AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, POPULATION HEALTH AND PREVENTION DIVISION, TO ENTER RETROACTIVELY INTO A SUBCONTRACT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$73,487 WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, THE PRIMARY CONTRACTOR, TO CONDUCT A RESEARCH STUDY OF INADEQUATE FOLLOW-UP OF MAMMOGRAPHY ABNORMALITIES, WHICH INCLUDES AN INDEMNIFICATION CLAUSE AND PATENTS AND RIGHTS IN DATA CLAUSES AND WHICH DOES NOT INCLUDE PATENT INFRINGEMENT INDEMNIFICATION AND FALSE CLAIMS CLAUSES; RETROACTIVE TO JULY 1, 1998.

WHEREAS, The California Legislature has requested The Regents of the University of California establish and administer a program of support for research on Breast Cancer; and

WHEREAS, The State of California has appropriated funds to the Regents of the University of California for the administration of the Breast Cancer Research Program (BCRP); and

WHEREAS, The University of California has recommended for funding the proposal submitted by Daramola C. Evins, P.A., Dr.P.H.for the conduct of BCRP research; and

WHEREAS, The performance of the work shall be under the direction of Daramola Cabral Evins in collaboration with Arthur Coleman of the BVHP Health Care Task Force, and Marion Lee of the University of California, San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, The University of California has agreed to reimburse the San Francisco City and County Department of Public Health in the amount of \$73,487 under the terms of this subcontract; and

WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the funds, the University of California requires the City to enter into an agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 990202; and

WHEREAS, The University of California has indicated that it will not agree to any modification to the form of the Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, The Agreement contains certain provisions described below, which require the approval of the Board of Supervisors; and,

WHEREAS, The Agreement does not contain certain provisions described below, which are required under the Administrative Code unless waived by the Board of Supervisors; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco City and County Department of Public Health is hereby authorized to enter into a subcontract in the amount of \$73,487 with the University of California, the Primary Contractor; retroactive to July 1, 1998; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the provision in the Agreement pursuant to which the City indemnifies The Regents of the University of California; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the Agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement contained in Sections 6.21 and 21.19 of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include an indemnification of the City by The Regents of the University of California for the infringement of patent rights; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement contained in Section 6.57(c) of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include a paragraph reciting the false claim provisions contained in Section 6.57(a) of the Administrative Code; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of Public Health to enter into similar agreements with the University of California if the contract recurs or is renewed.
