

What did we hear from the community?



OCOC Outreach Community Input Findings

A resounding call to do more, and to do *better*:

- Parents and youth need to be able to navigate the system more easily.
- Providers also struggle to navigate the system, and are unable to align services for maximum impact.
- Equity remains a central issue.
- Better in-school and out-of-school experiences are needed
- The **business community** needs to be strategically engaged as a core stakeholder
- Critical programmatic gaps remain

Aligned Recommendations

OCOC Outreach Recommendations (facilitated by LFA)

- 1. We need to become more intentional and smarter about how we collaborate in order to capture more value from existing and future resources.
- 2. We should adopt a more-holistic approach to learning in order to support educational attainment, and college- and careerreadiness.
- 3. Key support services should be maintained and strengthened.
- 4. We need a long-term plan to increase, diversify, and sustain resources for children, youth, and families.





Proposed Policy Solutions

- Renew the Children's Fund and PEEF as independent, separate funds with complementary vision under one ballot
- Create Citywide Outcomes for enhanced impact
- Establish a Children and Family Council for better alignment and coordination
- Establish an Our Children, Our City Collaborative for capacity building and managing the new aligned systems
- Operate on a four-year planning cycle aligned to citywide outcomes
- Ensure data and information sharing
