Resolution authorizing the Department of the Environment to enter into a Grant Agreement with the California Department of Pesticide Regulation ("DPR") that includes DPR's standard dispute resolution process under which a court would give deference to the DPR director's determination in a dispute between DPR and the City, with a term starting upon approval of this Grant Agreement through December 31, 2025, or when the final deliverable is received, whichever is earlier, in an amount not to exceed \$321,670.

WHEREAS, In 1996, the City and County of San Francisco ("City") approved Chapter 3, Environment Code, establishing San Francisco's prevention-centered Integrated Pest Management ("IPM") model; and

WHEREAS, The City's program is among the most comprehensive IPM programs in the nation, and, among other functions, requires City pest managers and their contractors to use pesticides only as a last resort, restricts all municipal pesticide use to an approved list of products, provides posting of all pesticide treatments on City-owned property, and maintains data on the City's pesticide use; and

WHEREAS, In 2013, the Department of the Environment ("Department") expanded its IPM program to promote IPM practices at public and affordable housing sites in the City; and WHEREAS, The California Department of Pesticide Regulation ("DPR") awards grant

funds for IPM projects under California Food and Agricultural Code, Section 12536; and

WHEREAS, In 2019, DPR awarded the Department a competitive Pest Management Research Grant to develop practices that reduce the use of and risk from pesticides that are of human health or environmental concern in California; and

WHEREAS, On August 4, 2023, DPR notified the Department that the Department had been awarded a competitive Pest Management Alliance Grant for a project titled, "Expansion of the Prevention-Centered IPM Model for Affordable Housing: Building the Capacity of the Affordable Housing Sector to Implement Pest Prevention and IPM Best Practices," in the amount of \$321,670 for a grant term beginning upon execution of a grant agreement ("Agreement") and ending December 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, A draft of the Agreement is included in BOS File No. 240061; and WHEREAS, This grant will help San Francisco refine its prevention-centered IPM model, expand implementation of affordable housing IPM programs, and build the capacity of affordable housing property managers and maintenance staff to conduct effective IPM programs into the future; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors previously approved the Department's acceptance and expenditure of this grant as part of the City's 2023-2024 budget process; and

WHEREAS, DPR requires that the Agreement include DPR's standard dispute resolution language, which requires that the Department and DPR first attempt to resolve any dispute under the Agreement informally, and provides that the DPR director's decision regarding the dispute shall be considered "final and conclusive unless determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to have been fraudulent, capricious, arbitrary, so grossly erroneous as necessarily to imply bad faith, or not supported by substantial evidence"; and

WHEREAS, The Department seeks approval of the Board of Supervisors to enter into the Agreement, including DPR's required dispute resolution language; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of the Department of the Environment to enter into the Agreement with DPR.
