7 in life expectancy and reductions in the occurrences of injury, disability and disease; and,

8 WHEREAS, Of those additional years of gained life expectancy, approximately 25
9 years are attributed to the public health approach; and,

10 WHEREAS, Public health succeeds by identifying and addressing patterns of disease,
11 illness and injury in our populations; and,

12 WHEREAS, Through successful prevention strategies, public health has contributed to
13 the decline in heart disease and stroke, tobacco-related diseases, infectious diseases and
14 motor vehicle and workplace injuries; and,

15 WHEREAS, National Public Health Week highlights public health concerns and
16 successes, such as immunizing against infectious disease, maintaining good nutritional
17 standards and providing good prenatal care; and,

18 WHEREAS, The National Public Health Week theme for 2005 – Empowering
19 Americans to Live Stronger, Longer – seeks to help older Americans overcome barriers to
20 achieving good health through prevention, protection and planning to live longer, healthier
21 lives; now, therefore, be it


