JOSEPH E. MARSHALL, JR.

Dr. Joseph E. Marshall, Jr. is an author, lecturer, radio talk show host, and community activist. He is the founder of the Alive & Free Movement and the founder and president of the Street Soldiers National Consortium, an organization dedicated to fighting violence nationwide. He is also the co-founder and Executive Director of the Omega Boys Club/Street Soldiers, a youth development and violence prevention organization headquartered in San Francisco, California that emphasizes academic achievement and non-involvement with drugs. Founded 1987, the organization has transformed the lives of more than 10,000 young people and produced 151 college graduates, all supported by the Omega Scholarship Fund. Another 43 Omegas are currently enrolled in college, and 30 have gone on to earn graduate degrees. As Executive Director of the Omega Boys Club, he oversees the Omega Leadership Academy for academic and life skills education, the Omega Training Institute for replicating the Alive & Free Prescription; and Street Soldiers Communications, which includes the nationally syndicated radio talk show Street Soldiers.

Dr. Marshall is a recognized social entrepreneur for his pioneering work redefining youth violence as a disease and developing the successful Alive & Free Prescription violence prevention methodology. He is an Ashoka Fellow, part of a network of leaders in more than 60 countries who are implementing system changing solutions for the world's most urgent social problems. Dr. Marshall served as a planner and peer reviewer of the 2001 US Surgeon General's Report on Youth Violence, and his method informed the Center for Disease Control and Prevention's Best Practices of Youth Violence Prevention in 2002. Dr. Marshall's innovation earned him the MacArthur Genius Award, Children's Defense Fund Leadership Award, Essence Award, and the Use Your Life Award from Oprah Winfrey. Other awards include the 2007 African American Excellence in Business award, 2006 San Francisco Foundation Community Leadership Award, and the 2006 Jefferson Award from the American Institute for Public Service. He is the author of the 1996 best-selling book, "Street Soldier: One Man's Struggle to Save a Generation, One Life at a Time" and the subject of the "Street Soldiers" documentary and play. Dr. Marshall holds honorary doctorates from Morehouse College and the University of San Francisco, a Ph.D. from Berkeley's Wright Institute, and an M.A. in Education from San Francisco State University. He is the current president of the San Francisco Police Commission.

Proposition H, November 4, 2003. (Charter Section 4.109 and 4.127) Certified by Secretary of State on 12/5/03.

Board Qualifications:

The Police Commission shall consist of seven members. The Rules Committee of the Board of Supervisors, or any successor committee, shall nominate three members to the commission. The Mayor shall nominate four other members to the commission, at least one of whom shall be a retired judge or an attorney with trial experience.

Each nomination shall be subject to confirmation by the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor's nominations shall be the subject of a public hearing and vote within 60 days. If the Board of Supervisors rejects the Mayor's nomination to fill the seat designated for a retired judge or attorney with trial experience the Mayor shall nominate a different person with such qualifications. If the Board of Supervisors fails to act on a mayoral nomination within 60 days of the date the nomination is transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the nominee shall be deemed confirmed.

To stagger the terms of the seven members, of the first four members nominated by the Mayor, two members shall serve two year terms and two members shall serve terms of four years; and of the three members nominated by the Rules Committee, one member shall serve a term of one year, one member shall serve a term of two years, and one member shall serve a term of three years. The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall designate such initial terms by lot. All subsequent appointments to the commission shall be for four-year terms.

San Francisco BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

The tenure of each member shall terminate upon the expiration of the member's term. The Mayor shall transmit a nomination or renomination to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors no later than 60 days prior to the expiration of the term of a member nominated by the Mayor. For vacancies occurring for reasons other than the expiration of a member's term, within 60 days following the creation of such vacancy, the Mayor shall nominate a member to fill such vacancy if the vacancy is for a seat filled by nomination of the Mayor.

The District Attorney, Sheriff and Public Defender may recommend persons to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors for nomination or appointment to the Police Commission.

The Mayor, with the consent of the Board, may remove a member the Mayor has nominated. The Board of Supervisors may remove a member the Rules Committee has nominated.

The Police Commission oversees the Police Department and the Office of Citizen Complaints (OCC). The OCC investigates complaints of police misconduct and neglect of duty. The Director of the OCC may verify and file disciplinary charges with the Police Commission against members of the Police Department arising out of citizen complaints that are sustained by the OCC after meeting and conferring with the Chief of Police.
