes operating
8 between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. For purposes of One Time Event Permits, the word "premises" means
9 the area or structure where the event for which a permit is sought occurs.

10 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this Section, the Director may issue One Time Event
11 Permits and applicants may appeal the Director's denial of an application to the Entertainment
12 Commission.

13 (c) Each One Time Event Permit shall issue for no longer than one 24-hour period. There
14 shall be no limit on the number of One Time Event Permits a Person may obtain, provided that no more
15 than one permit per month is issued for the same premises. Notwithstanding this restriction, the
16 Director may grant One Time Event Permits for events that will occur on consecutive days on the same
17 premises or on non-consecutive days within a ten-day period on the same premises, but shall not issue
18 permits allowing events to occur for more than 12 days on the same premises within any twelve-month
19 period.

20 (d) The One Time Event Permit shall be subject to reasonable time, place, and manner
21 conditions, including but not limited to conditions on amplified sound, in-and-out privileges, admission
22 of minors, and lighting of the premises.

23 (e) Every Person seeking a permit pursuant to this Section shall file an application with the
24 Director no less than seven days before the proposed event and shall pay the filing fee provided in
25 Section 2.26 of this Code. The applicant shall submit a proposed Security Plan and any other

1 information required for applications under Section 1060 as the Director may require. The Director
2 shall send the application no later than seven days before the date of the proposed event to those City
3 departments with jurisdiction over the matter, including, as appropriate, the San Francisco Police
4 Department, Fire Department, Department of Building Inspection and Department of Public Health.
5 These departments shall complete all necessary inspections and report their determinations to the
6 Director within three City business days of receiving the application.

7 (f) An applicant for a One Time Event Permit who files an application at least 40 days
8 before the date of the proposed event shall have the right to appeal the Director's denial of the
9 application to the Entertainment Commission. The Director shall act on applications filed at least 40
10 days before the event within a time period that allows for an appeal to the Commission. Applicants
11 who do not file at least 40 days before the proposed event shall have no right to appeal a denial of the
12 application to the Entertainment Commission unless the Commission has sufficient time to schedule
13 and provide notice of the hearing on the matter for a regularly scheduled meeting. When an applicant
14 files an application less than 40 days before the proposed event, the Director shall inform the applicant
15 that there may be insufficient time for the applicant to appeal the Director's denial to the Commission.

16 (g) The Director shall review applications for a One Night Event Permit according to the
17 standards set forth in Section 1060.5(f) and shall grant a permit unless the Director finds that the
18 application was filed less than seven days before the proposed event, denial is warranted under any of
19 the grounds set forth in Section 1060.5(f), or another application has been submitted and a permit
20 issued for the same premises during the same time period. The Director shall decide whether to grant
21 or deny a complete application promptly after the date by which other City departments are required to
22 report on the proposed application under Subsection (e). If another application has been submitted for
23 the same time and place and is still pending, the Director shall deny the application unless the
24 applicant requests that it remain open until the Director has determined whether to grant or deny any
25

1 earlier-filed application. When multiple applicants submit complete applications for the same time and
2 place, the Director shall make determinations on them in the order in which they were received.

3 (h) If the permit is denied, the Director shall state in writing the reason for the denial and
4 shall notify the applicant of the determination electronically and either by mail or personal delivery.

5 The Director shall have the discretion to submit any application to the Entertainment Commission for
6 its determination whether to grant or deny a One Time Event Permit under the provisions of this
7 Section.

8 (i) The applicant may appeal the Director's decision to the Entertainment Commission by
9 filing a written request for review within five City business days of the Director's decision. The
10 Commission shall hear and decide the appeal as expeditiously as possible, but in no event later than 21
11 days after the date that the applicant filed the appeal. If the applicant has filed the application less
12 than 40 days before the proposed event and the Commission does not have sufficient time to provide the
13 required public notice of the appeal for a regularly scheduled meeting, the Commission is not required
14 to consider the matter.

15 (j) When granting a permit, the Director or Entertainment Commission, as appropriate,
16 shall require the applicant as a condition of the permit to comply with the approved Security Plan. If
17 after approving a Security Plan, the Director receives additional information that reasonably
18 demonstrates that the Security Plan is inadequate, the Director may require the Permittee to make
19 revisions to the Security Plan for the purpose of addressing the safety of persons and property.

20 (k) One Time Event Permits are not transferable. The Permit is valid only for the Person to

22 (l) An applicant may seek immediate judicial review of an adverse decision by the Director
23 under this Section pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure Section 1085 or Section 1094.8, as
24 these provisions may be amended, including any successor provisions, or any other procedure provided

1 by law. The applicant may, but is not required to, exhaust his or her administrative remedies before the
2 Entertainment Commission and Board of Appeals.

3 ~~(a) It shall be unlawful for any person without a valid Place of Entertainment permit to~~
4 ~~conduct, promote, or sponsor or to cause or to permit to be conducted, promoted, or sponsored any one~~
5 ~~night occurrence of "entertainment" as defined by this Article without first obtaining a One Night Event~~
6 ~~permit from the Entertainment Commission.~~

7 ~~(b) Any place or premises for which a permit to operate a one night event is sought must~~
8 ~~conform to all existing health, safety, zoning and fire ordinances of the City and County of San~~
9 ~~Francisco; must have a valid public eating place permit from the Department of Public Health, and is~~
10 ~~subject to all other requirements of this Article. The Entertainment Commission may issue a permit~~
11 ~~under this Section conditional upon the applicant receiving the other required permits.~~

12 ~~(c) Every person desiring a permit pursuant to this Article shall file an application with the~~
13 ~~Entertainment Commission upon a form provided by the Entertainment Commission and shall pay a~~
14 ~~filing fee. Every application for a permit under this Article shall be verified as provided in the~~
15 ~~California Code of Civil Procedure for the verification of pleadings.~~

16 ~~(d) Any place or premises where a one night event is to be held must have a Security Plan.~~
17 ~~Proof of such shall be provided by permit applicant at the time of application for a one night event~~
18 ~~permit.~~

19 ~~(e) The Entertainment Commission shall grant a permit pursuant to this Article unless it finds~~
20 ~~that:~~

21 ~~(i) The building, structure, equipment or location of the proposed one night event does not~~
22 ~~comply with or fails to meet all of the health, zoning, fire and safety requirements or standards of all~~
23 ~~the laws of the State of California or ordinances of the City and County of San Francisco applicable to~~
24 ~~such business operation; or~~

1 ~~(ii) The building, structure, equipment or location of the proposed one night event cannot~~
2 ~~adequately accommodate the type and volume of vehicle and pedestrian traffic anticipated; or~~

3 ~~(iii) The building, structure, equipment or location of the proposed one night event lack~~
4 ~~adequate safeguards to prevent emissions of noise, glare, dust and odor that substantially interfere with~~
5 ~~the public health, safety and welfare or the peaceful enjoyment of neighboring property.~~

6 ~~(iv) The building, structure, or location of the proposed one night event does not have an~~
7 ~~adequate security plan as required by this Section.~~

8 ~~(f) An applicant whose application for a permit has been denied pursuant to this Section may~~
9 ~~appeal to the Board of Permit Appeals. The applicant is required to exhaust his or her administrative~~
10 ~~remedies before the Board of Appeals.~~

11 Section 12. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by adding Section
12 1060.29.1, to read as follows:

13 **SEC. 1060.29.1. SPECIAL PERMIT PROCEDURE FOR ONE TIME EVENTS FOR**
14 **DESIGNATED DAYS.**

15 (a) The City has experienced difficulties meeting its basic duty to provide police, fire and
16 emergency medical services (all "essential services") throughout the City on those occasions such as
17 New Year's Eve, Halloween and the 4th of July where multiple simultaneous or overlapping events
18 attract large crowds. The Board of Supervisors finds that the adoption of a special permit procedure
19 for the review and processing of applications for One Time Events permits for these occasions will help
20 ensure sufficient essential services to protect the safety of all residents of and visitors to the City, while
21 accommodating special events to the extent consistent with the City's basic public safety obligations.
22 By authorizing the adoption of a special permit procedure, the Board intends to encourage applicants
23 to apply for One Time Events Permits sufficiently in advance of the event to enable the City to plan for
24 the provision of essential services. Applicants who apply later may have to bear the additional cost of
25 increased security that the City could have avoided with more advance notice. In addition, the Board is

1 authorizing the Commission to place reasonable limits on the number of One Time Event Permits
2 issued on these designated days to the extent that the Commission determines necessary to ensure
3 public safety.

4 (b) The Entertainment Commission may adopt a special permit procedure for One Time
5 Events occurring on those designated days for which the Commission finds a substantial risk that the
6 approval of multiple, simultaneous or overlapping One Time Events would (i) require the diversion of
7 so great a number of police officers to police the events as to prevent adequate police protection to the
8 rest of the City or (ii) result in a concentration of persons and vehicles that would unduly interfere with
9 the proper delivery of essential services in the City. In making this determination, the Commission
10 shall consider the need for the delivery of essential services both on the day of the event and until 6:00
11 a.m. the next day.

12 (c) If the Entertainment Commission elects to adopt a special permit procedure under this
13 Section, it shall first consult with the San Francisco Police Department.

14 (d) This Section empowers the Entertainment Commission to designate no more than 12
15 days in a calendar year when the special permit procedure shall apply to applications for One Time
16 Event Permits.

17 (e) The Commission must adopt the procedure for each calendar year no later than
18 November 1 of the preceding year. The Commission may adopt a procedure for multiple calendar
19 years, in which case it may amend the procedure so long as it acts no later than November 1 preceding
20 January 1 of the year to which the amended procedure applies.

21 (f) The provisions of this Section supplement those set forth in Section 1060.29. Under the
22 special permit procedure authorized under this Section, the following additional provisions apply:

23 (1) For applications filed 40 days or more before the proposed event, the Commission may
24 not disapprove the application on the ground that the City does not have adequate time to plan for the
25

1 provision of essential services, although the Commission may disapprove an application under
2 Subsection (f)(3) of this Section.

3 (2) For applications filed less than 40 days before the proposed event, the Commission may

4 (A) Impose conditions on the permit that would not have been necessary had the applicant
5 given the City more time to prepare for the delivery of essential services for the event and for the City
6 as a whole on the day of the event. The conditions may require the applicant to bear additional costs
7 for increased security, including requiring the applicant to hire and deploy Security Guards or
8 implement other security measures for increased crowd control purposes and for monitoring to detect
9 and stop illegal or dangerous behavior in connection with the event; or

10 (B) Disapprove the application on the ground that the applicant filed too late to give the
11 City adequate time to plan for the provision of essential services for the day of the event without
12 compromising the safety and security of the rest of the City where alternative conditions cannot
13 sufficiently mitigate the public safety and security problems that the event poses.

14 (3) The Commission may disapprove an application for a One Time Event Permit for events
15 proposed for one of the days designated under this Section, irrespective of the date of the filing, where
16 (i) the conduct of the event, when considered in light of all other events occurring on the day of the
17 event, will require the diversion of so great a number of police officers to properly police the event as
18 to impair the capacity of the City to provide adequate police protection to the rest of the City and (ii)
19 the Commission is unable to fashion conditions with which the applicant must comply that will address
20 the public safety and security problems that the event poses. For purposes of this Subsection (f)(3), the
21 "day of the event" includes until 6:00 a.m. after the designated day.

22 (g) The special permit procedure may limit the number of permits issued for the designated
23 days when the Commission finds a substantial risk that approval of all applications for One Time
24 Events for that day would (i) require the diversion of so great a number of police officers to properly
25 police all the events as to prevent adequate police protection to the rest of the City and (ii) the

1 Commission is unable to fashion conditions with which the applicant must comply that will address the
2 public safety and security problems that the event poses. If the Commission limits the number of
3 permits, the Commission may authorize approval of applications on a first-come first-served basis,
4 selection by lottery, or other method that is objective and fair and unrelated to the content of the
5 Entertainment provided. In addition, the Commission may include a schedule of limits that vary
6 depending on the size and location as they affect congestion that could impede prompt delivery of
7 essential services.

8 (h) The authority to impose conditions on days designated by the Commission under this
9 Section includes the authority to require Permittees to comply with the conditions both on the
10 designated day and until 6:00 a.m. the next day.

11 (i) The Commission shall provide at least 10 days notice of the hearing to adopt or amend
12 the special permit procedure. The Commission may provide notice electronically to Businesses then
13 operating under a permit issued by the Commission and may, in addition, provide such additional
14 notice as it deems best calculated to reach the entertainment community.

15 (j) The Director shall post on the Commission's website the special permit procedure adopted
16 by the Commission. The Director may also provide notice electronically to Businesses then operating
17 under a permit issued by the Commission and such other notice that the Director determines is best
18 calculated to reach the entertainment community.

19 (k) The Entertainment Commission may delegate to the Director the authority to exercise all
20 powers that this section creates except the power to adopt and amend a special procedure for One Time
21 Event permits for designated days.

22 Section 13. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by adding Sections
23 1060.30, 1060.31, 1060.32, 1060.33, and 1060.34, to read as follows:

24 **SEC. 1060.30. PLACE OF ENTERTAINMENT PERMITTEES REQUIRED TO REPORT**
25 **CERTAIN INFORMATION.**

1 (a) Every Place of Entertainment Permittee shall provide written notice to the
2 Entertainment Commission within 30 days after any of the following occurs:

3 (1) Criminal charges, complaints or indictments for those persons described in Section
4 1060.3 (b), (c), (e) and (f) occurring after the filing of the permit application to the extent that they fall
5 within the categories specified in Subsections (j), (k) and (l) of Section 1060.3.

6 (2) Criminal charges, complaints or indictments for any individual that the Permittee
7 designates as Manager occurring after the filing of the permit application to the extent that they fall
8 within the categories specified in Subsections (j), (k) and (l) of Section 1060.3.

9 (b) Every Person holding a Place of Entertainment Permit, other than a publicly traded
10 corporation, shall maintain a record of the name and address of every Person who directly or
11 indirectly owns or controls 10% or more of the assets, ownership interests or voting interests in the
12 Person holding the Permit, which shall be known as a "record of principal owners," and shall make the
13 information available to the Entertainment Commission upon request. Every Person subject to this
14 Subsection (b) shall report any change to the record of principal owners within 30 days of the
15 transaction that effects the change. A "publicly traded" corporation is a company that has issued
16 securities through an initial public offering which are traded on at least one stock exchange or over-
17 the-counter market.

18 **SEC. 1060.31. APPROVAL REQUIRED FOR SECURITY PLANS.**

19 (a) Every Place of Entertainment shall have a Security Plan, as defined in Section 1060(n),
20 that has been approved by the Entertainment Commission or the Director, as required by this Article.
21 Compliance with the Security Plan approved under this Article is a condition of the permit.

22 (b) As of the effective date of this Section, the Entertainment Commission shall not approve
23 any permit or other application relating to a Place of Entertainment unless the applicant has a Security
24 Plan that has been approved by the Commission or the Director as provided in this Article or has
25 submitted a proposed Security Plan with the application. The Security Plan shall meet the minimum

1 requirements of Section 1060(n) and any implementing rules and regulations. The Commission shall
2 disapprove any Security Plan that it determines does not adequately address the safety of persons and
3 property and provide for the orderly dispersal of persons and traffic, notwithstanding the compliance of
4 the proposed Security Plan with the minimum requirements of Section 1060(n).

5 (c) Every Place of Entertainment Permittee that does not have a Security Plan approved by
6 the Entertainment Commission on the effective date of this Section shall submit a proposed Security
7 Plan to the Director.

8 (1) The Director shall mail notice of the requirements of this Section to each Permittee that
9 does not have a Security Plan approved by the Entertainment Commission on the effective date of this
10 Section.

11 (2) Each Permittee shall submit a proposed plan no later than 30 days from the date of the
12 Director's notice. Upon receiving a proposed plan, the Director shall send a copy to the San Francisco
13 Police Department, which shall have 10 City business days to review and make recommendations to the
14 Director.

15 (3) The Director shall review each proposed plan and, after reviewing any
16 recommendations submitted by the San Francisco Police Department, shall approve or disapprove it.
17 When disapproving a proposed plan, the Director shall notify the Permittee what changes are required
18 to obtain approval.

19 (4) If the Director disapproves the plan submitted by the Permittee, the Permittee may
20 appeal the Director's determination to the Entertainment Commission by submitting a written appeal to
21 the Secretary of the Commission within ten days of the Director's disapproval. Upon receiving an
22 appeal, the Commission shall promptly notify the San Francisco Police Department. When acting on
23 an appeal, the Commission may approve, overturn or modify the Director's determination. If the
24 Commission overturns the Director's order, the Permittee shall comply with the Security Plan as
25 submitted to the Director under Subsection (c). If the Commission modifies the order, it shall set forth

1 any changes to the plan that the Permittee shall be required to make and the Permittee shall comply
2 with the Security Plan required by the Commission.

3 (5) If the Commission approves the Director's order of if the Permittee does not appeal the
4 Director's disapproval of the proposed plan, the Permittee shall comply with the Security Plan that
5 includes the revisions required by the Director under Subsection (c)(3) of this Section.

6 (d) The Entertainment Commission may suspend a Place of Entertainment permit as set
7 forth in Section 1060.20.1(a)(5) if the Permittee has failed to submit a proposed Security Plan.

8 (e) The Commission may suspend a Place of Entertainment permit as set forth in Sections
9 1060.20.1(a)(5) and 1060.20.1(a)(6) for failure to comply with the plan as required under this Article.

10 (f) The suspension of a permit for violation of this Section may be appealed to the Board of
11 Appeals as provided in Section 1060.24.2.

1 **SEC.1060.32. DIRECTOR MAY REQUIRE A PERMITTEE TO COMPLY WITH A**
2 **REVISED SECURITY PLAN.**

3 (a) Notwithstanding a Security Plan's compliance with the minimum requirements of
4 Section 1060(n) and prior approvals under this Article, after consulting with the San Francisco Police
5 Department, the Director may issue an order directing a Permittee to comply with a revised Security
6 Plan by directing such revisions as the Director reasonably determines will address the safety and
7 traffic concerns that arise in either of the following circumstances:

8 (1) Conduct Constituting a Nuisance, as defined in Section 1060, has occurred on the
9 premises of, or on Any Sidewalk Abutting the Premises of, the Business; or

10 (2) The Security Plan for the Place of Entertainment is inadequate to address safety or
11 traffic concerns.

12 (b) The Director shall send the order to the Permittee setting forth the date of issuance of
13 the order and its effective date. The Director shall send this order to Permittee and the Manager
14 electronically and by mail or personal delivery.

15 (c) To provide the Permittee an opportunity to file an appeal, the Director's order shall not
16 take effect for ten City business days from the date that the order issues. Any Permittee directed to
17 comply with a revised Security Plan under this Section may appeal the Director's decision within ten
18 City business days of the date that the order issues by filing a written request for review with the
19 Secretary of the Entertainment Commission. The Permittee shall not be required to comply with the
20 Director's order pending the Commission's action on the matter. If the Permittee withdraws the
21 appeal, the order of the Director shall take effect immediately upon the withdrawal of the appeal or
22 upon the effective date of the Director's order, whichever is later.

23 (d) When acting on the appeal, the Entertainment Commission may affirm, overturn or
24 modify the Director's order.

1 (1) If the Commission modifies the Director's order, it shall set forth any revisions to the
2 plan that the Commission deems appropriate to address traffic and safety problems related to
3 operation of the Business.

4 (2) If the Commission approves the Director's order, the Permittee shall comply with the
5 revised Security Plan as directed by the Director under Subsection (a) of this Section.

6 (e) The Commission may suspend a permit as provided in Section 1060.20.1(a)(6) if the
7 Permittee fails to comply with the revised Security Plan as required under this Section.

8 (f) The suspension of a permit for non-compliance with this Section may be appealed to the
9 Board of Appeals, as provided in Section 1060.24.2.

10 (g) Permittees are required to have Security Plans that meet the minimum requirements of
11 Section 1060(n). Nothing in this Section or any other provision of this Article authorizes either the
12 Director or the Entertainment Commission to require or permit any Permittee to operate under a
13 Security Plan that does not meet the minimum requirements.

14 **SEC.1060.33. ADOPTION OF REGULATIONS.**

15 The Entertainment Commission may adopt regulations implementing the provisions of this
16 Article and Article 15.2 (Extended-Hours Premises Permits), including regulations governing the
17 procedure for hearings before the Commission. The Entertainment Commission, in consultation with
18 the San Francisco Police Department, shall develop rules and regulations governing Security Plans
19 under this Article and Article 15.2, which shall address the number of Security Guards required to
20 protect the public safety in light of the number and placement of exits on the premises of a Business.

21 **SEC. 1060.34. AUTHORITY OF SAN FRANCISCO POLICE DEPARTMENT.**

22 Nothing in this Article is intended to restrict or alter in any way the authority vested in the San
23 Francisco Police Department under Federal, State or local law to take action in response to conduct
24 that arises in connection with the operation of a Business.

1 Section 14. The San Francisco Business and Tax Regulations Code is hereby
2 amended by amending Sections 8 and 26, to read as follows:

3 **SEC. 8. METHOD OF APPEAL TO THE BOARD OF APPEALS.**

4 Except for variance decisions and place of entertainment, extended hours premises,
5 and loudspeaker permits issued by the Entertainment Commission, appeals to the Board of
6 Appeals shall be taken within 15 days from the making or entry of the order or decision from
7 which the appeal is taken. Appeals of variance decisions shall be taken within 10 days.

8 Appeals of actions taken on the granting, denial, amendment, suspension, or revocation of a Place of
9 Entertainment, One Time Event, or Extended-Hours Premises Permit, or on denial of exceptions from
10 regulations for Extended-Hours Premises Permit, shall be taken within 10 days from the making of the
11 decision. Nothing in this Section is intended to require an appeal to the Board of Appeals if any
12 provision of Article 15.1 (Entertainment Regulations Permit and License Provisions) or Article 15.2
13 (Entertainment Regulations for Extended-Hours Premises) of the Police Code governing these permits
14 otherwise provides. Appeals shall be taken by filing a notice of appeal with the Board of

15 Appeals and paying to said Board at such time a filing fee as follows:

16 (a) Zoning Administrator, Planning Department, Director of Planning and Planning
17 Commission.

18 (1) For each appeal from the Zoning Administrator's variance decision the fee shall
19 be \$400.

20 (2) For each appeal from any order, requirement, decision or other determination
21 (other than a variance) made by the Zoning Administrator, the Planning Department or
22 Commission or the Director of Planning, including an appeal from disapproval of a permit
23 which results from such an action, the fee shall be \$400.

24 (b) Department of Building Inspection.
25

1 (1) For each appeal from a Department of Building Inspection denial, conditional
2 approval or granting of a residential hotel or apartment conversion permit the fee shall be
3 \$350.

4 (2) For each appeal from the granting or denial of a building demolition, or other
5 permit (other than residential hotel conversion) the fee shall be \$100.

6 (3) For each appeal from the imposition of a penalty only the fee shall be \$200.

7 (c) Police Department Entertainment Commission.

8 (1) For each appeal from the denial or granting of a permit or license issued by the
9 Police Department or Entertainment Commission to the owner or operator of a business the
10 fee shall be \$250; for each such permit or license issued to an individual employed by or
11 working under contract to a business, the fee shall be \$100.

12 (2) For each appeal from the revocation or suspension of a permit or license by the
13 Police Department or Entertainment Commission the fee shall be \$250 for an entity or
14 individual.

15 (d) Department of Public Works. For each appeal from the decision of the Director
16 of the Department of Public Works concerning street tree removal by a City agency,
17 commission, or department the fee shall be \$75.

18 (e) For each appeal from any other order or decision the fee shall be \$200.

19 (f) For requests for rehearing under Section 16 of this Article the fee shall be \$100.

20 (g) For requests for jurisdiction the fee shall be \$100.

21 (h) An exemption from paying the full fee specified in Subsections (a), (b), (c), (d),
22 (e), (f), and (g) herein may be granted upon the filing under penalty of perjury of a declaration
23 of indigency on the form provided and approved by the Board. All agencies of the City and
24 County of San Francisco are exempted from these fees.

25

1 Notice of appeal shall be in such form as may be provided by the rules of the Board of
2 Appeals.

3 On the filing of any appeal, the Board of Appeals shall notify in writing the department,
4 board, commission, officer or other person from whose action the appeal is taken of such
5 appeal. On the filing of any appeal concerning a structural addition to an existing building, the
6 Board of Appeals shall additionally notify in writing the property owners of buildings
7 immediately adjacent to the subject building.

8 The Board of Appeals shall fix the time and place of hearing, which shall be not less
9 than 10 nor more than 45 days after the filing of said appeal, and shall act thereon not later
10 than 60 days after such filing or a reasonable time thereafter. In the case of a fixed pedestal
11 newsrack permit, a place of entertainment permit or an extended-hours premises permit, the
12 Board of Appeals shall set the hearing not less than 15 days after the filing of said appeal,
13 shall act thereon not more than 30 days after such filing, and shall not entertain a motion for
14 rehearing. With respect to any decision of the Board of Appeals related to any "dwelling" in
15 which "protected class members" are likely to reside (each as defined in Administrative Code
16 Chapter 87), the Board of Appeals shall comply with the requirements of Administrative Code
17 Chapter 87 which requires, among other things, that the Board of Appeals not base any
18 decision regarding the development of such units on information which may be discriminatory
19 to any member of a "protected class." Pending decision by the Board of Appeals, the action
20 of such department, board, commission, officer or other person from which an appeal is taken
21 shall be suspended, except for ~~excluding~~ (1) actions of revocation or suspension of permit by the
22 Director of Public Health when determined by the Director to be an extreme public health
23 hazard and (2) actions by the Zoning Administrator or Director of the Department of Building
24 Inspection stopping work under or suspending an issued permit, and (3) actions of suspension or
25 revocation by the Entertainment Commission or the Director of the Entertainment Commission of a

1 Place of Entertainment, One Time Event, or Extended-Hours Premises permit when the suspending or
2 revoking authority determines that ongoing operation of the activity during the appeal to the Board of
3 Appeals would pose a serious threat to public safety shall be suspended.

4 **SEC. 26. FACTS TO BE CONSIDERED BY DEPARTMENTS.**

5 (a) Subject to Subsection (b) below, in the granting or denying of any permit, or the
6 revoking or the refusing to revoke any permit, the granting or revoking power may take into
7 consideration the effect of the proposed business or calling upon surrounding property and
8 upon its residents, and inhabitants thereof; and in granting or denying said permit, or revoking
9 or refusing to revoke a permit, may exercise its sound discretion as to whether said permit
10 should be granted, transferred, denied or revoked.

11 (b) In the granting or denying of any permit, or the revoking or the refusing to revoke
12 any permit with respect to a "dwelling" in which "protected class members" are likely to reside
13 (each as defined in Administrative Code Chapter 87), the granting or revoking power shall
14 comply with the requirements of San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 87 which
15 requires, among other things, that the granting or revoking power not base any decision
16 regarding the development of "dwellings" in which "protected class" members are likely to
17 reside on information which may be discriminatory to any member of a "protected class" (As
18 all such terms are defined in San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 87).

19 (c) A department authorized to issue or transfer permits shall not issue or transfer a
20 permit to any person who does not have a current business tax registration certificate when
21 such person is required to obtain a business tax registration certificate pursuant to Section
22 1003 of Part III of the San Francisco Municipal Code.

23 (d) Notwithstanding Subsection (a) of this Section, the provisions of Article 15.1
24 (Entertainment Regulations Permit and License Provisions) and Article 15.2 (Entertainment
25 Regulations for Extended-Hours Premises) of the Police Code shall govern actions taken on the

1 granting, denial, amendment, suspension and revocation of permits regulated under those Articles, not
2 the standards set forth in Subsection (a).

3 Section 15. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE. In adopting this Ordinance and Ordinance
4 No. _____, the Board of Supervisors is mindful of public safety problems that sometimes
5 are presented by the operation of businesses that provide entertainment for which the
6 Commission issues a permit under the Police Code. At the most extreme, there have been
7 serious violent incidents such as shootings, stabbings, and physical altercations occurring on
8 the premises of such businesses, or in the immediate vicinity arising from or related to
9 activities conducted on the premises. In such circumstances, the safety of patrons,
10 employees, neighbors, passers-by, and police officers must be of paramount concern to the
11 City. In addition, there are less extreme but nonetheless serious problems that sometimes
12 are presented by the operation of these businesses, relating to noise and other criminal
13 conduct that is in itself harmful to the public and that can ultimately lead to serious public
14 safety concerns. This Ordinance and Ordinance No. _____ provide reasonable and
15 narrowly drawn options for the City to protect public safety without unduly interfering with the
16 operation of businesses holding a permit Issued by the Entertainment Commission.

17 The general purpose of this Ordinance and Ordinance No. _____ is to
18 strengthen the ability of the Entertainment Commission, working in concert with other City
19 bodies, including the Police Department, to address public safety issues arising in the
20 entertainment industry, by revising the standards and processes for the granting and
21 suspension of permits. The purpose is not to relax or weaken standards for the granting of
22 place of entertainment, one-time event, or extended hours permits. Revisions in terminology
23 are intended to clarify existing outdated or unclear language and/or to update the ordinances
24 with language that better reflects existing practices.

25

1 Section 16. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph,
2 sentence, clause or phrase of this Article or any part thereof, is for any reason held to be
3 unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision
4 shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining portions of this Code or any part
5 thereof. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed each section,
6 subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the
7 fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivision paragraphs, sentences, clauses
8 or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective.

9 Section 17. In undertaking the enforcement of this ordinance, the City is assuming an
10 undertaking only to promote the general welfare. It is not assuming, nor is it imposing on its
11 officers and employees, an obligation for breach of which it is liable in money damages to any
12 person who claims that such breach proximately caused injury.
