MILLION AND MAKE FUNDING NON-PROFIT RETENTION A MAJOR BUDGETARY PRIORITY. WHEREAS, Escalating rents and operating costs are creating a economic hardship for

the City's non-profit organizations, with rents going up as much as 300 percent or more; and

WHEREAS, The City funds in excess of 350 non-profits to provide critical services in a broad range of areas including arts, education, job training, health care, and basic human services; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco's non-profits serve a broad spectrum of the San Francisco community making it essential for them to be accessible to the communities they serve; and,

WHEREAS, According to a rent survey done by the Mayor's Office of Community Development, almost 50 percent of the non-profits surveyed have leases that will expire this year; and,

WHEREAS, Rental rates have far outpaced non-profits' funding, making it simply impossible for them to compete in San Francisco's current rental market; and.

WHEREAS. We are reaching a point where if the City doesn't act, all of our non-profits arts and cultural organizations will be forced to move across the Bay; and,

WHEREAS. It's in the City's best interest to retain these non-profits that provide valuable services and cultural opportunities and are part of rich history and flavor of what makes San Francisco great; and,

WHEREAS, Over the years, the City has invested millions of dollars in its non-profits to create strong community institutions and provide essential social services that are not performed in-house; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor to fund the Mayor's Office of Community Development's request for a flexible source of funds to help non-profits deal with escalating rents and operating costs for at least \$1 million; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor to make funding non-profit retention a major budgetary priority.
