


SO/GI Complete (Any with Visit in Month of December, Unduplicated) n=16097


DPH invested in system wide, mandatory trainings to prepare staff for SO/GI data collection

- Train the trainer method prepared DPH staff to deliver trainings throughout the network
- Training emphasized LGBTQ access and inclusion in addition to SO/GI data collection workflows
- Online and in-person options were made available

SO/GI Year 2 Next Steps



- Prioritize patient experience and actively respond to patient grievances
