

1 [Grant to support the Hospital Preparedness Program through the San Francisco Department
2 of Public Health.]

3 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (DPH), to**
4 **retroactively accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$448,967 from the California**
5 **Department of Health Services, Emergency Preparedness Office, for year 5 of the**
6 **Hospital Preparedness Program, for the period of September 1, 2006, through August**
7 **31, 2007.**

9 WHEREAS, DPH applied for and was awarded a grant in the amount of \$448,967 from
10 the California Department of Health Services (CDHS), Emergency Preparedness Office, with
11 funding from the federal Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), for year 5 of
12 the Hospital Preparedness Program for the period of September 1, 2006, through August 31,
13 2007; and,

14 WHEREAS, These grants allow counties to upgrade local hospitals, clinics and
15 emergency medical services systems preparedness for a response to bioterrorism, other
16 outbreaks of infectious disease and other public health threats and emergencies; and,

17 WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the grant funds, CDHS requires the City to
18 enter into an agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the
19 Board of Supervisors in File No. 070453; which is hereby declared to be a part of
20 this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,

21 WHEREAS, The grant budget includes a provision for indirect costs of \$58,560; and,

22 WHEREAS, the grant does not require an ASO amendment and reimburses the
23 department for an existing Health Program Planner position (Job Class 2818) at 1.00 FTE
24 from September 1, 2006 through August 31, 2007; and,

7 Preparedness Office; and, be it


8 FURTHER RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and

13 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate the position funded
14 under this agreement as a "G" or grant-funded position which would terminate when the
15 agreement expires.






