

1 [Mayoral Appointment, Children and Families First Commission - Michael Lambert]

3 **Motion approving/rejecting the Mayor’s nomination for appointment of Michael Lambert**  
4 **(residency requirement waived), term ending October 8, 2026, to the Children and**  
5 **Families First Commission.**

7 WHEREAS, Pursuant to Administrative Code, Section 86.1 et seq., Mayor Breed has  
8 submitted a communication notifying the Board of Supervisors of the appointment of Michael  
9 Lambert to the Children and Families First Commission on October 26, 2022; now, therefore,  
10 be it

11 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does  
12 hereby approve/reject the Mayors nomination for appointment of Michael Lambert (residency  
13 requirement waived), Seat 5, inaugural appointment, to the Children and Families First  
14 Commission as a representative director or supervisor of a Mayoral office or other City  
15 program for prevention or early intervention for families at risk, for the unexpired portion of a  
16 four-year term ending October 8, 2026; and, be it

17 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:  
18 1. The membership of the Children and Families First Commission has a goal to be  
19 representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.  
20 2. Applicant Michael Lambert, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is a person with  
21 experience that uniquely qualifies them to serve on the Children and Families First  
22 Commission.  
23 3. The Children and Families First Commission has attempted to fill the position, for which  
24 Michael Lambert was nominated, with an individual who is City a resident and who has  
25 the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this

1 time. The Rules Committee has certified that Michael Lambert is qualified to serve on  
2 the Children and Families First Commission.

- 3 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no  
4 other possible representatives who is a resident of San Francisco, who has the specific  
5 experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant, and who is willing to  
6 serve on the Children and Families First Commission at this time; and, be it

7 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement  
8 for Michael Lambert, as is allowed in cases where no qualified City resident who is willing to  
9 serve can be found, pursuant to Charter, Section 4.101(a)(2), that otherwise requires  
10 person(s) appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative  
11 act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
