WHEREAS, The average American family receives \$1,890 in Earned Income Tax Credit funds; and,

WHEREAS, Congressional Republicans have proposed funding their spending bills by delaying billions of dollars of Earned Income Tax Credit dollars due to millions of working-class families; and,

WHEREAS, Using the Earned Income Tax Credit to offset billions in spending would adversely affect low wage earners and would serve as a disincentive for those moving from welfare to work; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges Congress to protect the integrity and intent of the Earned Income Tax Credit Program; and, be it
